CALL TO ORDER

UPDATES Encourage artists in the fine arts and to promote the cultural enrichment of the community.

How can we respond to the needs of our city through fine arts? What does that look like? How do we begin to define fine arts? Ask Rose, the City Attorney, what the parameters are. If the scope of the term is broad enough and we can live with the general term that would be great. We might have to change our bi-laws and if we must, then we have to begin preparing. Wait, I don't think we have bi-laws yet.

How do we view art?

Art is there to support the community.

The term "fine arts" can be very limiting and isolating. It can also be a bit elitist. How do we create a term that is inclusive of our different Daly City communities and cultures that does not subscribe to a certain kind of art.

Art is a form of expression that brings joy to our community. I would like for it to be on paper so that we are aware of what is expected of us from the city and the community.

Leilani and Stephen can you help us change the term of "fine arts" so that we don't feel limited so that we can respond to all of the goals and objectives of our commission. We are already doing it in a way that community.

Do we have a set of guidelines of who can share their art in Daly City?

We don't have guidelines and we are open to artists from all over the place. We want to create diversity.

How do we respond to the goal of "fine arts"?

If we have specific language that we would like to include, we can write it out and Stephen will put it on the agenda?

Can we bring a specialist or expert to discuss the integrity of art? Perhaps a professor in art.

Let's invite someone who has done the research and have the conversation about what art is?

Let's set new goals for next year.

Artist chats and gallery.

Is there a way to invite guests into our October meeting for an artist talk? We will have Verma Zapanta. Guests will have to register beforehand. Leilani and Arlene will work on that.

For November, Arlene will ask Kim Arteche to present on what fine arts means. She is a professor from San Francisco State University.

Would we like to livestream these? Maybe not live, but on the website.

Think about artists that we would like to feature for the next few months.

Connect to social media.

It would take three city council meetings to establish a change. It can be done in three meetings. We will build it in- first meeting is to set time and place of reading, second is to read it and discussion and third is second reading by City Council and third is to vote. Let's shoot for December to get it to City Council. It will take October, November and December for us to look at goal and set the language. So that by 2021, we have a new vision.

Latinx Heritage Month- it will be about two weeks digital events. It will end on October 2nd. Are there flyers? So we can promote it.

Can we check with the library to help promote Latinx Heritage Month? Maybe promote Día de Muertos event or something else.

Kasayahan in Daly City- Virtual Event this year. When we get flyers for this event we can share them and support the event.

Is there anything we want to do other than artist chats and galleries?

What about a Commissioners gathering? A virtual event with all the commissioners and to become familiar with the different commissions. Promote each other's work and buy meals from different local restaurants.

Serra Bowl sign. Leilani shared that developers were able to preserve the sign from Serra Bowl. We could only find a place in the Octagon Gallery. What do you all think? Two Council members really expressed making a home for it in City Hall. Commissioners are recommending that it not be placed on the third floor. It may affect the integrity of our art exhibits and the messaging that goes with it. What do we do to keep the identity and history of Daly City? What can we do with buildings that are coming up? How can the planning commission and our commission (if it is our place to preserve) the history of our city? This will be happening much more often. So where do we house these artifacts?
