Daly City Seeks Reputable Developers for Former Redevelopment Properties on Junipero Serra

Last month, Daly City made available two former redevelopment parcels of land along Junipero Serra Boulevard for development into potential office spaces and a hotel.

Announced through a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) sent out to local developers, the development of both sites is an integral component of meeting the City's goals to create quality, living-wage jobs and to support economic development on Junipero Serra Boulevard.

"Daly City's economic development strategy is to create a variety of opportunities for new businesses to locate in the community and provide a vibrant place for residents to live, work and play in the City," said City Manager Patricia Martel. "The Junipero Serra sites offer the opportunity for the City to attract high-quality investors who will help fuel our local economy."



Site 1 is comprised of 3.13 acres of land at Junipero Serra Blvd. and Westlake Ave. The City envisions attracting a developer who will build more than 200,000 sq. ft. of office space in a multi-story building with additional parking. Because of zoning allowances, ground-level retail is an option.



Site 2 is comprised of 1.26 acres of land along the 1800 block of Junipero Serra Blvd. At this site, the City envisions a multi-story hotel with more than 300 rooms, and includes an up-to-25,000 sq. ft. meeting and banquet space.

“Daly City is home to more than 105,000 people. The demographics of the community offer



potential developers an available labor force and a strong consumer base that will yield a good return on their investments,” said Martel. “We’ll be looking for developers with a vision to encourage economic growth in Daly City and offer residents new community amenities.”

Because of its proximity to BART and I-280, the City has requested that proposed developments provide vehicle and pedestrian connectivity, exemplify attractive architecture and sustainable design, and generate street-level activity.

Development proposals for the two sites are due on April 28.

Work is Underway at John Daly Street Improvements

The John Daly Boulevard streetscape improvements are almost complete!

Over the past nine months, construction crews made significant changes to John Daly Boulevard, improving access and connectivity between the Daly City BART Station and the SamTrans bus hub at the top of Mission Street.



Work along the thoroughfare included narrowing the median island to accommodate new bike lanes and transforming the underutilized median areas into pedestrian-friendly green spaces that will use recycled water to irrigate new trees and plants.

The project also featured the installation of pedestrian-scale lighting along the walking path, new street lights on the north and south medians and traffic signal modifications at Santa Barbara Avenue.

In addition to undergoing pedestrian and bicycle transit improvements, the street has been resurfaced. Curb access ramps and stamped crosswalks also have been installed.

The entire project is expected to be completed by the end of May, weather permitting.

3 REDUCE THE SIZE OF YOUR GARBAGE CART! Since more of your waste will be going into the green cart now, you have an opportunity to downsize your garbage cart and save money on your rate!

WHY IS COMPOSTING IMPORTANT?



Did you know? Daly City is responsible for maintaining the closed **Mussel Rock Landfill**, which is directly on the coast. Let's keep our organic waste and recyclables **out of landfills** to save space.



Food waste buried in landfills emits methane as it breaks down. **Methane is a potent greenhouse gas (GHG)** that is **85 times more powerful than CO2** over a 20-year period. That's a lot of warming potential for our climate!

TIPS FOR COMPOSTING:

Will the organic waste smell bad? You already throw away food scraps in your regular trash. By using your green cart, you are simply sorting the organic waste from other solid waste. There really shouldn't be more odors than before. But here are some **tips to keep a cleaner compost cart:**

Line your kitchen pail with newspaper or compostable bags (use bags that have the BPI certified logo).



Store food scraps in the freezer to reduce odor before placing them in your green cart on your collection day.



Layer your yard trimmings and food scraps.



How can I reduce the amount of food waste in my family? The Bay Area Recycling Outreach Coalition (BayROC) provides useful tools and resources for reducing food waste. Visit www.bayarearecycling.org.



Where should I place my carts out on collection day?

- ✓ Place your carts out with lid openings towards the street and wheels against the curb for quick service.
- ✓ Keep your cart lids closed at all times! Ravens, raccoons and other wildlife love to make a mess of garbage in overflowing containers. Republic Services might not collect your garbage if it's overflowing.
- ✓ Don't set your carts in the street if your garbage collection day is the same day as street sweeping, so as not to block our street sweeping trucks. Instead, put them on the sidewalk at the curb.
