Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 06-19-13 at approximately 6:06 AM, Officer Larsen and Officer Rey Asuncion were dispatched to the 300 block of First Avenue on a report of two males fighting over a vehicle. The reporting party said that one male was trying to stop the other male from getting inside the vehicle. One subject told the officer that his vehicle was missing from where he initially parked it on the unit block of County Street and that he had found the other subject rummaging through his vehicle. The subject who was rummaging also had the victim's cell phone in his hand. The subject, a 38 year old Vallejo resident, was arrested for auto burglary, possession of stolen property, possession of burglary tools and a probation violation.

On Thursday, 06-20-13 at 12:23 AM, Officer Patrick Dolan conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a vehicle code violation in the area of Callan Boulevard and King Drive. The vehicle contained three people, and one occupant was on probation with a search and seizure clause. The officer contacted the driver, a 48 year old San Francisco resident, and pat searched him. The officer found a knife that was modified to a double edged blade clipped to his pants pocket. (This is against the law.) The officer searched the car and found a jewelry box containing various items of jewelry. The driver said it was his mother's jewelry box, and that he had inherited his mother's jewelry. All three subjects were brought to the police station to be interviewed. In addition to the knife, officers found a bag of an off-white crystalline substance presumed to be methamphetamine inside of the driver's front coat pocket. The subject said he usually buys it in bulk and that he had a drug habit. Since a large amount of money was also found, the officers believed that the subject was involved in the sale and distribution of the drug. The driver was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sale, transportation of a controlled substance, and for carrying a concealed dirk/dagger. The other two passengers were not arrested.

On Thursday, 06-20-13 at 3:37 AM, Officer Rey Asuncion and Officer Wailun Shiu were dispatched to the Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot near the "Buffalo Wild Wings" restaurant on a report of a suspicious vehicle with the engine on and two subjects inside sleeping. The officers asked the male in the driver's seat to open the door. They immediately detected a

strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. The subject said he had been drinking and was sleeping in the parking lot until he felt sober enough to drive home. The driver asked the officers if he could give his sweatshirt to his female passenger because it was cold. As he removed the sweatshirt, a small plastic baggy fell onto the ground directly in front of the officers. The bag contained a white powdery substance which appeared to be a usable quantity of cocaine powder. The driver, a 26 year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance.

On Thursday, 06-20-13 at 8:30 AM, Lt. Mackriss "on-viewed" a stolen Honda at the intersection of Higate Avenue and Mayfield Avenue. The driver crashed into a parked car and then fled on foot in the area. Approximately 20 minutes later, officers found the subject hiding in a backyard shed on the 500 block of Higate Avenue. The subject, a 34 year old South San Francisco resident, was arrested and booked for auto theft, hit and run, committing a felony while out on bail, possession of burglary tools, and driving with a suspended/revoked driver's license.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

Between 5:00 PM on Wednesday, 06-19-13 and 7:00 AM on Thursday, 06-20-13, a residence on the unit block of Skyline Drive was burglarized. The residence is being remodeled, and the burglars gained entry by kicking in the doggie door to the rear of the residence. The loss was construction tools.

Between 11:20 PM on Saturday, 06-22-13 and 9:30 AM on Sunday, 06-23-13, a detached garage to a residence on Roosevelt Street was burglarized. The victim said the door to the garage was locked with a key padlock, and the padlock was missing. The burglar took a custom white 1973 Chevrolet Nova from the garage.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.
