Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 06-26-13 at approximately 10:00 PM, Officer Ryan Hyink was on patrol on his police motorcycle and was going through the Classic Bowling Alley parking lot on King Drive when he saw a group of four to five males standing in the lot. Officer Hyink noticed a subject who looked up at him, and then turned away, alerting another subject that a police officer was present. That subject then looked at the officer, picked up a black duffel bag from the ground and quickly walked away around the corner. The officer followed that subject who then placed the duffel bag into the passenger seat of a vehicle and locked the door. As the officer was speaking with the subject, he noticed the subject's hands were trembling. Officer Garrett Larsen arrived as the cover officer, and both officers could smell the distinct odor of unburned marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officers searched the vehicle and inside the duffel bag, they discovered a large clear plastic bag containing a large amount of a green leafy-type substance (suspected marijuana). The officers asked the subject if he had a medicinal marijuana card, and he said he did not. The officers found another large bag of a green leafy-type substance. The subject, an 18 year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of marijuana for sale and for having someone else's identification in his possession.

On Thursday, 06-27-13, at approximately 6:23 PM, Officer Sean Begley was on patrol and was on the unit block of Rice Street when he saw a male digging through the recycling containers. He saw the subject remove a clear plastic water bottle from the recycling can and closed the container. Over the past several years, the City of Daly City, like many other cities, has been plagued with the theft of recyclables which is a violation of a municipal code in Daly City. This kind of theft is responsible for hundreds of police calls for service in Daly City. When officer Begley tried to talk to the subject, the subject started walking away from him. Officer Begley caught up to him, and the subject became angry and said threatening things to the officer. The subject, a 44 year old transient, was arrested for resisting/threatening a peace officer and was booked into the San Mateo County Jail.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Wednesday, 06-26-13 at 4:15 AM, a 51 year old Daly City resident reported that he was the victim of an armed robbery by two suspects in the area of Callan Boulevard and Southgate Avenue. After the victim was robbed, he said the first suspect pointed a firearm at the victim and fired one shot at him. No injuries were reported. The victim said he was walking along the eastern sidewalk towards Southgate Avenue, approaching the northwest entrance to Serramonte Shopping Center when he noticed a vehicle, described as a four door, black/dark Toyota or Honda parked along the eastern sidewalk. The victim said he was approximately 2-3 feet from the rear passenger bumper when both the driver and passenger side doors opened. He said a black male adult exited from the driver's side of the vehicle and approached him. He said the suspect quickly pushed him against the cyclone fence and punched him in the lower abdomen. The victim said as that was occurring, a Hispanic male adult exited the front passenger seat of the vehicle and exhibited a handgun and pointed it at the victim's chest. He said the first suspect then demanded his money, phone, backpack, wallet and watch. The victim said he fell to the ground, and both subjects began taking items off of him. He said the suspects said nothing, and then all of a sudden, the Hispanic male fired one shot, missing him. The suspects then fled in the vehicle westbound on Southgate Ave. The first suspect is described as a Hispanic male, 5'7" to 5'9", 140-150 lbs., black curly hair, a thin mustache and last seen wearing a black hoodie and black jeans. The second suspect is described as a black male, 5'7" to 5'9", 160 lbs., last seen wearing a black hoodie and black jeans.

On Wednesday, 06-26-13 at 4:40 AM, a 20 year old Daly City resident that he was the victim of a robbery in the area of Mission Street and Templeton Avenue. The victim said he was walking northbound on Mission Street going to work, and he noticed a vehicle driving slowly by him. As he got to Templeton Avenue, he noticed the same vehicle parked at the corner, and there was a Hispanic female standing nearby. He said he smiled at the female and then heard footsteps from behind him. He said he looked back and saw three male subjects behind him. One subject pointed a black semi-automatic handgun in front of his face and said, "Give me your shit." The other two subjects were standing close by to the first subject and also uttered the same demands. The victim said he handed the suspect his cell phone and earphones. The subjects then ran back to their vehicle and got into it. The victim said the vehicle then slowed down again by him, and the second subject told the victim to give him his backpack and the 49'er hat he was wearing. The subjects then drove away in an older green 4 door Lexus. The first suspect is described as a Hispanic male, between 19-20 years old, 5'9", 130 lbs., medium build, light skin, clean shaven and wearing a burgundy zip-up hooded jacket with dark pants. The second subject is described as a Filipino male, 19-20 years old, 5'7", 130 lbs., medium build, darker skin and last seen wearing two dark jackets, the inside jacket having a hood. The third subject is possibly a Hispanic male, 19-20 years old and was driver of the vehicle. The fourth suspect is a Hispanic female, 20 years old, light skin, 5'3", 115 lbs., skinny build, and last seen wearing a dark hoodie and a beanie. The fifth subject was a passenger in the Lexus and is described as a Filipino female, 20 years old and "chubby." The victim was not injured in this robbery.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were twelve vehicle burglaries during the past week. Ten occurred in commercial areas.

- Sizzler parking lot—three bags containing computer equipment, clothing and electronic items were taken from the backseat of a 2013 Dodge van. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 06-24-13 between 1:45 PM and 2:45 PM.
- Celia's restaurant parking lot—a computer bag containing a Dell laptop was taken from a 2012 Ford E150. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-24-13 between 3:00 PM and 3:30 PM.
- Parking lot of 333 Gellert Boulevard—a bag containing miscellaneous paperwork from the front passenger side floorboard of a 2006 Honda Element. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-24-13 between 3:00 PM and 4:45 PM.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot near JC Penney's—a laptop bag containing a Dell laptop and three passports was taken from the front passenger floorboard of a 2013 Ford Fusion. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-25-13 between 2:45 PM and 3:07 PM.
- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage) 5th floor, a tablet was stolen from the front passenger seat of a 2013 Audi RS5. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-27-13 between 7:50 PM and 10:30 PM.
- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage) 5th floor, nothing taken from a 2001 Honda Civic. The left rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-27-13 between 8:45 PM and 10:30 PM.
- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage) 5th floor, an Apple MacBook pro was taken from the rear passenger floorboard of a 2009 Toyota Scion. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-27-13 between 8:45 PM and 10:30 PM.
- Parking lot of 345 Gellert Boulevard—a suitcase and laptop case containing blank personal checks was taken from a 1999 Mercedes Benz ML320. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 06-28-13 between 12:00 PM and 1:10 PM.
- 100 block of Westline Drive—an amplifier from behind the rear driver's seat on the floorboard of a 1998 Toyota 4-Runner. The driver's side rear window was smashed. Occurred on 06-29-13 between 4:30 AM and 4:35 AM.
- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage) 5th floor, a computer bag containing an Apple MacBook Pro and an iPad, a computer bag containing a wireless keyboard and another bag containing clothing and an electric toothbrush was taken from the backseat of a 2010 Nissan Maxima. Occurred on 06-30-13 between 6:30 PM and 8:40 PM.
- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage) 5th floor, a duffel bag containing cosmetics, ear phones, cash and clothing taken from a 2012 Dodge Van. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 06-30-13 between 6:20 PM and 8:46 PM.
- 200 block of South Mayfair Avenue—a bag containing clothing and approximately 30 CD's taken from a 1995 Ford Econoline. The suspect drilled a hole into the driver's side door lock to gain entry. Occurred between 10:00 PM on 06-29-13 and 7:30 AM on 06-30-13. The suspect also tried to steal the vehicle by tampering with the ignition.
