Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 07-02-13 at 8:00 PM, Sergeant Cameron Christensen stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation at Hillside Boulevard and Brunswick Street. While speaking with the driver, Sgt. Christensen noticed a plastic twist-style baggie with a white crystal-like substance in an opened coin tray to the left of the steering wheel. The sergeant asked the driver to step out of the vehicle, and he saw an old marijuana cigarette in the driver's door handle. After searching the vehicle, he also found a pill bottle containing a substance believed to be heroin. He arrested the subject, a 26 year old San Francisco resident, for possession of cocaine, possession of heroin and for driving on a suspended license.

On Wednesday, 07-03-13 at 2:33 AM, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Flournoy Street on a report of a male subject with a gun who was chasing a female and her baby. Officers were advised that a shot was fired. The subject, a 33 year old Daly City resident, was upset that his girlfriend got a ride home from a male and took it out on him. The subject was apprehended, and the firearm was recovered and booked into evidence. No one was injured. The subject was arrested and charged with attempted murder and carrying a loaded firearm

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Saturday, 07-06-13 at approximately 2:00 AM, a 26 year old San Francisco resident reported he was the victim of robbery via force, on Mission Street, south of the intersection of Citrus Street. The victim drove himself to Kaiser Hospital, where Officer Edward Klier met him. The victim said he left a relative's party near the area of School Street in Daly City and began walking northbound on Mission Street towards Citrus Street when he was attacked by four to five subjects from behind. He said he was tackled to the ground, kicked and punched multiple times. He said the

subjects removed a \$20 bill from his pants pocket. The victim said that there were approximately four Hispanic males in their early 20's and one black male in his early 20', with dreadlocks and a beard. This case is suspended due to lack of investigative leads.

On 07-07-13, at approximately 6:30 PM, a 36 year old Daly City resident reported she was the victim of a robbery via force and fear. This occurred at the intersection of Schwerin Street and MacDonald Avenue. The victim said she had just exited the bus when she observed a subject who she thought was following her. The subject was described as a black male juvenile, 5'2", 140 lbs. wearing a black jacket, blue jeans and a black baseball hat with an unknown logo. She said she walked east down MacDonald Avenue and the suspect ran up behind her and grabbed her purse and fled north up Schwerin Street and into San Francisco. The loss was her purse, \$250 and various credit cards. The victim could identify the suspect if she saw him again.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and one attempted burglary during the past week.

Between 09:30 AM on Tuesday, 07-02-13 and 3:00 PM on Thursday, 07-04-13, a residence on the 100 block of Lighthouse Lane was burglarized. An unknown subject gained entry via using an unknown type tool to pry the rear northeast door to the residence. The suspect took miscellaneous coins, a silver dining set and three San Francisco Giants jerseys.

Between 6:00 PM on Wednesday, 07-03-13 and 4:30 PM on Thursday, 07-04-13, a residence on the unit block of Morningside Drive was the victim of an attempted burglary via a broken front window. There was no entry or loss.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were fourteen vehicle burglaries during the past week. Twelve occurred in commercial areas.

I would like to stress how important it is to NOT leave valuables in your vehicle, even if they are in the trunk. Many of the victims listed below left their valuables in plain view, but some even left them in their trunk. Our investigators are acutely aware of the ongoing burglaries that are plaguing most of the mall areas of Daly City (Westlake Shopping Center, Serramonte Shopping Center, Alto Serramonte) and are currently working several details in those areas. These thieves are savvy and very proficient. Please pass along the word to your family, friends and coworkers to NOT leave their valuables in their vehicles.

- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage—5th floor)—nothing taken from a 2001 Jeep Liberty. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-01-13 between 8:30 PM and 11:35 PM.
- Westlake Shopping Center parking garage (1st floor)—an iPhone was taken from a 2000 Toyota Highlander. The driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-01-13 from 6:30 PM to 6:35 PM.

- 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (north garage—4th floor)—a backpack containing a Russian driver's license, credit cards and a laptop was taken from a 2013 BMW 328. The right front window was smashed. Occurred on 07-02-13 between 12:00 AM and 12:45 AM.

- Koi Palace parking lot—a Coach computer bag containing an Apple MacBook Air was taken from the passenger seat of a 2005 Mercedes C230. The driver's side rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-02-13 between 6:30 PM and 8:00 PM.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot (near Target)—six to seven shopping bags containing housewares and clothing was taken from the backseat of a 2006 Toyota Camry. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 07-02-13 at approximately 8:20 PM.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot (near JC Penney's)—a backpack containing a Google Chromebook laptop and a Chinese passport was taken from a 2013 Ford Escape. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-02-13 between 8:45 PM and 9:45 PM.
- 24 Hour Fitness parking lot—a wallet containing credit cards was taken from a 2000 Mercedes SUV. The rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-05-13 between 7:02 PM and 8:02 PM.
- Outback parking lot—credit cards, gift cards and cash was taken from a 2011 Chevrolet Cruze. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 07-05-13 between 5:30 PM and 10:05 PM.
- Mar Vista Stables parking lot—a Coach purse containing cash and credit cards was taken from under the front passenger seat of a 2012 Nissan Frontier. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 07-06-13 between 12:30 PM and 2:30 PM.
- Outback parking lot—a backpack containing cash, four Canadian passports and eyeglasses was taken from a 2013 Dodge Grand Caravan. The rear windshield window was smashed. Occurred on 07-16-13 at approximately 9:33 PM.
- Koi Palace parking lot—a backpack containing a Nikon D-70 camera was taken from a 2013 Toyota Camry. The front driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-16-13 at approximately 9:33 PM.

iHelp
