### Notable Cases

On Monday, 07-22-13 at approximately 11:53 AM, San Mateo County Communications requested our officers to assist in tracking a suspect who had just robbed a bank in Burlingame. The suspect was described as a Caucasian male adult, 50-60 years of age, wearing glasses, a tan hat and a yellow shirt and driving a white 1996 Dodge Ram 250 truck. Officer Pete Nelson, Officer Terry Chew, Officer Tom Prudden and Officer Mike Haralambidis began coordinating the tracking of the electronic signal, which was north of Burlingame and south of Daly City. The area was eventually pinpointed to the Costco Parking lot on South Airport Boulevard in South San Francisco. Officer Nelson observed the vehicle in the lot, and it was occupied by a man fitting the description of the suspect. The suspect, a 61-year old Atascadero resident, was arrested without incident.

On Saturday, 07-27-13, at approximately 1:59 PM, Officer Victor Cabatic was on patrol on the 400 block of Irvington Street when he noticed a parked white GMC Sierra pickup truck that did not have a rear license plate, and the bed of the truck was filled with miscellaneous items. Officer Cabatic contacted a subject in the driver's seat who was sleeping. The suspect said the vehicle belonged to his father's friend, but he didn't know the owner's name. Our dispatcher determined the vehicle was stolen from San Francisco, and the property in the back belonged to the owner. The suspect, a 34-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for auto theft and possession of stolen property.

On Sunday, 07-28-13, at approximately 11:42 AM, Officer Janet Cordellos and Officer Robert Kett were dispatched to the unit block of Rockridge Avenue on the report of an unattended two year old boy wandering in the neighborhood. The child wandered approximately ten blocks from his home, and his godfather found him. As this was not the first time this occurred, officers arrested the mother, a 36-year old Daly City resident, for child endangerment. The victim was released to the custody of the Child Protective Services.

## Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Monday, 07-22-13 at approximately 8:15 PM, a 28-year old San Francisco resident reported that he was the victim of a robbery via gun point while at the Serramonte Center Mall bus stop area of the parking lot. The victim said the suspect brandished a firearm and was described as a Middle Eastern male, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans, white tennis shoes, with a light complexion and a full beard. The victim said he was looking at a video on his iPhone when the suspect came up to him and asked if he could use his phone. The refused, and the suspect then pulled out a black handgun from his front sweatshirt pocket. Two days later, the suspect was identified, and he was arrested for robbery. The suspect is a 26-year old San Francisco resident.

## Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries and one attempted residential burglary this past week.

On Monday, 07-22-13 between 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM, an apartment on the 500 block of King Drive was burglarized. An unknown suspect entered via the front sliding glass door. The investigation is continuing in this case.

On Sunday, 07-28-13 between 11:30 AM and 10:00 PM, an apartment on the 300 block of Mandarin Drive was burglarized. Entry was made by either the use of a spare key or the unlocked sliding glass window. The loss was a laptop and jewelry.

On Saturday, 07-27-13 at approximately 10:45 AM, a resident on the 800 block of Templeton Avenue said he heard someone "aggressively" ringing his door bell. He said he went to his front door, consisting of mainly beveled glass, and saw a person's "body moving into the door", as if he was trying to pry it open. The suspect saw the resident and then said, "Oh", and then remarked about the mail and turned around and left. The victim described the suspect as a Hispanic male about 5'8", average build, wearing a black leather jacket, clean shaven with slicked back hair. The only damage was a pry to the front door knob.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Monday, 07-22-13 at approximately 7:20 PM, the Daly City Liquor and Groceries store was the victim of a burglary. A suspect took lottery tickets by snatching and grabbing them from the store owner. The suspect then ran out of the store. The suspect is described as possibly a Filipino male, 25-30 years old, 5'8"-5'10", 185 pounds. He was wearing a black beanie, long sleeved red shirt, black pants and white shoes.

On Sunday, 07-27-13, between 6:00 PM and 7:00 PM, the Margate Tennis Court Clubhouse was burglarized and vandalized. This investigation is continuing.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries and two attempted vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 600 block of Abbot Avenue—a backpack containing a wallet and two jackets was taken from a 2008 Ford Escape. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 11:30 PM on 07-22-13 and 6:30 AM on 07-23-13.
- 100 block of Vista Grande Avenue—a leather jacket, iPad mini, sunglasses, textbooks and small electronic devices were taken from a 2004 BMW 530i. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 11:15 PM on 07-23-13 and 8:30 AM on 07-24-13. \*\*On-line report.
- 300 Hickey Boulevard—nothing taken from a 2006 BMW 325i. The driver's side window was smashed. Occurred between 6:30 PM on 07-23-13 and 7:42 AM on 07-24-13.
- Unit block of Ravilla Court—cash and miscellaneous items was taken from a 2003 Toyota Highlander. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 5:30 PM on 07-24-13 and 5:00 AM on 07-25-13.
- Parking lot of Serramonte del Rey—a purse containing identification, credit cards, house keys and car keys taken from a 2000 Dodge Intrepid. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 07-24-13 between 7:00 PM and 8:30 PM.
- Parking lot of Serramonte del Rey—a military aid bag with supplies was taken from a 2004 Mazda 3. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-24-13 between 7:30 PM and 9:00 PM. \*\*On-line report.
- 900 block of East Market Street—attempted burglary of a 2013 Toyota Corolla. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 07-24-13 between 5:50 AM and 12:05 PM.
- 100 block of Linda Vista Drive—attempted burglary of a 2000 BMW Z3. The convertible top was slashed. Occurred between 4:00 PM on 07-27-13 and 6:00 AM on 07-28-13.

## Stolen Vehicles

There were four stolen vehicles this past week. Two of them were recovered.

- Walgreen's parking lot on San Pedro Road—a 1994 Toyota Camry. Occurred on 07-28-13 between 8:30 PM and 10:56 PM.
