### Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 07-30-13 at 12:25 AM, Officer Garret Larsen, Officer Jay Multaoupele and Officer Jason Gonzales were dispatched to the area of Mission Street and John Daly Boulevard on a report of three juvenile males with a firearm walking in the area. The subjects were contacted and said they came to Daly City via BART and were just "hanging out". Officer Gonzales searched one of the subjects and found a firearm with the handle sticking out from his front waistband. The firearm was later determined to be an air soft gun and looked similar to a 9mm Beretta semi-automatic pistol. Two subjects, a 16-year old from San Francisco and a 15-year old from San Bruno, were cited for a curfew violation and were released to their parents. The subject with the air soft gun, a 16-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for an open display of an imitation firearm, curfew violation, and a probation violation and was taken to the San Mateo County Juvenile Detention center.

On Saturday, 08-03-13 at approximately 7:43 PM, Officer Patrick Dolan was on patrol in the area of San Jose Avenue and Regent Street when he saw a vehicle with the reverse lights not properly illuminated. Officer Dolan also observed that the vehicle and the vehicle's passenger appeared familiar, as the passenger matched the description of a person wanted for committing a burglary at the Daly City Liquor and Grocery a week prior, and the vehicle also matched the description of the vehicle involved in the same burglary. The suspect who committed the actual burglary, a 24-year old Daly City resident, admitted to the crime and was arrested for burglary and conspiracy. The driver, a 33-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for burglary, conspiracy, driving with a suspended license and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

### Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during this past week.

On Thursday, 08-01-13 between 5:00 PM and 10:00 PM, a residence on the 200 block of Templeton Avenue was burglarized. Entry was gained via a kick to the front door. The suspect(s) ransacked the house and stole an Apple Macbook Pro laptop.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Unit block of Mira Vista Court—a handbag was taken from a 2011 Mazda 3. The left rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 9:30 PM on 07-30-13 and 8:45 AM on 07-31-13.
- Unit block of Castlemont Avenue—a gym bag containing clothing was taken from a 2003 Honda Pilot. The left rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 11:00 PM on 08-03-13 and 9:30 AM on 08-04-13.

The City of Daly City launched "iHelp", an innovative citizen's service request and civic engagement tool allowing residents to easily interact and stay connected with their local government. *Daly City iHelp* is a free mobile device application ("app") and is available from the Apple and Google app stores for immediate download. By utilizing this service, residents can access important City information, report issues (graffiti, garbage complaints, etc.), and track requests online and via mobile devices.
