Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 09-04-13 at approximately 10:46 AM, Officer Tom Prudden, Officer Mike Haralambidis and Officer Brian Melville responded to the area of Eastmoor Avenue and Sullivan Avenue on the report of an Asian male who jumped on a U.S. mail carrier truck, preventing it from leaving. Officer Prudden arrived first on scene and saw the subject clinging to the front of the mail truck. As the officer approached the subject, he was assaulted by the suspect who used his elbow to strike the officer's right temple and also punched his chest. Officer detained and handcuffed the subject. Officer Melville arrived and assisted Officer Prudden. The subject was incoherent and making strange sounds as he was struggling and kicking. Initially the subject would not identify himself, and he was taken to Peninsula Hospital. While at the hospital, the subject, a 30-year old Daly City resident, admitted to taking ecstasy. He was charged with battery against a peace officer and for being under the influence of a controlled substance. Officer Prudden's injuries were not serious.

On Wednesday, 09-04-13, at 5:09 PM, Officer Keith Mattos was patrolling Westlake Park on an off-road DCPD motorcycle looking for homeless encampments. Officer Mattos saw a subject who appeared to be sleeping on top of a sleeping bag near a pathway along the fence line. After waking up the subject, Officer Mattos asked about the beer cans and needles nearby. The 29-year old subject's agreed to allow the officer to check his backpack, and inside were needles, a substance that looked like hashish and methamphetamine. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and for possession of hypodermic needles.
