### Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 09-11-13 at approximately 5:28 PM, Officer Lucas Taylor stopped a vehicle for a vehicle code violation at the intersection of St Francis Boulevard and San Miguel Avenue. The driver, a 24-year old San Francisco resident did not have a driver's license, and the vehicle belonged to the passenger, his girlfriend, a 24-year old Daly City resident. The driver said his girlfriend was sick, and that was why he was driving. Officer Taylor asked the driver if he could search his person, and he consented. The officer asked the passenger if he could search her vehicle, and she consented. On the floorboard, Officer Taylor found a small plastic baggie containing a white powdery residue. The officer found a cellophane cigarette pack wrapper containing a white powdery substance inside the passenger's wallet. The officer found two counterfeit \$20 bills inside the driver's wallet. The driver said he received these bills as change. The passenger was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, and the driver was cited for having no driver's license.

On Saturday, 09-14-13 at 7:09 PM, Officer Ryan Hyink was dispatched to the 100 block of Vista Grande Avenue on a report of a hit and run auto vs. pedestrian collision. A 50-year old female Daly City resident stepped off the curb and was crossing the street when a man in a silver Honda Civic struck the pedestrian. A witness said the driver got out of the car, asked the victim if she was okay, helped her to the sidewalk and then left when a witness asked for his identity. The driver and the vehicle were subsequently located on Hillside Boulevard. The victim had a complaint of pain to her ankle and was treated by paramedics at the scene. The suspect, a 26-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for hit and run, being an unlicensed driver and for having no insurance.

### Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Monday, 09-09-13 at approximately 10:53 AM, Officer Marilyn Drexler was flagged down by a male in the area of North Mayfair Avenue and Sheffield Drive on a report of a robbery that had just occurred. The reporting party said his mother had just been robbed in front of their house on the unit block of Cliffside Drive. The victim, a 67-year old Daly City resident, said she was standing in the threshold of her open garage, preparing to leave. She said she placed her purse on top of the trunk of one of the vehicles in the garage. At that time, she said she noticed a new model gray/blue Honda or Toyota back halfway into her next door neighbor's driveway. The male occupant exited and approached her, asking for directions to highway 280. As the victim was giving the suspect directions, she turned her attention toward the door leading into her home from the garage when the suspect pushed her, causing her to stumble and nearly fall to the ground. At that time, the suspect grabbed the victim's purse and ran toward the car in the driveway next door. The victim last saw the suspect driving away from the scene going eastbound on Westdale Avenue. The loss was a black Coach purse containing identification, credit cards and currency. This case is currently being investigated.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and two attempted burglaries during this past week.

On Wednesday, 09-11-13 between 7:30 AM and 6:31 PM, a residence on the 500 block of South Hill Boulevard was burglarized by an unknown suspect who forced in the front door. Both the door jamb and the dead bolt were broken. The loss was miscellaneous electronics, purses, credit cards and jewelry.

On Monday, 09-09-13 at approximately 8:32 AM, two residents on the 100 block of Belcrest Avenue reported that an unknown subject, described as a black male adult in his 20's, closely shaved head, wearing a black tee-shirt, rang his front door bell while having a crowbar in his right hand. The suspect then said, "Sorry, wrong house" and got into a vehicle. A second suspect, described as a black male in his 20's, 1-2" afro-style hair, gray tee shirt and black jeans, also said the same thing before driving off at a high rate of speed in a copper colored Honda Civic.

On Sunday, 09-15-13 at approximately 1:55 AM, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Werner Avenue on the report of a residential burglary in progress. The victim said an unknown subject was trying to open the window. The suspect removed the screen from a window and reached inside before fleeing the scene. There was no entry made.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

Between an unknown time on Thursday, 09-12-13 and 6:30 AM on Friday, 09-13-13, the Washington Elementary School on Whittier Street was the victim of a commercial burglary by an unknown suspect who stole a computer monitor from the administration office. The suspect entered the office via an unknown means, and there were no signs of forced entry.

On Friday, 09-13-13 at approximately 11:05 PM, the ATM inside the laundromat on the 100 block of Southgate Avenue was burglarized. An unknown suspect used a drill to access the cash in the ATM while another suspect prevented onlookers from coming close to the machine. Once they had the cash, the unknown suspects fled in a white Camry.

## Vehicle Burglaries
