



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

### Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 10-22-13 at approximately 2:18 AM, officers were dispatched to the area of Geneva Avenue and Santos Street on a report of an in-progress auto burglary. The dispatcher advised that a male subject who was breaking the windows was being detained by a witness. The investigation revealed that the suspect, a 29-year old San Francisco resident, had just completed three auto burglaries via smashing of the windows. The property stolen was recovered at the scene. The subject was arrested for burglary, possession of methamphetamine, possession of burglary tools, possession of stolen property, possession of drug paraphernalia and less than one ounce of marijuana. He was booked into the San Mateo County jail.

On Wednesday, 10-23-13 at 4:08 AM Officer Patrick Dolan was parked on the 400 block of A Street in a vehicle equipped with a license plate reader camera. (The camera takes pictures of license plates which are immediately compared to a list of stolen vehicles.) As he was parked, he was alerted that the camera detected a stolen vehicle—stolen from San Francisco. The driver, a 21-year old San Francisco resident, was subsequently arrested for auto theft, driving under the influence, and possession of a controlled substance.

On Wednesday, 10-23-13 at 5:38 PM, Officer Nick Ottoboni and Officer Bruce Perdomo were working a two-officer detail at the Serramonte Shopping Center and were asked to cover on a traffic stop near Macy's. (There have been a rash of auto burglaries in the area, and the behavior of the occupants of the vehicle seemed suspect.) As the officers approached the driver's side window, they immediately smelled an odor of marijuana. The driver said he did not have marijuana in the vehicle. The passenger was asked if he had anything illegal in the vehicle, and he said he had a BB gun under the seat. Officers also found a vial containing a controlled narcotic substance. The driver, an 18-year old Vallejo resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance. The BB gun was confiscated for destruction.

On Friday, 10-25-13 at approximately 8:00 PM, Officer Bruce Perdomo was on patrol on Junipero Serra Boulevard near San Pedro Road and conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle. The driver had a suspended license and was on probation. Officer Perdomo conducted a search of the vehicle and

found a flashlight that contained a stun gun inside. The driver, a 30-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for being a felon in possession of a stun gun, driving with a suspended license and for a probation violation.

## Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

Between 10:00 AM on Friday, 10-25-13 and 12:00 AM on Saturday, 10-26-13, a condominium on Half Moon Lane was burglarized. An unknown suspect pried the sliding glass door open to gain entry. The loss was purses, a laptop, jewelry and glasses. This case is being investigated by the Detective Division.

## Commercial Burglaries

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were eleven vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Lake Merced Golf Course parking lot—a briefcase containing miscellaneous paperwork was taken from a 2011 Mercedes E350. The passenger rear wing window was smashed. Occurred on 10-21-13 at 12:30 PM. A suspect has been identified in this case.
- 6800 block of Mission Street—an iPhone 5 was taken from the cup holder of a 2002 Honda Accord. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 10-23-13 between 4:23 PM and 4:28 PM.
- Roosevelt Street/Bellevue Avenue—a GPS unit, miscellaneous tools and a credit card was taken from a 2010 Ford Transit. The passenger door lock was pried. Occurred between 9:00 PM on 10-22-13 and 7:00 AM on 10-23-13.
- Parking garage at 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard—a backpack containing school books was taken from a 2010 Hyundai Santa Fe. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 10-24-13 between 12:00 PM and 4:45 PM.
- Parking garage at 371 Imperial Way—nothing was taken from a 2005 Honda Pilot. The driver's side rear wing window was smashed. Occurred on 10-24-13 between 7:20 PM and 8:00 PM.
- Parking garage at 371 Imperial Way—a gym bag with clothing was taken from a 2011 Ford Focus. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 10-24-13 between 6:30 PM and 8:00 PM.

- Unit block of Longview Drive—shoes, backpack, and sunglasses were taken from a 2012 Audi A4. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 7:00 PM on 10-23-13 and 6:30 PM on 10-25-13.
- 24 Hour Fitness parking lot—a purse containing identification and cash was taken from a 2010 Chevrolet Equinox. The rear passenger door window was smashed. Occurred on 10-25-13 between 2:15 PM and 4:30 PM.
- 600 block of Schwerin Street—miscellaneous coins taken from a 2003 Toyota Corolla. The driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 10-26-13 between 2:00 AM and 7:00 AM.
- 600 block of Schwerin Street—a wallet containing identification, credit cards and cash was taken from a 2008 Toyota Highlander. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 10-26-13 between 12:01 AM and 5:00 AM.
- 600 block of Estate Court—electronic equipment, clothing, sunglasses, purse and wallet were taken from a 2004 Mitsubishi Endeavor. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 6:30 PM on 10-25-13 and 12:00 PM on 10-26-13.

There were two stolen vehicles this past week. Both were recovered.

- 4700 block of Callan Boulevard—a 1998 Honda Civic. Occurred between 11:00 PM on 10-21-13 and 5:45 AM on 10-22-13. \*\*Recovered later that day by DCPD.
