Notable Cases

On Monday, 10-28-13 at 12:03 a.m., Officer Shane Hart was on patrol in the area of Guttenberg Street and Bellevue Avenue when he saw a Dodge Ram pick-up parked in the middle of the street. As Officer Hart drove closer to the vehicle, the driver suddenly turned on the headlights, started the engine and began accelerating through the intersection. Officer Hart then got into a vehicle pursuit with the truck. Sergeant Eddie Klier advised the officer to terminate the pursuit. Officer Hart complied and shortly after that, he saw the truck driving at a high rate of speed and ran into a high concrete center median on Geneva Avenue. With the assistance of other Daly City Police officers and officers from the San Francisco Police Department, the suspect, a 23-year old Daly City resident was detained. He was subsequently arrested for felony evading, vehicle theft (with priors), possession of a stolen vehicle, carrying a concealed dagger, driving with a suspended license and for two outstanding felony warrants.

On Friday, 11-01-13 at 3:00 p.m., officers took a report of a missing 87-year old male who suffers from dementia. He walked away from Serramonte Mall. He was found in good health the next day in San Francisco, and the San Francisco Police Department drove him home.

On Sunday, 11-03-13 at 11:00 p.m., several officers were dispatched to a vehicle on fire on the 300 block of Northaven Drive. Officer Shane Hart began using a garden hose to contain the fire until the Daly City Fire Department arrived to extinguish it. The owner of the vehicle believes her ex-boyfriend purposely set the vehicle on fire. This investigation is continuing.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

Between 10:30 a.m. on 10-28-13 and 7:45 a.m. on 10-29-13, a storage unit on the 100 block of South Mayfair Avenue was burglarized. An unknown subject pried the deadbolt and did not take any property.

- 200 block of Polaris Way—a GPS unit, registration and insurance card was taken from a 2003 Honda Pilot. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 10-29-13 between 7:30 a.m. and 8:40 a.m. **On-line report.
- 400 block of Southhill Boulevard—a make-up bag, boxing gear and a center console was taken from a 2012 Kia Sorento. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 12:00 a.m. on 10-28-13 and 6:30 a.m. on 10-29-13. **On-line report.
- 6000 block of Mission Street—an iPhone 5S was taken from a 2003 Pontiac Montana. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 11-01-13 between 9:15 a.m. and 10:15 a.m.
- 24 Hour Fitness parking lot—computer bags containing laptops and other electronics were taken from a 2012 Dodge Journey. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 11-02-13 between 1:00 p.m. and 1:45 p.m.
- Unit block of Hillside Boulevard—a subwoofer and checks were taken from a 2005 Toyota Corolla. An unknown window was smashed. Occurred between 9:30 a.m. on 11-01-13 and 12:57 p.m. on 11-02-13.
