Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 11-05-13, a residence on the unit block of Thiers Street was burglarized. (See “residential burglaries” section for details.) The victim’s car keys were taken during the burglary, and two days later, his vehicle was stolen. On 11-8-13, the San Francisco Police Department was involved in a pursuit with the stolen vehicle, and a suspect was arrested. The suspect, a 20-year old transient, was arrested for burglary and admitted to breaking into the residence and returning to steal the vehicle.

On Wednesday, 11-6-13 at approximately 1:33 a.m., Officer Tony Baroni stopped a driver of a vehicle on Washington Street and Hill Street for a using a cell phone while driving. The driver, a 48-year old Daly City resident, was on probation for narcotics-related charges and has a search and seizure clause. Officer Baroni found a large quantity of marijuana in the trunk of the vehicle. The driver said she just got released from jail from her last arrest, and the vehicle was in the impound yard. She said the tow yard employees must have put the marijuana in her trunk. This case will be sent to the District Attorney’s Office for a complaint.

On Sunday, 11-11-13 at 1:22 a.m., Officer Taylor Johnson stopped a subject at the Chevron Gas Station on John Daly Boulevard. The bicyclist, a 27-year old Daly City resident, did not have adequate lighting or reflectors. Officer Johnson asked the subject if he had anything illegal on his person, and the subject said he had a flare gun in his front pocket. He was subsequently arrested for concealing a firearm on his person and for having that firearm loaded.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Tuesday, 11-05-13 between 10:00 a.m. and 10:30 p.m., a residence on the unit block of Thiers Street was burglarized. The suspect gained entry via an open second floor bedroom window. The loss was two iPads, a Toshiba mini-computer, a Samsung Galaxy 3 cell phone and a set of car keys. The car was stolen a couple of days later. Subsequent to a vehicle pursuit in San Francisco of the victim's stolen vehicle, the driver of the vehicle was arrested and admitted to the burglary and auto theft.

On Thursday, 11-07-13 at an unknown time, an apartment on the 1500 block of Southgate Avenue was burglarized. An unknown subject kicked the front door to gain entry. The loss is unknown, and this investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

There were four commercial burglaries during the past week. All occurred at the same location and date.

On Thursday, 11-07-13 between 5:45 p.m. and 7:30 p.m, four lockers at the Planet Fitness facility on Junipero Serra Boulevard were burglarized. In each case, the padlocks were cut. The following property was taken:

- Victim #1: Dell laptop, Coach purse containing a driver's license and three credit cards.
- Victim #2: Metro PCS cell phone.
- Victim #3: Wallet containing miscellaneous credit cards and a white gold ring.
- Victim #4: Timbuk 2 shoulder bag containing miscellaneous items, wallet and car keys.

INVESTIGATION:

Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot #C5—a backpack containing a MacBook Air, school books and headphones was taken from a 2013 Toyota Prius. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-04-13 between 12:40 p.m. and 12:50 p.m.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot near Macy's (east side)—a backpack containing a MacBook Air from the floorboard of a 1986 Toyota Camry was taken. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 11-05-13 between 3:00 p.m. and 5:25 p.m.
- 6000 block of Mission Street—a 49'ers jacket and a backpack containing an HP mini laptop, iPod, iPad and schoolbooks were taken from a 2006 BMW 325. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 11:00 p.m. on 11-06-13 and 7:15 a.m. on 11-07-13.
- AT&T Store parking lot on Gellert Boulevard—nothing taken from a 2008 Scion XB. A window was smashed to gain entry. Occurred on 11-07-13 at 6:27 p.m.

- Celia's parking lot—an iPad, MacBook Pro and two credit cards were taken from the floorboard of a 2007 Toyota RAV4. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-07-13 between 6:15 p.m. and 7:15 p.m.
- Parking garage at 2051 Junipero Serra Boulevard—unknown if anything was taken from a 2001 BMW. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-09-13 at an unknown time.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot near JC Penney's—a backpack containing identification, credit cards, checks, keys, a wallet and cash was taken from a 2013 Ford Escape. The passenger door window was smashed. Occurred on 11-11-13 between 2:15 p.m. and 3:27 p.m.

Stolen Vehicles

There were two stolen vehicles this past week.

- Unit block of Thiers Street—a 2006 Mazda 6. Occurred on 11-07-13 at 10:10 p.m.
**SFPD recovered the vehicle on 11-08-13.
- 900 block of Skyline Drive—a 1993 Honda Civic. Occurred between 12:00 p.m. on 11-10-13 and 9:00 a.m. on 11-11-13.

Scams/Other

On 11-05-13 at 2:00 p.m., a 53-year old Daly City resident was the victim of a fraudulent telephone solicitation by "Smith", who claimed to be an attorney from Los Angeles. "Smith" advised the victim that he owed \$780 to the I.R.S. for failing to report additional income the previous year. The victim asked if he could make a partial payment, and "Mr. Smith" agreed. "Mr. Smith" told the victim that he needed to make the payment to "Evelyn Maria Villalobos" in Peru. The victim made the partial payment via the Western Union office in Daly City. After being contacted again by "Mr. Smith", the victim became suspicious and called the police. This case is currently under investigation.

Nixle

iHelp
