Notable Cases

For the last six weeks, the murder trial of Reynaldo Maldonado took place in Redwood City. Maldonado is one of the suspects in the stabbing murder of 15 year old Quetzacoatl Alba in 2001. Last week, a jury found Maldonado guilty of first degree murder.

On Monday, 11-11-13 at approximately 1:09 a.m., Officer Taylor Johnson stopped a bicyclist in the area of the Chevron Gas Station on John Daly Boulevard for improper lighting and reflectors. Officer Johnson asked the subject if he had anything illegal on his person, and the suspect told the officer he had a flare gun in his front pocket. The flare gun was altered to look more like a weapon. The subject, a 27-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for concealing a firearm on his person and having that firearm loaded.

On Thursday, 11-14-13 at approximately 10:30 a.m., officers were dispatched to Westmoor Avenue and Skyline Boulevard on a report of a hit and run accident. A witness reported that the driver fled the scene foot. The victim suffered a head injury and was transported to San Francisco General Hospital. The suspect telephoned his wife who, in turn, telephoned the police department. Officers located the suspect, a 43-year old Tiburon resident, at the Serramonte Shopping center. He was taken into custody and arrested for hit and run, driving under the influence causing great bodily injury, driving with a suspended driver's license, driving while on probation for driving under the influence and for a probation violation.

On Saturday, 11-16-13 at approximately 10:00 p.m., a residence on the 200 block of Polaris Way was the victim of shooting into an inhabited dwelling. An unoccupied vehicle on the same block was also the victim of a shooting. The reporting party said she heard shots and then saw two to three subjects running towards Pope Street in San Francisco. The subjects are unknown, and no one was injured. This case is still being investigated.

Robberies

There were two robberies and three attempted robberies during the past week.

On Monday 11-11-13 between 5:25 a.m. and 5:35 a.m., a 49-year old Daly City resident advised that while he was taking out his trash at his apartment complex on the 2600 block of Geneva Avenue, he was approached from behind by a subject who asked for his wallet. When the victim said he didn't have a wallet, the subject asked for his watch and wedding ring. The victim described the subject as a black male, 5'10", wearing baggy jeans and a gray sweatshirt. This case is being investigated. The victim was unharmed.

On 11-15-13 at 8:25 p.m., Officer Peter Skeeahan was dispatched to Macy's on a report of a shoplifting suspect who tried to stab one of the loss prevention personnel. Two of the loss prevention officers saw the 26-year old San Francisco resident stealing clothing, and when they confronted the suspect, the suspect started grabbing the victims and eventually brandished a 4" pocket knife at one of the loss prevention officers and fled the scene with merchandise. The suspect was apprehended by Sgt. Eddie Klier a short distance away. The subject was arrested for robbery, commercial burglary, possession of stolen property, possession of burglary tools, brandishing a deadly weapon and for possessing false government identification.

On Monday, 11-13-13 at approximately 2:30 a.m., a 14-year old Daly City resident reported being the victim of an attempted armed robbery via display of knives by two unknown subjects. This occurred in the area of Gellert Boulevard and Derby Street in Daly City. The victim said he and his friend were walking back from the bus stop near the Home Depot in Colma and were near Derby Street when one subject, described as a Hispanic male between 16-17 years old, 5'6", 130 lbs., wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans and another subject, described as an Asian male between 16-17 years old, 5'6", 150 lbs., wearing a blue hooded jacket with the hood pulled over his head and black pants, both approached him, holding knives and asked where he was going. The victim ran away unharmed, and the two subjects are outstanding.

On 11-14-13 at 2:45 a.m., Officer Kenneth Kim was dispatched to Mission Street and Templeton Street on a report of an attempted robbery via punches to the back of the victim's head by two unknown male suspects. The victim said he was in the area of Brunswick Street and Templeton Street walking home when he was approached by two male suspects. He said one subject pointed an unknown object at him and demanded his backpack. Before he could react, the victim said he was struck several times in the back of the head by both suspects. He said he fell to the ground, but he did not lose his property. The victim could not describe the subjects.

On 11-14-13 at 5:55 p.m., Officer Raul Andrade was dispatched to the police department on a report of an attempted robbery that occurred in the area of 92nd Street and Sullivan Street. The victim, a 27-year old Daly City resident, said he had a meal at In N Out and was walking on Sullivan Street, looking at a video on his cell phone while walking. At that time, he said an unknown subject came up from behind him and said, "dude" and reached for his cell phone. The victim said the phone dropped on the ground, and the subject then started running towards the post office. The subject was described as a black male in his 20's, wearing a dark sweater and white tennis shoes. Officers were unable to locate the suspect.

Residential Burglaries

There were four residential burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 11-13-13, between 5:00 a.m. and 11:45 a.m. a residence on the 100 block of Huntington Drive was burglarized. The suspect(s) pried the front door and took a purse, earrings, a laptop and two cell phones.

On Thursday, 11-14-13 between 4:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., a townhouse on the 300 block of Half Moon Lane was the victim of a burglary. The suspect(s) pried the sliding glass door to gain entry and took a laptop and jewelry.

On Friday, 11-15-13 between 2:30 p.m. and 5:00 p.m., an apartment on the 300 block of Imperial Way was burglarized. An unknown suspect forced entry to the front door and took currency and a 23" flat screen television.

On Saturday, 11-16-13 between 2:30 p.m. and 10:40 p.m., an apartment on the 300 block of Half Moon Lane was burglarized. The method of entry is unknown. The loss was a backpack, a Sony Viao laptop, a Dell laptop and a Sony Wii game system.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were eight vehicle burglaries during the past week. Please do not keep your valuables in plain view.

- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot near JC Penney—a backpack containing identification, cards, checks, keys, a wallet and cash was taken from a 2013 Ford Escape. The passenger door window was smashed. Occurred on 11-11-13 between 2:15 p.m. and 3:27 p.m.
- PetSmart parking lot—nothing taken from a 2010 Mazda 5. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-12-13 at 4:15 p.m. **Two subjects were arrested at the scene.
- Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot #F—a cell phone was taken from a 1996 Ford Explorer. The rear driver's side window was smashed. Occurred on 11-12-13 between 3:00 p.m. and 4:05 p.m. **The same subjects who were arrested at the PetSmart parking lot were responsible for this burglary.
- Westlake Shopping Center parking lot near Walgreen's—a backpack containing schoolbooks, a calculator and phone charger was taken from a 2010 Toyota Corolla. The passenger door window was smashed. Occurred on 11-13-13 between 8:15 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.
- Westlake Shopping Center parking lot near Walgreen's—a tote bag containing a laptop was taken from a 1995 Toyota Corolla. A window was smashed to gain entry. Occurred on 11-13-13 between 7:57 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.
- Unit block of Belmar Avenue—nothing taken from a 1994 Mazda Miata. The driver's side wing window was smashed. Occurred between 5:00 p.m. on 11-13-13 and 6:00 a.m. on 11-14-13.
- In N Out parking lot—a backpack containing miscellaneous property was taken from a 2008 Toyota Corolla. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-16-13 between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.

- Outback Restaurant parking lot—miscellaneous clothing and cosmetic items was taken from a 2013 Ford Limited. The left rear window and rear windows were smashed. Occurred on 11-16-13 between 8:30 p.m. and 9:15 p.m.
