



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

### Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 11-26-13, Sergeant Melinda Barry was dispatched to the 400 block of North Parkview Street on a report of someone illegally possessing roosters. Animal Control assisted in seizing a rooster and will seek compliance with removing the rest, as it is a violation of the city municipal code to possess roosters.

On Thursday, 11-28-13 at 11:51 PM, Officer Patrick Dolan was dispatched to the 300 block of Peoria Street on a report of a man with a gun. The victim reported the subject had brandished a firearm at him. Officer Dolan checked the immediate area and could not locate anyone matching the description. He later saw a subject matching the description attempting to board a bus on Mission Street. The subject was stopped and Officer Dolan ordered him to get off the bus. The subject, a 23-year old Daly City resident, initially didn't want to speak to the officer. After other officers arrived, they were able to search the subject. The subject had a Mac-11 sub machine gun tucked in his waistband. He was subsequently arrested for brandishing, concealing a weapon, possessing a machine gun and a high capacity magazine, and carrying a dirk/dagger.

On Friday, 11-29-13 at 2:50 p.m., Officer Angelo Hamilton and Officer Don McCarthy were dispatched to the Serramonte Shopping Center parking lot on a report of suspicious people attempting to open car doors. A male jumped into a white Pontiac and exited the parking lot at a high rate of speed. Officers began to canvass the area for the vehicle, and bystanders assisted them by telling them the direction of travel. The driver collided with several cars and jumped out on foot. Officers later found him on Highway 1 near Clarinada. The suspect, a 24-year old Hayward resident, was arrested for hit and run, resisting a police officer, burglary, receiving stolen property, driving with a suspended license and for driving without insurance.

On Tuesday, 12-3-13 at 10:18 p.m., Sergeant Matt Fox was on patrol on Mission Street near Templeton Avenue when he saw two subjects walking and passing a bottle of liquor to one another. Sergeant Fox motioned the subjects to come to the sidewalk, and one subject took off running southbound on Mission Street. A foot chase ensued, and the subject who was running threw an object from his waistband to the street. After the suspect was apprehended, it was determined he threw a baggie of methamphetamine on the street. The 37-year old transient subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and for resisting arrest.

On Wednesday, 12-04-13 at 3:46 a.m., Officer Patrick Dolan was patrolling the area of Templeton Avenue and Brunswick Street in a patrol vehicle equipped with a license plate reading camera system. The camera system detected that a nearby vehicle was stolen and was traveling eastbound on Templeton Avenue. Officer Dolan attempted to contact the driver, and a short pursuit ensued. The driver, a 17-year old San Francisco resident, crashed the car into a parked vehicle. He was taken into custody for auto theft, receiving stolen property and evading the police and was booked into the Youth Service Center.

## Robberies

There was one robbery during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 12-02-13, at approximately 1:30 a.m., a 26-year old Daly City resident reported that as she was walking back to her residence on the unit block of Poncetta Drive, she was the victim of a robbery via a punch to the face. She said she was hit in the face by what was believed to be a bottle, and the subject, described as an unknown white or Hispanic male, approximately 28-30 years old, 5'9", approximately 190 pounds wearing a black sweater and black beanie, took her Louis Vuitton purse containing a driver's license, cash and house keys. She was treated at the hospital for the injuries to her face.

## Residential Burglaries

There were three residential burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Tuesday, 11-26-13 between 3:00 p.m. and 6:10 p.m., a condominium on Half Moon Lane was burglarized. An unknown suspect entered the condo via an unknown means and took two Apple MacBook Pro laptops and a Sony laptop.

Between Wednesday, 11-27-13 and Friday 12-06-13 at 11:30, a storage locker on the 300 block of Southgate Avenue was burglarized. Entry was made via a pry to the lock, and the loss was a mini bike, laptop and miscellaneous tools.

Between Friday, 11-29-13 at 11:00 p.m. and Tuesday, 12-03-13 at 7:50 a.m., a storage locker on the unit block of Forest Grove Drive was burglarized. An unknown subject pried the locker and took miscellaneous household goods.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 12-02-13 between 2:28 p.m. and 3:00 p.m., a hair salon on the unit block of West Market Street was the victim of a burglary. While the business was open, two subjects—a Hispanic female with dark skin, approximately 4'11", heavy set build, wearing a red jacket and

blue jeans and another Hispanic female approximately 5'11", entered the business and took a purse containing a wallet, driver's license, credit cards, cash and keys that was hanging from a hook on a table.

On Monday, 12-02-13 at approximately 2:30 p.m., a hair salon on the 6200 block of Mission Street was burglarized. A stylist reported that as she was working, two Hispanic female adults entered the salon and asked to have their hair colored. They sat on a chair waiting for their turn. The stylist said she went to mix the dye, and when she came out, she saw the subjects had left. About an hour later, she discovered her purse was missing from the bottom drawer of her work place. The first subject is described as a Hispanic female, 45 years old, blonde hair, 5'6", 180 lbs. and last seen wearing a green and white blouse and black pants. The second subject is described as a Hispanic female, 50 years old, dark hair, 5'0", 170 lbs. and wearing a light brown blouse.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were ten vehicle burglaries during the past two weeks. Please remember to not keep your items in plain view. Especially now, thieves will be out looking to capitalize on shoppers.

## Scams/Other

On Friday, 11-29-13 at 1:28 p.m., a 20-year old subject received a call from a man with a Spanish accent, claiming to be with the “PG&E Disconnection Department”. He was told that a bill under the name of his mother had an outstanding amount due of \$800. The subjects said if this isn’t paid within an hour via Money Pack, the electricity would be cut off. The subject knew the bill was outstanding and purchased two Money Pack cards in order to pay. After he paid the bill, the reporting party called the phone number on the PG&E bill, and explained what took place. The PG&E employee explained they do not take payments via Money Pak cards.

On Friday 12-06-13, a 74-year old Daly City resident received a phone call from a subject named “Sean”, who said he was an IRS agent and that he had an arrest warrant for her. As soon as she received the call, she fainted and had to be transported to the hospital. Later, her sister received a call from “Sean” who told her the same thing, but that the warrant could be retracted if he received \$3,000. Her sister felt compelled to help her. “Sean” advised her to withdraw the money and purchase “Green Dot MoneyPak” cards with the money. After loading the money into the Green Dot cards, she was advised by “Sean” to tell him the numbers on the green dot cards. She did as she was advised to do and “Sean” hung up. Moments later, she said “Sean” called her again and advised her he needed more money. He asked for her bank account number, saying

he would deposit the \$3,000 back into the account, but she refused. She did agree to send \$2,000. After that, she realized she was being scammed.

### **Avoid the 23 DUI Task Force**

This holiday season, the Police, Sheriff and the CHP will be out in force cracking down on drunk drivers throughout the region with aggressive “*Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*” enforcement. From Dec. 13, 2013, to Jan. 1, 2014, state and local law enforcement will be helping to keep roads safe for holiday travelers by watching for drunk drivers.

The Avoid the 23 DUI Task Force will be aggressively looking for drunk drivers this holiday season with plans in place for two DUI/Driver’s License Checkpoints, a Multi-Agency Strike Team, twelve local roving DUI Saturation Patrols and a DUI Warrant/Probation Sweep.
