Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 04-22-14 between midnight and 8:30 a.m., an unknown subject set fire to the rear door of the Larcombe Clubhouse on Lake Merced Boulevard. This case is referred to the fire department.

On Tuesday, 04-22-14 at 5:21 p.m., Officer Dante Digiacomio and Officer Tony Baroni were dispatched to the Good News Fellowship Church on Los Banos Avenue on a report of a male subject sitting to the right of the church stairs possibly "shooting up" with needles. Officer Digiacomio arrived first and saw a subject with his eyes closed and holding two hypodermic syringes in his hand. Officers searched the subject, a 32-year old transient, and found heroin, syringes and a Leatherman in his possession. This case has been referred to the District Attorney's Office for prosecution.

On Wednesday, 04-23-14 at 1:26 p.m., officers were dispatched to the medical office building at 1500 Southgate Avenue on a report of a man with a gun, along with a shot fired. Numerous people were evacuated from the building, and no one was injured. A former patient, an 84-year old Daly City resident, was identified as the suspect and was later arrested for attempted murder.

On Thursday, 04-24-14 at 2:45 a.m., Officer Tiffany Cook was dispatched to a parking garage on the unit block of Hill Street on a report of two subjects sleeping in a vehicle. Other officers arrived on the scene at the same time and woke up the sleeping subjects. The vehicle was stolen from Daly City a couple days prior. Officers searched the passenger's purse and found credit cards and other identification not belonging to her. While they were speaking with her, the officers observed the subject was under the influence of a controlled substance, and she admitted she had used methamphetamine a couple days before. The male subject admitted that he knew the vehicle was stolen. The male was also under the influence of a controlled substance, and he admitted he had used methamphetamine. The female, a 25-year old San Francisco resident, was

arrested for possession of a controlled substance, possession of credit/identification cards, being under the influence of a controlled substance and for three outstanding misdemeanor warrants. The male subject, a 33-year old Union City resident, was arrested for vehicle theft, possession of a stolen vehicle and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Saturday, 04-26-14 at 11:59 p.m., Officer Peter Skeehan was on patrol in the area of John Daly Boulevard and Poncetta Drive and stopped a vehicle for expired registration. Officer Skeehan noticed the driver had bleary eyes, was slurring his words and had a difficult time focusing on him. The subject admitted to drinking earlier and allowed the officer to conduct a field sobriety test on him. Officer Skeehan asked the subject if he could search his car, and the subject consented. The officer found a used glass crack pipe in the glove box and one in the ash tray. The subject admitted to smoking crack earlier in the evening. The subject was arrested for possession of cocaine base, being under the influence of a controlled substance and for possession of narcotics paraphernalia.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Saturday, 04-26-14 at 5:25 a.m., Officer Gary Thompson was dispatched to the unit block of Vale Street on a report of an armed robbery that had occurred 15 minutes prior. The victim said he was in his unlocked vehicle and was using his phone to text his girlfriend when an unknown African American male opened his door and pointed a gun at him. The suspect said, "Give me everything you got" as he took the wallet from the driver's side door pocket. The victim, a 23-year old Daly City resident, said the suspect also took his cell phone. Once he took the belongings, the suspect struck the victim three times in the face with the handle of the gun and then ran away. The suspect was described as approximately 25 years old, 5'10", wearing dark clothing and a dark beanie. The suspect also had something covering his face. Officers checked the area but could not locate the suspect.

On Sunday, 04-27-14 at 5:35 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of Citrus Avenue and San Diego Avenue on a report of a robbery. The victim said he went to the Mission Plaza to purchase a new cell phone from the Metro PCS store. When he was near the front door of the business, he was approached by a subject who showed him a white smartphone and asked if he wanted to buy it. They negotiated a price, and the victim agreed to purchase it. The victim said he wanted to hook up the service before completing the deal to make sure the phone was legitimate. The victim pulled on the front door of the front door, and the female employee inside the store told him it was closed. The suspect then ran away with the victim's money and the cell phone. The victim chased the suspect, yelling "help" numerous times. The victim said the suspect stopped running and held a knife in his hand and told the victim to "get back". Officer Scott Hepler found the suspect, a 23-year old transient, and took him into custody for robbery, receiving stolen property, possession of a switchblade and obstructing/resisting a peace officer. The victim was unharmed.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Friday, 04-25-14 at 12:10 p.m., officers were dispatched to an interrupted residential burglary to an apartment on the 100 block of South Parkview Avenue. The suspect was described as a male, 6'1", muscular build, wearing a ski mask and khakis. The reporting party said he was sleeping when he heard the sound of glass breaking and saw an unknown subject climbing through the broken window of his parent's bedroom. The reporting party said he grabbed his cell

phone and yelled that he was going to call the police. The suspect then fled the scene, and officers were unable to locate him.

Commercial Burglaries
