Notable Cases

On Monday 04-28-14 at 4:11 a.m., officers were dispatched to Mission Street and San Jose Avenue on a report of a just occurred auto burglary. The reporting party saw two suspects breaking in to a vehicle. Both subjects, 20 and 23 year old San Francisco residents, were arrested for auto burglary. These subjects were responsible for 15 auto burglaries in the area. They were also arrested for receiving stolen property, conspiracy to commit a crime, possession of burglary tools and committing a felony while out on bail.

On Wednesday, 04-30-14 at 7:50 a.m., officers were called to a residence on the 400 block of Florence Street on a report of a subject who was unresponsive and not breathing. The police and fire arrived and found a deceased 65-year old female. Detectives interviewed several witnesses at the scene, including the estranged husband of the deceased female. The 65-year old estranged husband was later arrested.

On Saturday, 05-03-14 at 10:27 p.m., at approximately 10:27 p.m., a 23-year old Daly City resident was the victim of battery by an 18-year old Daly City resident. The suspect punched the victim several times in the head and face. This occurred at a birthday party at the Lincoln Park Clubhouse. The victim was transported to Seton Medical Center for treatment, and the suspect was arrested the next day for battery with great bodily injury.

On Sunday, 05-04-14 at 4:57 p.m., officers were en route to the San Mateo County Jail to transport a prisoner and were near the Whipple Avenue exit in Redwood City when their patrol vehicle caught on fire. Everyone was evacuated, and there were no injuries. The vehicle became fully engulfed and was extinguished by the Belmont Fire Department.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Saturday, 05-03-14 between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m., a residence on the unit block of Muirwood Drive was burglarized. The burglar(s) entered the residence via an open side window and took a laptop, jewelry box and currency. Investigators are working on this case.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Friday, 05-02-14 at 7:45 p.m., Officer Angelo Hamilton was dispatched to a commercial burglary at the T-Mobile store at Westlake Shopping Center. The assistant manager reported that two African American male adults, one wearing a red hoodie and shorts and the other wearing a black hoodie and shorts, and an African American female adult with black curly hair stole four display cellular phones and one electronic tablet by cutting the steel braid wiring holding the items to a display table. They fled in an unknown direction, possibly in a vehicle described as a beige Nissan Altima. This investigation is continuing.

Scams/Other

This hasn't been reported to us, but I wanted you to be aware of it. The Redwood City Police Department is continuing to see an increase of telephone scams to residents in which the caller claims to be an IRS agent. The caller tells the unsuspecting victim that there is a problem with his/her tax return and that he/she needs to pay the amount immediately or face arrest. The suspects tell the victims to purchase pre-paid cards and to provide them to the suspect.

Other scams include callers claiming to be law enforcement asking for payment over the phone or a “bench warrant” will be issued, and lotto scams where callers ask for money over the phone, claiming that the victim has won a lottery sweepstakes.

We advise everyone to NOT WIRE MONEY OR PURCHASE PRE-PAID CARDAS for unsolicited telephone calls. These are scams, and the IRS and Law Enforcement do not operate like this.
