### Notable Cases

On Thursday, 06-12-14 at 5:52 p.m., Officer Raul Andrade stopped a vehicle on 87<sup>th</sup> Street and Park Plaza Drive for having expired registration and a broken tail light. The driver advised that her license was suspended but she was driving her 71-year old aunt to the bank because her aunt didn't feel well. The driver appeared very nervous when trying to find her identification. The officer asked the driver if she had anything illegal on her and asked if he could search her. The driver agreed. The officer asked the driver if he could search her vehicle for anything illegal, and she advised that many people drive the car and that she had seen a glass methamphetamine pipe on the side of the driver's seat. The officer found the pipe in the car and also a baggie of methamphetamine inside of her purse. The driver, a 31-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, suspended license and for displaying false registration.

On Friday, 06-13-14 at 2:13 a.m., Officer Bruce Perdomo made a similar arrest of a 38-year old Daly City resident for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and possession of drug paraphernalia after a traffic stop on Washington Street and Hill Street.

On Sunday, 06-15-14 at 2:07 p.m., Officer Robert Kett responded to the Serramonte Shopping Center on a report of a possible stolen vehicle. The reporting party, a 27-year old Berkeley resident, said he saw a Toyota Camry for sale on "Craig's List" and spoke with a male subject who agreed to meet him at the mall parking lot on the east side of the JC Penney store. The victim said the suspect was a white male, approximately 35 years old, 6'0", slender build, brown/gray hair, brown eyes and last seen wearing a black cashmere jacket, blue dress shirt and blue jeans. The reporting party then made a cash offer for \$11,000, and the seller (suspect) accepted it. The victim provided the cash and received the key and title. The victim said after the transaction, the suspect offered to purchase some cleaning supplies for his vehicle. The victim accepted his offer, and the suspect escorted the victim towards the Target store. The victim said his "gut feeling" told him something was wrong, and he told the suspect he was going to get

something out of his car and would meet him in front of the store. The victim moved his vehicle to another part of the parking lot. The victim said they were in Target for less than ten minutes, and then they exited and parted ways. The victim said he went to the location where his vehicle was, and it was missing. When the officer arrived, he determined the license plates were taken off another vehicle parked at the Park N Fly lot in Oakland and put onto this car. This investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 06-15-14 at 10:44 p.m., Officer Peter Skeeahan stopped a vehicle at Station Avenue and West Moltke Street for a not having lights activated. As the officer was approaching the vehicle, the driver got out of the vehicle, and the officer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the subject's breath. Officer Skeeahan started conducting a test to check the subject's intoxication, and the subject became uncooperative. Officer Skeeahan decided to place the subject into handcuffs and a struggle ensued. The 27-year old Daly City resident was subsequently arrested for battery on a peace officer, driving while under the influence, driving with a suspended license and resisting arrest. Officer Skeeahan suffered a minor injury to his wrist.

There were six arrests for driving under the influence during the week.

## Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Saturday, 06-14-14 at 12:40 p.m., two residents on the unit block of Lycett Circle reported hearing a subject banging on the front door. The residents didn't open the front door and then heard someone kick the door. The subject did not gain entry. Officers located an 18-year old male subject in the area, and he confessed to kicking the door to ultimately burglarize the resident. He was arrested and transported to the San Mateo County Jail.

## Commercial Burglaries

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were only two vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 800 block of Schwerin Street—an iPod, CD's and a phone charger were taken from a 2008 Honda Civic. Both of the front doors were pried. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 06-12-14 and 7:00 a.m. on 06-13-14.
- Planet Fitness parking lot—a laptop, sunglasses and currency taken from a 2013 Mercedes GLK350. The rear passenger was smashed. Occurred on 06-13-14 between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

## Scams/Other

### **“Pigeon Drop”**

This did not occur in our city, but it could. On Tuesday, 06-10-14 at 2:30 p.m., an 81-year old female was in the parking lot of the Dollar Tree in Colma when she was approached by a female who claimed she was from Africa and had two large rolls of currency that she couldn't take back to her country—fearing it would be seized by her government. During the conversation, a male suspect approached the victim and female subject and joined in the conversation. The male suspect then convinced the victim that they should both, in good faith, get whatever amount of money they could to exchange for the two large rolls of currency. The victim, who didn't realize she was being scammed, went to her bank and withdrew \$2,000 and gave it to the suspects as a good faith payment. In addition, while at the bank, she accessed her safety deposit box and removed antique coins and also offered those. The suspects then fled the area in an unknown direction with the cash and coins. The female suspect is described as a black female adult, approximately 5'7", heavy set, with curly black hair (possibly a wig), last seen wearing a dark brown jacket, tan pants, hoop style earrings with long green fingernails with a gold speckle design on them. The victim said she had an African accent. The second suspect was described as a black male adult, possibly in his 40's or 50's, approximately 5'5", smaller build, short hair and wearing a collared shirt and blue and gray tie. The Colma Police Department is our border city, and the victim came to a bank in our city. If you have any information, please call the Colma Police Department at (650) 997-8321.
