### Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 09-16-14 at 2:07 a.m., Officer Joshua Moala and Officer Benjamin Wagnon were on patrol in the area of the 2600 block of Geneva Avenue, an area which has experienced an increase of vehicle burglaries. They saw a subject standing near the apartment complex area and contacted the subject. When the subject saw the police car, he walked away from the location and was briefly concealed behind a low wall. The officers asked the subject what he was doing there, and he said he was visiting somebody in the apartment complex. He was unable to tell the officers what his friend's name was or which apartment he was visiting. The officers asked if the subject had anything illegal on his person, and he said he did not and agreed to allow the officers to search them. They found four "shaved keys" belonging to various vehicle makes. The officers asked the subject if he owned any of the vehicles, and he said he didn't. ("Shaved keys" are typically manipulated in such a manner to burglarize and/or steal vehicles.) The suspect said that he found the keys in San Francisco. The officers checked the area where the subject had concealed himself and found two more keys. The subject, a 43-year old San Francisco resident, was then cited for being in possession of burglary tools.

On Wednesday, 09-17-14 at 3:00 p.m., Officer Joshua McQuade and Officer Lilian Tashiro were stopped at the intersection of John Daly Boulevard and DeLong Street when their patrol vehicle was rear ended by a red Honda Prelude. The officers contacted the two subjects inside the vehicle and asked them for their identification. The driver said he didn't have his license, registration or insurance. The dispatcher advised the officers that the vehicle was stolen from San Francisco. The key that was in the vehicle was a "shaved" key. Officer Tashiro searched the passenger's purse and found a syringe with a brownish liquid—likely methamphetamine—in it. The driver, a 43-year old transient, was arrested for vehicle theft, possession of burglary tools and possession of a stolen vehicle. The passenger, a 51-year old transient was arrested for possession of a controlled substance. The officers were not injured in the crash.

On Thursday, 09-18-14 at 9:47 p.m., Officer Ben Wagnon and Officer Jay Multauopele were dispatched to a petty theft-grab and run that occurred at the Quick Pick Market on Hillside Boulevard. Officer Wagnon viewed the store's CCTV footage and recognized the suspect from a prior contact the night before. The store employee described the vehicle the subject left the area in, and the officer went to the suspect's address and saw the vehicle double parked on the 400 block of 89<sup>th</sup> Street. The officer contacted all the occupants in the vehicle and spoke with the subject in question. The officer smelled a strong odor of alcohol emanating from the suspect and asked him if he had anything to drink. The subject admitted to having a beer, and the officer then requested the subject participate in field sobriety tests, and he did. The officer determined the subject was under the influence. The subject, an 18-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for driving under the influence and for driving a motor vehicle without a driver's license. To add a twist to this incident, the vehicle that was involved in the case was involved in a strong armed robbery earlier that evening in San Francisco. The cell phone the suspect had in his possession was stolen from the victim in that robbery.

On Friday, 09-19-14 at 5:06 p.m., the fire department responded to an apartment on the 100 block of Park Plaza Drive on a report of a fire to garbage bags on the back porch. The fire department extinguished the fire. The suspect is outstanding.

On Friday, 09-19-14 at 10:00 p.m., Officer Bryce Lickness and Officer Keith Mattos were standing on the 500 block of Clarinada Avenue when a driver in a gold Chevrolet Impala passed by and yelled an obscenity at them. The officers tried to catch up to the vehicle but were unsuccessful. Approximately 30 minutes later, the officers saw the Impala driving on Serramonte Boulevard. They stopped the vehicle, and Officer Mattos asked the subject if he yelled the obscenity. The subject denied it. Officer Lickness searched the subject, a 22-year old Daly City resident, and found "brass knuckles" in his rear pants pocket. He was arrested for possession of brass knuckles.

On Sunday, 09-21-14 at 11:16 a.m., Officer Scott Hepler was dispatched to the 200 block of Hillside Boulevard on a report of a heated argument between a grandmother and her granddaughter. The grandmother said her 24-year old granddaughter is a habitual methamphetamine user and said they got into an argument earlier, and her granddaughter threw a can at her head. Officer Hepler said he was enroute to the residence when he saw the granddaughter leaving the residence. The 71-year old grandmother said she was tired and fed up with helping her granddaughter and wanted an emergency protective order against her. The subject was arrested for elder abuse, battery and vandalism. The judge granted an emergency protective order against the granddaughter.

On Sunday, 09-21-14 at 6:01 p.m., Officer Bryce Lickness was dispatched to the 1200 block of Hillside Boulevard on a welfare check. The reporting party was concerned about her son and believed he was under the influence as he was acting "erratically". The reporting party said her son is on probation, and she wanted him to leave the residence. Officers entered the residence with keys provided by the reporting party, and they saw the 25-year old subject sitting on the couch in the living room. Officer Lickness asked the subject if he had any drugs in his room, and he said he had pills. The officer asked what they were, and he said he didn't know, and that he had taken a pill an hour and a half earlier with a "shot" of alcohol. The officers also found a grappling hook, metal knuckles and a stun gun in the suspect's room. The suspect was arrested for being in possession of a controlled substance and metal knuckles and for being a felon in possession of a stun gun.

## Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 09-18-14 at 11:53 a.m., officers were dispatched to Geneva Avenue and Talbert Avenue on a report of a robbery that occurred approximately 20 minutes earlier. The 60-year old victim said she was walking eastbound on the sidewalk of Geneva and was with her friend who was walking ahead of her. She said at this time, an unknown subject who was walking in the opposite direction passed by her and grabbed her shoulder bag briefly, causing her to fall to the ground. She said the suspect then forcibly wrestled her handbag briefly and then walked towards MacDonald Avenue. The suspect was described as a black male, 25-31 years old, 6'0", large build, medium complexion, with short hair and wearing a grey tee-shirt. The loss was a wallet, two cell phones, currency and miscellaneous identification cards. The victim was treated briefly by paramedics but said she would seek her own treatment.

\*\*Update: while doing a follow-up investigation on 09-22-14, detectives were in the area of the above robbery when they saw a subject matching the description in the area. They stopped to interview him, and the subject gave a full confession. The 17-year old suspect was taken into custody for robbery.

On Saturday, 09-20-14 at approximately 2:10 a.m., officers were dispatched to the 500 block of Clarinada Avenue on a report of an armed robbery that had just occurred. Dispatchers said three subjects were robbed by gunpoint by five black males who had taken their cell phones, wallets, a passport and currency. Several units responded, along with a K-9 unit, and they were unable to locate the suspects. This investigation is continuing.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 09-15-14 at 12:23 p.m., a residence on the unit block of Westpark Drive was burglarized. An unknown suspect pried the security gate covering the rear sliding glass door and then smashed it to gain entry. An interior motion alarm was triggered. One downstairs guest room was ransacked, but there was no loss.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Saturday, 09-20-14 between 5:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m., an unknown subject entered the barbershop on the 1100 block of Hillside Boulevard by an unknown means and took the victim's cell phone, keys and wallet containing cash, debit cards, cash and a driver's license. The investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 09-21-14 between 3:24 a.m. and 3:27 a.m., officers were dispatched to the Royal Ruby Novelties kiosk at Skyline Plaza on a report of a burglar alarm. An unknown subject entered the building and used a crowbar to pry open a cabinet. There was no loss. This investigation is also continuing.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were three vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- IHOP parking lot—a bag containing miscellaneous work items was taken from a 2011 Chevrolet Colorado utility truck. The side passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 09-18-14 between 2:40 a.m. and 3:08 a.m.
- Pizza Hut parking lot—two backpacks containing books were taken from a 2014 Lexus SC400. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 09-19-14 between 11:15 a.m. and 11:52 a.m.
- Home Depot parking lot—sunglasses were taken from a 2010 Mercedes 350. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 09-20-14 between 7:45 p.m. and 10:00 p.m.

## Stolen Vehicles

There were four stolen vehicles in the last week. Two were recovered.

## **Daly City Council Adopts Urgency Ordinance to Regulate Outdoor Water Use**

On August 11, the City Council adopted an urgency ordinance regulating outdoor water use to conform with the emergency drought regulations recently adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. Daly City's urgency ordinance prohibits residents from:

- Washing down driveways and sidewalks.
- Watering outdoor landscapes that cause visible runoff.
- Using a hose to wash an automobile, unless the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle.
- Using potable water in non-recirculated ornamental fountains.

In addition, outdoor irrigation is prohibited between the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and limited to no more than two days per week (Sunday through Saturday)

Violations of the ordinance will result in a documented issuance of a written warning notice. If violations continue, then fines starting at \$250 with a maximum of \$1,000 may be issued per violation.

If residents observe water leaks or have concerns about non-essential water use, please contact the City 24-hours a day at (650) 991-8200.
