Notable Cases

On Monday, 10-06-14 at 12:24 a.m., Officer Jaime Bermudez stopped a subject on a bicycle with no proper lighting equipment in the area of Mission Street and Evergreen Avenue. The subject, a 53-year old San Francisco resident, told the officer he was on probation and also admitted to having a methamphetamine pipe on him. The officer asked the subject if he had anything illegal in his backpack, and the subject hesitated but then said he had an empty baggie in it. Officer Bermudez searched the backpack and found a white crystal-like substance (methamphetamine) in it. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and for possession of narcotic paraphernalia.

On Monday, 10-06-14 at 9:33 p.m., Officer Joshua McQuade was dispatched to the area of Mission Street and Gambetta Street on a report of a loud verbal argument between a female and a taxi driver. The victim said she was walking on Mission Street from the laundromat when a subject in a cab called to her. She said she couldn't understand the subject so she approached the cab, and she saw that the subject in the backseat had no clothes on and exposed his penis to her. The victim wanted to place a citizen's arrest on the subject, a 42-year old cab driver from San Jose.

On Monday, 10-06-14 at 4:30 a.m., Officer Shane Hart and Officer Noah Serbin were on patrol in the area of Templeton Avenue and Irvington Street when they were flagged down by a female subject who appeared to be in distress. At the same time, the officers noticed a male subject briskly walking towards Mission Street, looking over his shoulder at the patrol vehicle and then sprinting away. Officer Serbin stayed with the female subject, and Officer Hart went to look for the subject who sprinted. The female, a 49-year old Daly City resident, said she was walking towards Lincoln Park when a subject walked up from behind her, grabbed her and then punched her three to four times in the head and took her iPhone. She sustained several contusions to her head but refused medical aid. The subject who fled, a 21-year old Daly City resident was arrested for robbery after confessing to the crime.

On Wednesday, 10-08-14 at 4:59 p.m., Officer Steve Woelkers and Officer Brandon Scholes were on patrol in the area of Park Plaza Drive and John Daly Boulevard and stopped a vehicle for an unsafe movement. Officer Woelkers smelled a strong odor of marijuana in the vehicle and asked the driver if there was any marijuana in the vehicle. The driver said no. The officer asked the driver if he had anything illegal inside of his vehicle, and the driver said no, but that he didn't know about the passengers. The officer searched the three subjects, and one subject had a prescription bottle that wasn't his on his person. The officer found a loaded 9 mm semi-automatic handgun under the right front passenger seat. He also found marijuana, a box of unspent 9mm bullets and a can of pepper spray in the vehicle. One of the passengers, an 18-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for carrying a concealed weapon and for concealing a firearm not in lawful possession.

On Wednesday, 10-08-14 at 6:11 p.m., officers responded to the Serramonte Shopping Center on a report of a hit and run accident. The collision occurred on Serramonte Boulevard and Gellert Boulevard, and the subject drove away without leaving his information. A witness was able to take a photograph of the driver before he fled. The subject's photo was posted on the Daly City Police Department Facebook page, and later that evening, an alert citizen phoned in a tip identifying the subject. Officers contacted the subject who gave a full confession.

On Thursday, 10-09-14 at 12:09 a.m., Officer Kenneth Kim was dispatched to the unit block of Westpark Drive on a report of a subject knocking on people's doors. Officer Kim saw a subject who told him that he felt like someone was going to kill him. The officer told him he may be under the influence, and that he wanted to evaluate him. The subject didn't want to be evaluated at that location because he said he thought someone was trying to shoot him from the window. The officer asked the subject if would like to go to the Police Department for evaluation, and the subject agreed. At the station the subject said he took some pills, methadone and smoked marijuana earlier in the day. The officer arrested the 30-year old San Francisco resident for being under the influence of a controlled substance and took him to jail. At the jail, a deputy located a bag of suspected methamphetamine inside the subject's anal cavity during a strip search. The subject was additionally charged with bringing a controlled substance into jail.

On Saturday, 10-11-14, at 8:32 p.m., Officer Shane Hart was on patrol in the area of Geneva Avenue and Bayshore Boulevard when he stopped a vehicle for expired registration. After the officer asked the driver for his identification, the subject became extremely nervous and had trouble speaking, and his body was shaking. The subject was unable to provide any identification, and the officer asked him to step out of his vehicle. When asked if the officer could search his vehicle, the subject complied. The officer found a grocery bag containing a large digital weighing scale and another scale in another bag. After the officer found the scales, he asked the driver what they were. The driver again displayed nervous signs and claimed to not know what they were for. When the officer requested a drug sniffing K-9 to respond, the subject asked if he could speak with the officer and said, "It's in the trunk". The officer found cocaine and a great deal of cash in the car. The subject, a 60-year old Burlingame resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sales and transportation of a controlled substance for sales.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week.

On Monday, 10-06-14 at 4:30 a.m., Officer Shane Hart and Officer Noah Serbin were on patrol in the area of Templeton Avenue and Irvington Street when they were flagged down by a female subject who appeared to be in distress. At the same time, the officers noticed a male subject briskly walking towards Mission Street, looking over his shoulder at the patrol vehicle and then sprinting away. On Wednesday, 10-08-14 at 10:00 p.m., an armed "take over" robbery occurred at the Kentucky Fried Chicken on Geneva Avenue. The suspect entered the business armed with a shotgun and demanded money from the safe while holding store employees at gunpoint. An investigation by Detectives determined this was an "inside job". Two subjects, 19 and 20 year old San Francisco residents, were arrested for multiple charges stemming from robbery, assault with a deadly weapon, conspiracy to commit a crime, commercial burglary, and false imprisonment.

On Thursday, 10-09-14 at 10:00 p.m., a 27-year old Daly City resident said he was the victim of a robbery via a simulated weapon by an unknown black male in his 20's wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with the hood pulled over his head and down towards his eyes. This occurred on the north sidewalk of Macdonald Avenue between Allan Street and Talbert Street. The victim said the suspect got into a black Lexus GS driven by a Hispanic male in his 20's wearing a black baseball cap and black clothing. The vehicle was last seen westbound on Macdonald Avenue towards Schwerin Street. The loss was an iPod Nano and a black wallet containing cash and a debit card.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Tuesday, 10-07-14 between 10:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., a residence on the 3300 block of San Jose Avenue was burglarized. An unknown suspect entered the residence via an unlocked bedroom window on the second floor, ransacked two bedrooms, and took jewelry and shoes.

On Wednesday, 10-08-14 between 12:00 p.m. and 3:45 p.m., an apartment at 850 Campus Drive was burglarized by an unknown suspect who removed the lock to the front door. The loss was a laptop, iPad and a camera.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Saturday, 10-11-14 at 5:00 a.m., a pizzeria on the 7000 block of Mission Street was the victim of a burglary via a pry to the front door. The loss was cash. This investigation is still continuing.

Scams/Other

Craigslist Scam

This did not occur in Daly City, but I'd like to share this with you. On 10-09-14 at 1:25 p.m., Fremont officers took a case regarding a 24-year old male who had been robbed at gunpoint of two iPhone 6 cell phones. The victim said he put the ad on Craigslist and met the potential buyer at a bank because it was a public place. Prior to being robbed, the victim and suspect entered the bank where they looked at the phones. They then exited the bank to discuss the exchange in the parking lot. As they stood in the lot, the suspect took a handgun out of his pants and pointed it at the victim. The suspect then ordered the victim to get inside the victim's vehicle. The victim complied, and the suspect fled with the two phones. Luckily because part of their meeting occurred inside of the bank, officers were able to obtain video surveillance. Later that day, the suspect was identified and arrested. He had both phones with him at the time of arrest. Here are some suggestions from Fremont Police Department detectives when selling or purchasing items via Craigslist or from a second-hand party:

- Always arrange to meet in a public place.
- Get to the meeting location early and look around. If the location does not feel comfortable, change the location place.
- Find and use a meeting place that has visible video surveillance cameras.
- A police department's public parking lot is a good place, but make sure you go during business hours.
- Never meet alone or at night.
- Never travel to a residence of the seller/buyer unless you are purchasing a large item. In this case, bring someone with you.
- Always get the phone number, name and any additional contact information (vehicle the seller is driving, email address, etc.) that you can.
- Always proceed with caution. Do not go through with anything you feel might be suspicious.
