### Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 10-15-14 at 4:46 p.m., Officer Rodney Chittenden attempted to stop a dirt bike on Callan Boulevard at Southgate Avenue for a helmet and registration violation when the driver sped away from him. A short pursuit ensued, and the driver drove recklessly past other vehicles. The officer lost sight of the driver, but Officer Cameron Newton was in the area and detained the driver after he “dropped” the bike. After the 32-year old Pacifica resident was medically cleared from the hospital for injuries to his scalp and both knees, he was arrested for recklessly evading police, driving on a suspended driver's license and for violating his probation.

On Wednesday, 10-15-14 at 5:53 p.m., Officer Lucas Taylor was on patrol in the area of Lausanne Avenue and Ford Street and stopped a subject for jaywalking. A subsequent investigation revealed that the subject, a 39-year old Union City resident, had numerous pieces of identification not belonging to him. He was arrested for possession of information belonging to 81 access cards, identity theft of over ten victims, possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and for a no-bail warrant. Another subject he was with, a 35-year old female from Hayward, was arrested for possession of information belonging to 17 access cards, identity theft of over ten victims, possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and for bringing contraband into the jail.

On Wednesday, 10-15-14 at 6:51 p.m., Officer Joshua McQuade was conducting a foot patrol on the “Wilshire Walkway” which has been recently been the target of vandalism. Officer McQuade heard the distinct sound of a rattling spray paint can and spraying noises. He shined his flashlight in the direction of where he heard the sounds and saw a female adult spraying a can of spray paint on the overpass wall. The officer saw two other subjects holding spray paint cans. The three subjects, a 20-year old female Daly City resident, a 20-year old female transient and a 21-year old male San Francisco resident, were all arrested for vandalism and conspiracy to commit a crime.

On Wednesday, 10-15-14 at 10:31 p.m., Officer Ed Gregorio stopped a vehicle at Southgate Avenue and Lincoln Avenue for a headlight violation. Officer Kenneth Kim responded as a cover officer and smelled an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. When the officer asked the driver if there were any illegal weapons or drugs inside the vehicle, the driver said there was a little bit of marijuana and that he had a medical marijuana card. The officer asked if he could search his person and his vehicle, and the subject agreed. The officer found a large sum of cash on the subject, and he said it was from a casino. The officer found a large amount of marijuana, along with sandwich bags in the trunk. The subject, a 37-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of marijuana over 28.5 grams, possession of marijuana for sale, selling/furnishing marijuana and for negligent use of a pesticide.

On Saturday, 10-18-14 at 2:50 a.m., an 18-year old female from East Palo Alto was the victim of a hate crime in that male called her sexually and racially derogatory names and punched her in the face several times. This occurred in front of Nation's Hamburgers. The victim's girlfriend tried to intervene and dropped \$140 on the ground. The suspect picked it up, refused to return it and left with a female in a silver vehicle. Investigators are working on this case to identify the suspect.

On Saturday, 10-18-14 at 4:55 p.m., Officer Brandon Scholes and Sergeant Mike Brennan stopped a vehicle for speeding on the 6000 block of Mission Street. The driver, a 31-year old San Francisco resident, appeared extremely nervous. The officers asked the driver to step out of the vehicle and asked if they could search his person and vehicle for anything illegal. The officers found a small baggie of suspected crystal methamphetamine in the subject's pants pocket, as well as two "shaved" keys (used to commit auto thefts and burglaries). The officers then placed the subject under arrest. The officers asked the passenger, a 30-year old San Francisco resident to step out of the vehicle, and he also consented to being searched. Officers then searched the vehicle and found an unloaded firearm between the right front passenger seat and the center console. The driver was arrested for being a felon in possession of a firearm, possession of methamphetamine, possession of a controlled substance, possession of shaved keys and for committing a felony while out on bail. The passenger was arrested for possession of a concealed firearm in a vehicle.

On Sunday, 10-19-14 at 11:07 a.m., Officer Janet Cordellos and Officer Ira Perez were dispatched to a residence on the 200 block of Morton Drive on a report of a subject who was under the influence of a drug and who was threatening his mother. The subject, a 24-year old Daly City resident, was yelling at his mother when officer arrived, and the officers noted that he was sweating profusely and shaking. The subject was under the influence and was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance and for possession of narcotics paraphernalia.

## Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

## Residential Burglaries

There were three residential burglaries and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 10-13-14 between 8:00 p.m. and 9:45 p.m., an unknown suspect entered a residence on the unit block of Westdale Avenue via a rear unlocked sliding window, ransacked the rooms and took a camera and three lenses, two backpacks, a camera bag, a watch, two Macbook Pro laptops, a PlayStation game console and game, iPhone charger, keys, a passport and a social security card. This case is being investigated.

On Wednesday, 10-15-14 at approximately 8:23 a.m., a resident on the unit block of Guadalupe Avenue reported he was the victim of a residential burglary, forgery and identity theft. The victim suspects it is someone he knows. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 10-17-14 at 12:09 p.m., a residence on the unit block of Lakeview Drive was burglarized when an unknown suspect pried open a side door to the garage and made entry into the home. The audible alarm may have scared the suspect. There was no property missing.

On Saturday, 10-18-14 at 10:30 p.m., a resident on the unit block of 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue said his dog started barking, and he looked onto the second story deck and saw an unknown race male subject approximately 20 years old, approximately 6'1", 180 pounds, wearing all black clothing who then jumped into a neighboring backyard. No entry was made, and there is no loss. This has been referred to investigators.

## Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Sunday, 10-19-14 between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m., three juvenile suspects distracted a sales person at the Radio Shack store while another juvenile used scissors to cut the tags off headphone boxes and took seven sets of headphones. The following day, most likely the same suspects attempted to take more before they were interrupted by the clerk and fled the store.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There was only one vehicle burglary during the past week.

- 200 block of Accacia Street—a CD, registration and change was taken from a 2012 Subaru Outback. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 9:15 p.m. on 10-14-14 and 10:30 a.m. on 10-15-14. \*\*On-line report.

### **Publisher's Clearing House Scam**

On Friday, 10-17-14 at 2:30 p.m., the son of an 89-year old Daly City resident reported that his father received suspicious phone calls inquiring about personal information. The victim said a

man names "James Anderson" called from Publishers Clearing House said he won \$750,000, and one of his assistants would be delivering a check the next morning. The subject asked the victim for his date of birth, address, whether or not he lived alone and if he was a U.S. citizen. He also instructed him to pay delivery and processing fees by obtaining a "Green Dot Moneypak" card. The reporting party did not comply with "James Anderson's" numerous attempts to get the money after he told his son about it.
