



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

Note: It was brought to my attention that when I mention “the unit block” of a street, some people might now know what this means. In case you are interested, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 11-04-14 at 5:20 p.m., officers were dispatched to an office building on the 2000 block of Junipero Serra Boulevard on a report of a suspicious subject walking around the building. Officers found a male subject who was yelling and knocking on office doors, asking what they sell. The subject, a 33-year old San Francisco resident, said he was looking for a job. Officers noted the subject was talking in a fast pace, and his body was rigid, yet he moved his head from side to side. They determined he was under the influence of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and also found a hypodermic syringe in his bag. He later admitted to using methamphetamine and was arrested for being under the influence and for possessing the syringe.

On Friday, 11-07-14 at 12:21 p.m., Officer Dave Uziel and Officer Mario Busalacchi were dispatched to the unit block of Belhaven Avenue on a welfare check of an elderly female resident. The family was concerned for her welfare after issues arose over the stability of her 53-year old son. The resident said she was concerned with her son, as he appeared to be hallucinating and telling her the house contained bats and rats in the walls. She said her son was a recovering alcoholic and she was concerned he may be using drugs. When officers were speaking to the subject, they noted the subject’s eyes were flickering, his speech was rapid, he was smacking his lips, and he was unable to stand in one place. Officers found a single .357 caliber bullet in his pants pocket. The officers asked the subject if he had recently used drugs, and he said he didn’t use drugs but had recently drank something with methamphetamine in it. The subject was arrested for being a convicted felon with ammunition, violation of a court order for having ammunition and for being under the influence of a controlled substance. The elderly resident was in good condition.

On Friday, 11-07-14 at 2:30 p.m., officers were dispatched to an apartment on the 300 block of 89<sup>th</sup> Street of a report of a subject calling 911 to have his bone marrow removed to save the children of the world. Officers responded to the apartment and were greeted at the door by a caregiver and a male subject who was agitated, couldn't stop moving and talking. The male subject was angry, sad and laughing all within a few moments. The subject, a 57-year old Daly City resident, said he wanted to have his bone marrow removed to donate it to his mother who was in the other bedroom. The officers arrested the subject for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Saturday, 11-08-14 at 12:50 a.m., Officer Karen Douglas was at Lake Merced Boulevard and John Daly Boulevard and stopped a bicyclist for not having proper lighting. The subject, a 41-year old transient, consented to a search of his person and belongings, and the officer found a wallet with a driver's license belonging to someone else inside a bag the subject was carrying. The owner of the driver's license was contacted, and he advised he was the victim of a robbery via a gun on Halloween in San Francisco. The victim positively identified the suspect, and he was transferred to the custody of the San Francisco Police Department.

On Sunday, 11-09-14 at 2:42 a.m., as Lieutenant Mike Barton was returning to his vehicle after responding to a call on the 800 block of North Mayfair Avenue, he observed a vehicle driving towards him. He said as soon as he noticed the vehicle, the front bumper of that vehicle collided into the front bumper of his patrol vehicle. Lt. Barton said as he was standing behind the opened driver's door, the impact of the collision forced both him and the vehicle backwards. Lt. Barton fell onto his back into the vegetation. He had a complaint of pain to his lower back and left shin. The driver of the vehicle spontaneously said he had too much to drink and apologized for hitting the vehicle. The driver, a 23-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for driving under the influence and for causing bodily injury in a traffic collision—while driving under the influence.

## Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week.

On Wednesday, 11-05-14 at 5:28 p.m., Officer Garrett Larsen was flagged down in the area of Geneva Avenue and Accacia Street by a subject who said he was just robbed by a male subject carrying a handgun. The victim, a 15-year old San Francisco resident, said he was directly in front of the McDonald's restaurant when he was approached by a subject from the rear who said something to him, but that he didn't understand English very well. He said he then felt something in his right side from behind who grabbed his cell phone from his hand. He said the subject took his phone and began walking quickly westbound on Geneva Avenue. The subject was described as a black male, 5'7"- 5'8", 140-150 lbs., clean shaven with long dreadlocks with blonde highlights. He was last seen wearing a black baseball hat, a black vest with a red t-shirt and black jeans. The victim was unhurt. The loss was an iPhone.

On Wednesday, 11-05-14 at 3:19 p.m., a 15-year old Daly City resident reported he was the victim of a battery and strong armed robbery by three suspects in the area of Skyline Plaza. The victim said he was standing at the bus stop when the subject's started "getting into his face". The victim said the subjects pushed him and one took his wallet, took money from it and took his cell phone and bus pass from his pocket. The victim said the subjects then boarded the bus. Officers were able to stop the bus, and the victim positively identified all of the suspects. Two suspects, 16 and 17 year old South San Francisco residents, were arrested for robbery and conspiracy and were taken to the San Mateo County Youth Services Center. A complaint is sought for battery for the third suspect, a 14-year old Daly City resident. It should be noted that the following day, the same 14-year old suspect threatened to beat up the victim for "snitching" on him. He was arrested and booked at the San Mateo County Youth Services Center for preventing/dissuading a victim.

On Friday, 11-07-14 at 6:20 p.m., Officer Christopher Collins and Officer Janet Cordellos were dispatched to the corner of Rio Verde Street and Geneva Avenue. The reporting party said she had an argument with her 21-year old son who became angry and left the residence. She said she then got into her vehicle to drive her other son to school when she noticed her first son was having an altercation with a couple of males approximately 15-17 years old. She said she then saw her son grab both of the backpacks from the boys and pull them off their shoulders. The reporting party said she contacted the males to apologize and told them she would get the backpacks back. She said she grabbed one back from her son, and he ran away with one of the backpacks. Later that evening, officers found the suspect and arrested him for robbery. The victims were unharmed.

## Residential Burglaries

There were three residential burglaries and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Tuesday, 11-04-14 between 4:00 p.m. and 10:50 p.m., an apartment on the 100 block of Park Plaza Drive was burglarized. The suspect gained entry via an unlocked rear sliding window, removed the screen and ransacked the apartment. The suspect took a television, Sony PlayStation and an Apple MacBook Pro laptop.

On Wednesday, 11-05-14 between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., a residence on the 100 block of Dockside Drive was burglarized. Entry was made via an unknown means, possible a key. The loss was a Sony laptop, a PlayStation console and other unknown items. The victim may know who committed this crime. The investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 11-06-14 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., a residence on the unit block of Martin Court was burglarized. The point of entry was via a pry to the rear sliding living room window. The loss was keys, identification cards and cash.

On Monday, 11-03-14 at approximately 7:36 p.m., a residence on the 100 block of Westdale Avenue was the victim of an attempted residential burglary via a pry to the back door. When the alarm sounded, the suspects fled on foot to a nearby vehicle and left the scene.

## Commercial Burglaries

- Boulevard Café parking lot—a laptop and debit cards was taken from a 2009 Toyota Highlander. Entry was made via unknown means. Occurred on 11-04-14 between 8:20 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.
- Trader Joe's parking lot—two backpacks were taken from the rear seat and front passenger floorboard of a 2014 Toyota Prius. The front passenger window and rear window were smashed. Occurred on 11-05-14 between 2:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.
