



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

Note: It was brought to my attention that when I mention “the unit block” of a street, some people might now know what this means. In case you are interested, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Monday, 11-10-14 at approximately 12:04 a.m., Officer Tiffany Cook attempted to stop a vehicle on Southgate Avenue near Junipero Serra Boulevard for driving recklessly. A short pursuit ensued and was terminated at Old Mission Road and El Camino Real in Colma. As Officer Cook was driving away from the scene, she was advised that there was a hit and run collision involving the pursued vehicle in South San Francisco. The vehicle was found unoccupied in the rear parking lot of Kaiser Hospital. Officer Jaime Bermudez saw a subject in the parking lot who admitted that he was the passenger in the vehicle. Officer Noah Serbin and Officer Nick McCarthy contacted a subject walking on El Camino Real who said he was the owner of the vehicle; however, the vehicle was in the shop. Officers searched the subject and found a loaded firearm in his waistband. After an investigation, the driver, a 22-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for evading a peace officer, possession of a loaded firearm, possession of a concealed firearm in a vehicle, hit and run with injuries and driving under the influence causing bodily injury. The passenger, a 28-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for delaying and obstructing a peace officer in the course of duty.

On Monday, 11-10-14 at 8:06 p.m., Officer Lee Aquila was on patrol in the Serramonte Shopping Center lot near the north entrance/exit of Macy's when he observed a vehicle with paper license plates idling against the curb directly in front of the exit. When Officer Aquila got closer to the vehicle, the vehicle accelerated at a high rate of speed and drove recklessly. Officer Aquila stopped the vehicle, and the driver said she left her wallet at home in San Jose. The officer smelled a strong odor of marijuana in the vehicle and the driver allowed the officer to search her vehicle. The passenger advised that she had been shopping, but she had no identification on her person. After searching the vehicle, the officers found numerous purses, 30 Target gift cards and clothing. A further investigation revealed that the suspects had just committed a burglary at a gym

in South San Francisco and other lockers at other gyms from Sunnyvale north. The driver, a 21-year old San Jose resident, was arrested for receiving stolen property, forgery, conspiracy to commit a crime, burglary, possession of burglary tools and reckless driving. The investigation is continuing.

On Wednesday, 11-12-14 at 9:33 p.m., Officer Steve Woelkers and Officer Korey Sprader were on patrol in the area of the 6800 block of Mission Street and saw a male subject walking in and out of the street. Officers contacted the pedestrian and asked if he had been drinking, as he had crossed over Mission Street in a dangerous fashion. Officers noted that the subject had a clenched his fist and appeared to be resisting contact. As they were searching the subject, a struggle ensued. The officers then saw the subject drop a plastic bag containing a clear crystal substance suspected to be methamphetamine. The subject, a 39-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance.

On Sunday, 11-16-14 at 1:30 p.m., Officer Christopher Collins was on patrol in the area of Westlake Shopping Center when he saw a female standing on the intersection of Southgate Avenue and Palmcrest Avenue. Officer Collins noted that the subject appeared lost but when she saw the officer, she walked toward a vehicle with two occupants. The officer spoke with the occupants in the vehicle, as well as the female. The driver, a 29-year old transient from Oakland, was arrested for possession of suspected methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, and for possession of a stolen vehicle. The second subject, a 40-year old Oakland transient, was cited for possession of suspected rock cocaine and suspected crushed methadone pills. The third subject (the female), a 43-year old transient from Oakland was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of a controlled substance and for possession of drug paraphernalia.

## Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Tuesday, 11-11-14 at 5:35 p.m., Officer Louis Jackson and Officer Garrett Larsen were dispatched to the unit block on Cypress Lane on a report of an assault that had just occurred. It was later relayed that a robbery had just occurred, and two suspects were running southbound through the Midway Village housing complex. The 14-year old victim said he has been constantly harassed in the neighborhood by a subject who called him names, chased him and threatened him. The victim said he was riding his bike back from the store when he was confronted by that subject and another subject. He said the two chased him and threatened him. The victim said the two were able to run up to him, and the second subject pushed him off the bike. The first subject grabbed his wallet and a bag of groceries he was holding. The victim said the subjects then ran away. Both subjects were identified, a 13-year old San Francisco resident and a 15-year old Pacifica resident. The second subject was arrested for robbery and conspiracy. Charges are pending against the first suspect. The victim was unharmed.

## Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

## Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between 4:30 p.m. on 11-14-14 and 8:30 a.m. on 11-17-14, two business offices on fifth floor of the business building at 455 Hickey Boulevard were burglarized by an unknown subject who pried open both entrance doors. There was no loss to one business. A computer, computer monitor and laptop was taken from the other business.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries and one attempted burglary during the past week.

- 100 block of Los Olivos Avenue—a radio was taken from a 2004 Lexus RX330. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 10:00 p.m. on 11-10-14 and 6:10 a.m. on 11-11-14.
- 900 Campus Drive Garage—DVD's, sunglasses, shoes, registration and insurance documents were taken from a 2012 Toyota Sienna. Entry was made via unknown means. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 11-13-14 and 9:00 a.m. on 11-14-14.
- Doelger Senior Center parking lot—a purse containing a cell phone and cash was taken from the passenger floorboard of a 2008 Honda Civic. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-14-14 between 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.
- Serramonte Shopping Center near Jamba Juice—several bags of clothing and a cell phone were taken from a 2003 Lincoln Aviator. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-14-14 between 6:59 p.m. and 7:04 p.m.

## Scams/Other

Between 11-14-14 and 11-15-14, restaurant owners on Mission Street reported that they received a call from someone claiming to work for PG&E who told them that the power was going to be shut off if payment wasn't made. The caller instructed the owners to obtain "Greendot MoneyPak

cards” to make payment. The loss was \$1,300. PG&E advises that they will never call and ask for payment via this method.

City offices, libraries, and community centers will be closed on Thursday, November 27 and Friday, November 28, in observance of the Thanksgiving holiday.
