



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Saturday, 11-22-14 at 4:20 a.m., Officer Karen Douglas conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle at Callan Boulevard near Southgate Avenue. She immediately smelled an odor of marijuana and asked for both the driver’s and passenger’s identification. The driver provided a California driver’s license, and the passenger said she didn’t have any identification on her. After giving two false names, the passenger eventually gave her correct name and date of birth. The passenger, a 25-year old Daly City resident, had two outstanding warrants—one for narcotics offenses and the other for elder abuse, fraud and forgery. She was arrested for the warrants, as well as for providing false information to a police officer.

On Sunday, 11-23-14 at 11:55 p.m., Officer Karen Douglas conducted a pedestrian stop at Mission Street and Hillcrest Drive on two subjects who crossed against the light. Prior to contacting the subjects, she saw them enter the Annex Bar on Mission Street. Officer Douglas said as she was driving near the bar, one subject exited, looked at her patrol vehicle and walked back into the bar. She said about five seconds later, he walked out of the bar again and proceeded to walk south on Mission Street. As Officer Douglas was talking to the subject, the bartender ran out of the establishment and told the officer that the subject just threw a small black plastic container on the ground. Officer Douglas opened it and saw a small bag containing a white crystalline substance that she suspected to be methamphetamine. The subject denied throwing the container, but the bartender said she saw the subject throw it on the floor. She said she kicked it, and a “joint” fell out of it. Officer Douglas placed the subject, a 45-year old South San Francisco resident, under arrest for possession of a controlled substance and for a probation violation.

On Thursday, 11-20-14 at 9:30 a.m., several officers were dispatched to Jefferson High School on a report of a student who bit a staff member and was being combative with medical personnel. Officers arrived to find the Daly City Fire Department providing medical attention to a student. They saw the student becoming combative and yelling obscenities. Upon hearing that she was

going to be transported to the hospital, the student remained combative. She was placed in restraints on a gurney to be transported to the hospital. The staff member said the student came into her office and said she was “high” and “scared” and then bit her on her shoulder as she was trying to take the subject’s pulse. There were no visible injuries, but the victim said she would go to the hospital for further evaluation.

There were nine people arrested for driving under the influence this past week.

## Robberies

There was one attempted robbery during the past week.

On Tuesday, 11-18-14 at 11:18 p.m., officers were dispatched to the unit block of Midvale Drive on a report of an attempted armed robbery. The victim, a 40-year old Daly City resident, said he had just left the bank and was driving back to his house when he was looking for a parking spot. He said he noticed a red Nissan Pathfinder drive by twice as he was parking. The victim said as he was opening his car door, he noticed a subject, described as a black male, 30-40 years old, 5’8”, skinny build with a white hood covering his head, standing at the rear of his vehicle. He said the subject then told him to give him all his money. He said it was dark, but it appeared the subject was holding a knife or a tool in his right hand, as he held it chest high in front of him. The victim said the subject again told him to give him his money. The victim said he was talking on the cell phone at the time and ran to the side of his house, through the backyard, and safely entered his house. The subject fled the area. There was no loss.

## Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

Between Friday, 11-21-14 and 11:30 p.m. and Saturday, 11-22-14 at 8:00 a.m., a residence under construction on the 300 block of Crocker Avenue was burglarized. The loss was tools. A trailer belonging to the construction company that was parked at the corner was also taken.

On Sunday, 11-23-14 between 11:45 a.m. and 6:50 p.m., an apartment on the 200 block of Lake Merced Boulevard was burglarized. An unknown subject entered the apartment via the rear kitchen window and took miscellaneous items.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries and two attempted vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 2400 block of Geneva Avenue—nothing was taken from a 2004 Nissan Xterra. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 8:40 p.m. on 11-17-14 and 3:58 a.m. on 11-18-14.
- Unit block of Northgate Avenue—a backpack and a wallet containing credit cards and identification was taken from inside the vehicle, and a bag containing clothing was taken

- from the trunk of a 1991 Honda Accord. The front passenger door was pried. Occurred between 7:30 p.m. on 11-17-14 and 7:30 a.m. on 11-18-14.
- Westlake Shopping Center in the Safeway parking lot—a wallet containing identification, credit cards and cash was taken from a 2010 Nissan Rogue. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-18-14 between 12:30 p.m. and 1:38 p.m.
  - 2600 block of Geneva Avenue—registration and insurance papers was taken from the glove box, and a bag containing clothing was taken from the trunk of a 2013 Toyota Corolla. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-18-14 between 7:40 a.m. on 11-18-14 and 9:40 p.m.
  - 2051 Junipero Serra Boulevard (3<sup>rd</sup> floor of parking lot)—a “sackpack” containing clothes, chargers, a Bluetooth speaker and dominos was taken from a 2011 Toyota Tundra. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-22-14 between 10:30 a.m. and 11:25 a.m.
  - 400 block of Eastmoor Avenue—nothing taken from a 2001 Mercedes ML320. The rear window and the right rear window was smashed. Occurred between 4:00 p.m. on 11-23-14 and 10:00 a.m. on 11-24-14.
  - Unit block of Wilshire Court—nothing taken from a 1980 GMC pickup. The method of entry is unknown. Two subjects were seen sitting inside the vehicle. Occurred on 11-17-14 at 10:15 p.m.
  - 600 block of South Hill Boulevard—nothing was taken from a 2010 Mercedes 350GLK. A witness saw a black Nissan pickup pull up next to the vehicle and a Hispanic male trying to pull the door before being scared away by a dog in the vehicle. Occurred on 11-21-14 at 9:30 a.m.

There was one stolen vehicle during the past week.

- Westlake Shopping Center garage near Ross Dress for Less—a 2003 BMW 325i. Occurred on 11-22-14 between 12:45 p.m. and 2:15 p.m.
