



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Monday, 11-24-14 at 6:30 a.m., Officer Tiffany Cook was dispatched to the unit block of San Miguel Avenue on a report of a domestic disturbance. The reporting party said her boyfriend was in the back yard of her residence and was attempting to gain entry into the upstairs window by using a ladder. Several other officers arrived and detained the subject. The subject said it was his house and that he was trying to get inside. The reporting party said her boyfriend was put out of the home a few days prior as he was abusing Xanax and his behavior was erratic. The 32-year old subject was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance and for possessing a controlled substance. (Xanax)

On Monday, 11-24-14, at 12:55 p.m., Officer Thomas Prudden was dispatched to Seton Hospital on a report of a subject who walked in with a stab wound. The victim, a 25-year old South San Francisco resident, said he was stabbed by an unknown subject. This occurred on the unit block of West Market Street. Coincidentally two detectives were near the area of the stabbing on Mission Street (prior to the report) and noticed two suspicious subjects who ran by them and possibly dumped something in a nearby dumpster. Acting on their suspicions after hearing the call of the stabbing, investigators were able to recover a bloody knife from the dumpster. They are working on leads to identify the suspect who stabbed the victim.

On Thursday, 11-27-14 at 9:58 p.m., Officer Cameron Newton was dispatched to the 500 block of Clarinada Avenue on a report of a noise in the parking lot. Officer Newton saw three subjects standing next to a truck, and one subject immediately put his hand in his pocket. Officer Newton told the subject to remove his hand from his pocket, and the subject failed to comply and turned his body away from him. The other two subjects ran away, and as Officer Newton was trying to detain the subject with handcuffs, the subject spun away and resisted the officer. The subject threw a folded dollar bill in the bed of the truck in the process of being detained. Officer Louis Jackson located the folded dollar bill and found a white crystal substance (suspected to be methamphetamine) inside the folded bill. The subject, a 26-year old Daly City resident, was

arrested for possession of a controlled substance, resisting arrest and for two outstanding warrants.

On Thursday, 11-27-14 at 11:14 p.m., Officer Nick Ottoboni was on patrol in the area of Hanover Street and Roosevelt Avenue when he saw a vehicle pull over and park on Hanover Street. He saw the driver rapidly exit the vehicle and appeared to be nervous as he was standing by his vehicle. Officer Ottoboni asked if he was waiting for someone, and he said he lived nearby. The dispatcher advised the officer that the subject had an outstanding warrant from the U.S. Marshall's Service, as well as one from the San Francisco Police Department. Other officers arrived to assist Officer Ottoboni. Officer Lucas Taylor and his K-9 partner conducted a sniff of the subject's vehicle, and the K-9 alerted his partner to check the air conditioning vents. Officer Taylor checked the vent and found a sock containing five individually wrapped bindles of a white, rock-like substance believed to be cocaine. The 33-year old Daly City resident was arrested for possession for sales of cocaine, transportation of cocaine and for the two warrants.

On Saturday, 11-29-14 at 2:39 p.m., Officer Keith Mattos was dispatched to the south parking garage at 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard on a report of a suspicious circumstance. The parking lot security guard reported that she observed a subject that resembled a subject who had broken into vehicles a week prior. The security guard provided identifying information of the subject, and Officer Mattos saw the described subject exiting the parking lot, carrying a small black backpack with a metal object, bolt cutters, sticking out of the unzipped portion. The subject appeared to be extremely nervous, was sweating and walking rapidly away from another officer who was in the parking lot. Officer Mattos stopped the subject who spontaneously said, "I didn't steal anything." From video surveillance footage, the subject was seen cutting a fence leading to the garage. The subject, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for burglary, attempted burglary and for carrying burglary tools.

## Robberies

There was one robbery and one attempted robbery during the past week.

On Sunday, 11-30-14 at 7:37 a.m., Officer Lee Aquila was dispatched to the Safeway at Westlake Shopping Center on a report of a woman who had her purse stolen. The 80-year old victim said she was pushing her cart to her vehicle when she observed an older dark colored sedan drive through the parking lot slowly and towards her vehicle. She said she opened her door, and then a subject got out of the back seat of that vehicle and said, "I got it, let's go". The victim said as the subject was trying to get back into the car, he fell down. The victim said she was unable to hold onto her purse. The officer accompanied the victim home to take the report, and the victim received a telephone call from someone in Alameda who found some of the contents of her purse. A couple of hours later, the Alameda County Sheriff's Office stopped a vehicle that contained several subjects, as well as the victim's identification. The two 15-year old male subjects from Hayward and Castro Valley who were stopped were arrested and booked into the Youth Services Center for robbery, conspiracy and for elder abuse. The two were also responsible for other robberies committed in San Francisco.

On Sunday, 11-30-14 at 6:07 p.m., TJ Maxx was the victim of an attempted robbery by two unknown subjects who grabbed five purses worth over \$950 and attempted to leave the store without paying for them. Both subjects tried to overpower the loss prevention employees on their way out of the store. The merchandise was recovered during the struggle. The subjects are unknown and were last seen running northbound on Lake Merced Boulevard.

## Residential Burglaries

There were three residential burglaries during the past week.

On Monday, 11-24-14 between 7:45 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., an apartment on the 500 block of Clarinada Avenue was burglarized. An unknown subject pried the front door to gain entry and took clothing, jewelry and cash.

On Friday, 11-28-14 between 8:40 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., a resident on the 400 block of Santa Barbara Avenue reported that an unknown subject entered the residence via an unknown means and took an unknown quantity of medication.

Between Saturday, 11-29-14 at 12:00 p.m. and Sunday, 11-30-14 at 2:00 a.m., a residence on the unit block of Bel Mar Avenue was burglarized. An unknown suspect entered the residence via an open kitchen window and took a bicycle, Apple MacBook Pro, tennis shoes and a purse.

- 200 block of Canyon Drive—an iPod Nano, cash and CD's were taken from a 2008 Nissan Frontier. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 11-24-14 between 4:50 a.m. and 7:20 a.m.
- Parking garage at 1851 Junipero Serra Boulevard (3<sup>rd</sup> floor)—two duffel bags containing ballet equipment were taken from a 2006 Honda Odyssey. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-24-14 between 12:00 p.m. and 3:15 p.m.
- Skyline Plaza parking lot near Porridge King Restaurant—a backpack containing clothing and office supplies was taken from a 2014 Honda CRV. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-24-14 between 2:00 p.m. and 2:41 p.m.

### **Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event, Saturday, 12-13-14**

San Mateo County residents can dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) at a no-cost special drop-off collection event at City Hall, 333-90<sup>th</sup> Street, Daly City on Saturday, December 13, 2014 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. Accepted items include: acids/bases, aerosol cans, automotive supplies (car batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid), cleaning products, fertilizers, pesticides, flammable liquids, fluorescent lights (compact and tubes), paint, inks, and photo chemicals. All waste collected is reused, recycled, or stabilized for proper disposal to achieve zero waste being landfilled. To participate, you must schedule an appointment at San Mateo County's HHW Program at [www.smchealth.org/hhw](http://www.smchealth.org/hhw) or by calling (650) 363-4718 and selecting option #3. No radioactive, explosive, medical or commercial waste is allowed.
