



Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

Two weeks ago, in the “notable cases” section, I mentioned a report of a 25-year old subject who walked into Seton Hospital on 11-24-14 with a stab wound. Since that day, investigators had been avidly working on a lead to find the suspect. During the course of the investigation, an arrest warrant was obtained for a suspect. On 12-16-14, with the help of the U.S. Marshall’s Service, the subject, a 21-year old Daly City resident, was arrested. Also arrested in this case was a 19-year old Daly City resident who was with the subject during the stabbing and had been helping him evade arrest, acting as an accessory to the crime. At the time of his arrest, he had a firearm in his waistband and 15 grams of cocaine in his possession.

On Thursday, 12-18-14, just before noon, an armed robbery occurred at the TJ Maxx store at Westlake Shopping Center. The loss prevention officer confronted a male and a female outside the store after they committed a fraud, the female produced a knife and stabbed the loss prevention officer in the hand. The two subjects then fled in a silver Buick sedan. Officers were able to identify the two suspects—21-year old Shakia Vanderbilt and 20-year old Marcells Eubanks, both from Oakland. A few days later, the Daly City Police Department Crime Suppression Unit was able to track them both down in San Francisco. Vanderbilt was taken into custody, and a short pursuit ensued after Eubanks refused to stop the car he was driving. Officers terminated the pursuit, but Eubanks and his vehicle were located a short time later in Oakland. Officers found a .40 caliber handgun inside of the car he was driving. Both Vanderbilt and Eubanks were booked into the San Mateo County Jail for assault with a deadly weapon, robbery, burglary and illegal possession of a firearm.

On Thursday, 12-18-14 at 10:27 p.m., Officer Rodney Chittenden was on patrol in the area of Mission Street and Bepler Street when he saw a male who was standing on the sidewalk and wielding a samurai sword. Officer Chittenden saw a female in front of the subject and thought the subject was going to attack her with the sword. When the subject saw the officer, he re-sheathed the sword and threw it in his trunk. The subject, a 31-year old Daly City resident, said he was just

playing with the sword he bought from Chinatown, and he didn't want to keep the sword in his trunk. He was cited and released for brandishing a deadly weapon in public.

On Sunday, 12-21-14 at 1:14 p.m., Officer Nicholas McCarthy was dispatched to the intersection of Mission Street and Rice Street on a report of a male subject hitting another male subject with a metal baseball bat. The victim, a 50-year old Daly City resident, said he was trying to cross Mission Street using the crosswalk when he was almost hit by a vehicle that almost backed into him. The victim said, "Hey watch out", and the driver told the victim that he saw him. The victim said that he would call the police should the man choose to hit him. The victim said the driver parked his vehicle and walked into a nearby restaurant. The victim said as he was getting into his vehicle, the subject walked out of the restaurant and went to his vehicle, grabbed a metal baseball bat and swung it, hitting the driver's side window of his vehicle and shattering it. The victim said the suspect then got into his vehicle and sped down Rice Street. The victim sustained an abrasion to the left side of his head. This investigation is continuing.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There were no residential burglaries during the past week.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, 12-16-14, to 1:30 p.m. on Friday, 12-19-14, a lock was cut to a storage locker at the Public Storage facility on King Drive. There was no loss.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were four vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 200 block of Skyline Drive—two purses containing miscellaneous items were taken from a 2014 GMC Yukon. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 12-15-14 between 7:20 a.m. and 8:05 a.m.
- 500 block of King Drive—grocery bags were taken from a 1999 Toyota Minivan. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-15-14 between 2:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- 50 Hyde Court (parking lot)—loose change was taken from a 2006 Toyota Sienna. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-15-14 between 7:40 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- 870 Campus Drive (parking lot)—a laptop bag containing an Apple laptop, watch and two bags of groceries were taken from a 2009 Toyota Camry. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-21-14 between 1:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.
