When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 08-17-15 at 12:03 a.m., officers were dispatched to the **McDonald’s** restaurant on **Geneva Avenue** on a report of a robbery via a firearm. Employees were closing for the night, and a subject pointed a gun at an employee and demanded money. Two employees tried to open the safe but couldn’t due to being under stress. The suspect became angry and hit one employee twice in the head with the bottom of the firearm. The suspect was able to obtain money and then fled southbound on Acacia Street. He was described as a black male, approximately 40 years old, 6’1”, 200 lbs., wearing a green beanie, red bandana over his face, glasses, blue hospital gloves on his hands, green jacket, gray sweater, dirty blue jeans and white “hospital shoe coverings” over both of his shoes. The subject also had a deep voice and “large stomach”.

On Wednesday, 08-19-15, at 7:05 p.m., Officer Jose Ortega and Officer Brandon Scholes were dispatched to **Mission Plaza** on a report of a subject who was “shoulder surfing” at the ATM, walking back and forth to a vehicle. The reporting party gave a description of the subject and the vehicle. Officers located the vehicle and smelled an odor of marijuana when they approached it. Officers contacted the subject who was reported as the “shoulder surfer”, as well as a female in the driver’s seat and a male who was standing outside the vehicle. The female in the driver’s seat, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, was on probation and subject to search and seizure. The officers searched the vehicle and found a purse with a lining made out of cardboard and aluminum foil. (This type of purse is commonly used to steal merchandise from stores.) Officers asked the subject who the bag belonged to, and the subject said it was hers. They also found eight cans of baby formula and various articles of clothing with sensor tags still on them. The subject admitted to stealing the items and was arrested. The other subject, a 21-year old San Francisco resident, reported as the “shoulder surfer”, said she was depositing a check for her

mother and wanted to make sure the money was deposited. Officers called the subject's mother who said she did not give her daughter a check to deposit.

On Thursday, 08-20-15 at 1:29 a.m., Officer Ben Wagon was advised by a police assistant that he was flagged down by a resident who told him two subjects were walking with flashlights on the 200 block of **Los Olivos Avenue** looking into parked vehicles. Officer Wagon saw the two subjects who were standing next to a vehicle in the area, just over the border of Daly City and in San Francisco, and there was glass on the ground next to the vehicle. The officer called out to the subjects who then started walking fast and away from the officers. The subjects, both 17-year old San Francisco residents, were arrested for auto burglary, possession of burglary tools, and conspiracy and were booked into the San Mateo County Youth Services Center.

On Thursday, 08-20-15 at approximately 3:05 p.m., two 25-year old males, a Daly City and Brisbane residents, were the victims of an assault with a deadly weapon via firearm while driving in the area of **Geneva Avenue** and **Bayshore Boulevard**. This was apparently due to a "road rage" incident which started in the area of Tunnel and Southbound Bayshore Boulevard. The victims were unharmed. The suspect was described as a black male, early 20's, possibly wearing a dark colored hooded sweatshirt. The suspect vehicle is described as a "beat up" dark four door sedan, possibly a Honda Accord. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 08-20-15 at 5:56 p.m., Sergeant Matt Fox was driving in the area of **Geneva Avenue** and **Talbert Street** and saw two subjects on motorcycles traveling on the roadway and the sidewalk. One subject was wearing a helmet and riding a dirt bike on the sidewalk and the other subject was pushing his bike. Sgt. Fox attempted to make contact with the first subject, but the subject ran from him. Sgt. Fox was able to catch up to the subject who then started to struggle with the officer's commands to stop. Sgt. Fox then saw that the other subject was running towards his unattended vehicle and radioed for assistance. The first subject did not have a driver's license and told the officer he ran because he "panicked." The subject, a 19-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for resisting arrest and for driving without a driver's license. The other subject, a 25-year old Richmond resident, was released.

On Friday, 08-21-15 at 3:51 p.m., officers were dispatched to the **John F. Kennedy Elementary School** on **Price Street** on a report of a man who hopped over the fence and was on school grounds. There were no children on the school grounds as there was a "lockdown" until officers arrived. The officers found the subject on the baseball field and determined he was under the influence of a controlled substance. The subject, a 26-year old transient, was arrested for trespassing, possession of marijuana on a school campus, possession of a controlled substance without a prescription, and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Saturday, 08-22-15 at 3:50 p.m., officers from the "Crime Suppression Unit" stopped a vehicle for expired registration on the 100 block of **First Avenue**. Officers noticed the driver moving around in his vehicle, leaning towards the center console area, as they approached the driver. The driver had a suspended license, and officers saw a prescription bottle not belonging to him on the floorboard of the vehicle. The officers then checked the area where the subject was leaning towards and found various medicine tablets placed under the gear shift knob. The subject also had an unusual amount of money in several denominations on his person—indicative of drug sales. Officers arrested the 38-year old Hayward resident for possession of a controlled substance for sales, transportation for sales, destroy or conceal evidence, and for driving with a suspended driver's license.

On Saturday, 08-22-15 at 4:05 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 700 block of **Skyline Drive** on a report of a person on a hang glider who landed in live power lines. The hang glider lost control and was hanging from the top wire of an electrical pole when officers arrived. The 28-year old resident was safely extricated by the fire department and treated by paramedics and then transported to the hospital for treatment for non-life threatening injuries.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 08-17-15 between 7:55 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. and then again on Wednesday, 08-19-15 during the same time frame, a resident on the unit block of **Midway Court** reported that an unknown suspect entered the residence via an unknown means and took food and clothing.

On Sunday, 08-23-15 between 5:15 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., an unknown subject entered a residence on the 400 block of **Lakeshire Drive** via an unsecured front door and pried open a gun locker. The loss was rifles and shotguns. The investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 08-21-15 between 11:15 a.m. and 12:45 a.m., a residence on the 700 block of **Gellert Boulevard** was the victim of an attempted residential burglary. An unknown suspect broke a side window and attempted to pry open a window and a sliding glass door in the rear. No entry was made.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between Monday 08-17-15 at 7:30 a.m. and Thursday, 08-20-15 at 3:40 p.m., a storage locker at the **Public Storage** facility on **King Drive** was burglarized. The unknown suspect forced open the locking mechanism and took over \$3,000 worth of tools.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were eleven vehicle burglaries and one attempted vehicle burglary during the past week.

- 400 block of **Oriente Street**—a cell phone was taken from a 2012 Toyota Prius. Entry made via unknown means. Occurred on 08-18-15 between 10:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. **On-line report.
- **Kukje Supermarket** parking lot—an iPhone was taken from the top of the center console of a 2009 Mercedes ML320. The left front window was smashed. Occurred on 08-19-15 between 7:00 p.m. and 7:55 p.m.
- **Koi Palace** parking lot—nothing was taken from a 2015 Toyota Highlander. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-19-15 between 6:30 p.m. and 7:10 p.m.
- **Westlake Avenue/Miriam Street**—coins, two duffel bags—one containing a portable DVD player and the other containing miscellaneous DVD's were taken from a 1996 Toyota Camry. The left front window was smashed. Occurred between 5:00 p.m. on 08-19-15 and 4:06 a.m. on 8-20-15.
- **McDonald's** parking lot on **Junipero Serra Boulevard**—a purse containing makeup and miscellaneous items was taken from the passenger seat of a 1996 Toyota Tercel. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-20-15 between 2:00 p.m. and 2:05 p.m.
- **Party City** (rear parking lot)—a backpack containing schoolwork, iPhone charger, and a wallet containing cash and identification was taken from the passenger of a 2003

Chevrolet 2500HD. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 08-20-15 between 2:30 p.m. and 3:25 p.m.

- **Party City** (rear parking lot)—a backpack containing a wallet and miscellaneous clothing was taken from the rear passenger seat of a 2005 Infiniti FX35. A window was smashed. Occurred on 08-20-15 between 2:30 p.m. and 3:25 p.m.
- **Cow Palace** parking lot—three bags of “Ocean fertilizer”, jewelry, two bags of clothing, and a Coach purse containing a Coach wallet, identification, credit cards, checkbook and iPad were taken from a 2015 Toyota Tundra. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 08-21-15 between 1:25 p.m. and 1:35 p.m.
- **Planet Fitness** parking lot—a wallet containing debit and credit cards was taken from the trunk of a 2013 Ford Focus. The unknown suspect entered the vehicle using keys that were taken from an unsecured locker at the facility. Occurred on 08-21-15 between 6:10 p.m. and 7:20 p.m. **transactions were made on credit cards immediately after the theft.
- **Doelger Center** parking lot—a backpack containing a laptop, organizers, credit cards and keys was taken from a 2013 Audi 7. The rear tailgate window was smashed. Occurred on 08-21-15 at 7:30 p.m.
- 900 block of **South Mayfair Avenue**—three pairs of Coach sunglasses were taken from a 2006 GMC Yukon. The driver’s side door handle was pried. Occurred between 10:30 p.m. on 08-22-15 and 11:15 a.m. on 08-23-15.
- **In N Out** parking lot—nothing was taken from a 2012 Nissan Murano. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-17-15 between 7:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.
