



Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 09-29-15 at 9:50 a.m., San Mateo County probation officers requested our assistance in joining them in arresting one of their probationers who lived on the 4300 block of **Callan Boulevard**. The probation officers said the subject, a 28-year old Daly City resident, had failed to report to the probation officers multiple times. One of the officers went to the backyard and looked through a window and saw a rifle resembling an AR-15 located on a shelf, along with a high capacity AR-15 magazine. Due to this rifle being in plain view, the probation officer asked us to make entry into the residence. Officers entered the house and saw a subject on the bed. The subject said he was the subject’s brother, and that the subject was not home. Officers found the subject hiding in a closet. He was arrested for a probation violation, obstructing/delaying a police investigation and possession of less than one ounce of marijuana. His 22-year old brother was arrested for delaying and obstructing a police investigation. Officers confiscated the weapon, an air-soft rifle.

On Tuesday, 09-29-15 at 2:35 p.m., Officer David Pires and Officer Lee Magalong were dispatched to the McDonald’s restaurant on **Geneva Avenue** on a report of two males fighting. While officers were enroute, they were redirected to the KFC across the street. The officers arrived and found a male and female who were both hit in the face with pepper spray. The female said she was in the restroom when someone started banging on the door. The female heard her boyfriend trying to tell the subject that his girlfriend was in the restroom, and she heard them exchanging words. The subjects said as they were leaving the parking lot, the subject, described as an unknown race male, 25-years, 5-1, 190-200 lbs., curly black hair, gray shirt and shorts who spoke with a Middle Eastern Accent, sprayed them with pepper spray. The victims, both San Francisco residents in their 50’s, refused medical treatment.

On Wednesday, 09-30-15 at 2:57 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Bank of America ATM on **Mission Street** on a report of a subject sitting in a vehicle near the ATM. The reporting party said the subject kept going up to the ATM after a customer finished a transaction. (This type of activity is known as "shoulder surfing" in which a subject from afar watches the person at the ATM in order to obtain the PIN codes and then try to retrieve money if the person doesn't completely sign off the transaction.) Officers were able to view the subject conducting this activity. The officers arrested the subject, a 23-year old Fairfield resident, for three counts of identity theft and conspiracy. The other subject who was with him, a 24-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for one count of attempted identity theft and conspiracy.

On Wednesday, 09-30-15 at 4:18 p.m., Officer Korey Sprader stopped a vehicle on the 500 block of **Verducci Drive**. The driver was just leaving a residence where a subject on probation for narcotics lives. The driver said he did not live at the house and admitted to having a suspended driver's license. The passenger admitted he was on probation but said he no longer lived at the residence. The officer asked the passenger if the subject who was on probation was inside the residence, and the subject said he didn't know who that person was. The officer searched the passenger and found keys and a backpack containing a small amount of methamphetamine and a glass pipe. The officer asked the subject if the keys were to the residence, and the subject said no. Other officers arrived to conduct a probation search of the residence, and they used the keys to unlock the front door. In one of the bedrooms, the officer found pictures of the passenger and plastic baggies, a scale and methamphetamine. The resident who the passenger claimed to not know was in the backyard of the residence. (This resident had a "no bail" warrant from the California Department of Corrections). The passenger, a 33-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for harboring a fugitive, being in possession of suspected opiates for the purpose of sale, being in possession of suspected methamphetamine for the purpose of sale and for being in possession of narcotics paraphernalia. The other subject, the 23-year old resident, was arrested for the outstanding warrant.

On Thursday, 10-01-15 at 1:43 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of the 500 block of **San Diego Avenue** on a report of approximately five possible gun shots heard in the area. The reporting party said the shots came from the direction of **Marchbanks Park**. Officers checked the area and found no shell casings.

On Friday, 10-02-15 at 2:13 p.m., officers were dispatched to **Lakeshire Drive** and **San Juan Avenue** on a report of an argument between neighbors and that one of the neighbors had a gun. A 32-year old male Daly City resident was arrested for brandishing a firearm, threats, and for being a felon in possession of a firearm. No one was harmed.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week. An arrest was made in one case.

On Wednesday, 09-30-15 at 8:23 p.m., a subject walked into the Arco Gas Station on **Washington Street**, pointed a gun at the employee and demanded money from the register. The subject was described as a black male in his 30's, slender build, wearing a white or tan beanie, a black jacket or trench coat and dark jeans. The subject was last seen walking northeast through the gas station parking lot towards Washington Avenue.

On Thursday, 10-01-15 at 10:33 p.m., a 21-year old Daly City resident was walking from the BART station, **crossing Lake Merced Boulevard** and approaching **Southgate Avenue** when she heard footsteps running behind her. She said an unknown subject grabbed her bag off her shoulder and pushed her to the ground. The victim tried to run after the suspect, but he ran into the rear of the apartments on the 300 block of Lake Merced Boulevard. The purse contained cash and credit/debit cards. The subject used the cards a couple of hours later at a nearby gas station. Investigators were able to determine the identity of the suspect from video surveillance and witness statements. The suspect, a 23-year old Daly City resident, was arrested the next day for robbery, unauthorized use of credit cards, use of access card without consent, and burglary.

Residential Burglaries

There two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Tuesday, 09-29-15 at 11:27 p.m., officers were dispatched to an interrupted residential burglary to a residence on the 100 block of **Hampshire Avenue**. The resident reported hearing a knocking type sound and thought it was his neighbors. He walked to towards his front door and saw the light flicker on and off. As he opened the door, he heard an unknown subject run out of the house. Entry was made via a rear sliding glass door. This case was forwarded to investigators.

Between Monday, 09-27-15 at 10:00 a.m. to Thursday, 10-01-15 at 11:00 a.m., a residence on the unit block of **Morton Drive** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who forced a rear sliding garage window. The loss is to be determined.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week. Three subjects were arrested.

On Sunday, 10-04-15 at 4:56 p.m., four subjects took over \$1,000 worth of handbags from the **Macy's** store. When the store employee tried to stop the subjects, she was sprayed in the face with pepper spray. Three subjects (two 18-year olds from Oakland and one 20-year old from Oakland) were subsequently arrested, and one (a 17-year old from Pittsburg) was released to a family member. The store employee required medical attention.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were four vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- Unit block of **Elmwood Drive**—a backpack, lunchbox and medication was taken from a 1999 Lexus RX. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 09-28-15 between 3:06 p.m. and 3:11 p.m.
- Parking lot of **Our Lady of Mercy Church**—a backpack containing clothing and miscellaneous items was taken from a 2009 Toyota Camry. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 09-28-15 at 3:09 p.m.
- Unit block of **Mateo Avenue**—nothing was taken from a 2007 Chevrolet Silverado. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 09-28-15 and 6:30 a.m. on 09-29-15.
- 700 block of **Skyline Drive**—miscellaneous documents and men's cologne was taken from a 2001 Mazda 626. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 11:45 p.m. on 09-30-15 and 09:45 a.m. on 10-01-15.

Stolen Vehicles

There were two vehicles stolen during the past week. Both were recovered.

- **Lowell Street/Hanover Street**—a 1997 Honda Accord. Occurred between 11:00 a.m. on 09-29-15 and 6:30 a.m. on 09-30-15. **Recovered by Daly City P.D. on 09-30-15.
- **Castle Street/Mission Street**—a 1995 Acura Integra. Occurred between 11:00 p.m. on 10-03-15 and 1:00 a.m. on 10-04-15. **Recovered by San Francisco P.D. on 10-04-15.

Scams/Other

Jury Duty Scam

The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office is issuing a warning to the public to be aware of phone calls from individuals claiming to represent themselves as a member of the Sheriff's Office in an effort to defraud them. The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office said a number of people have received unsolicited phone calls from an individual claiming to be a Deputy Sheriff or Sheriff's Lieutenant. The caller goes on to say that the person receiving the call must pay fees for failure to appear for jury duty. The caller/imposter instructs the person to pay the fees by purchasing a pre-paid "Green dot card" or be subjected to arrest. The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office or any law enforcement agency will NEVER contact a member of the public demanding payment for fees and/or fines and be subjected to arrest if compliance isn't made. Please do NOT fall prey to this scam!
