



Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 07-04-16 at 5:15 p.m., officers were dispatched to the **Outback Steakhouse** restaurant on a report of two female subjects attempting to make a fraudulent purchase of \$2,000 worth of Outback Steakhouse gift cards using an out of state identification card and debit card. The manager provided the officers with an e-mail sent to several Outback Steakhouse locations that the restaurant chain has been the victim of gift card fraud recently by two female subjects using fake identification and debit cards. The e-mail described the card used to pay for the gift cards, and the same card matched the description the subjects possessed. The subjects initially gave false identifying information to the officers and conflicting statements about the debit card they possessed. The subjects, 22 and 23 year olds from Florida, were arrested for possession of another identification not belonging to them, possession of stolen property, conspiracy to commit a crime, possession of a driver's license to commit forgery and for commercial burglary.

On Tuesday, 07-05-16 at 5:30 p.m., Officer Randy Ortiz was dispatched to the **Target** store on the report of a male subject who was being detained for exposing himself to a child. The reporting party said the mother and child left the store and did not want to press charges. Officer Ortiz arrived and saw the subject, a 19-year old San Francisco resident, sitting on a bench. The subject had a large rip that stretched from his belt line to the lower part of his right quadriceps, exposing his genitals through the rip. Store security advised the subject was in the store the day before and was wearing the same clothes. Five other people reported they were disgusted and uncomfortable seeing the subject walking around the store exposing himself. Officer Ortiz arrested the subject for indecent exposure and for a no bail warrant from San Francisco.

On Wednesday, 07-06-16 between 6:00 a.m. and 9:03 a.m., a residence on the 900 block of **Skyline Drive** was burglarized. The suspects took jewelry, cash, electronics and a telescope. Officers took a burglary report at 1:30 p.m. when the homeowner called saying his house was ransacked. While the officers were taking inventory of what was stolen, Officer Castillo remembered seeing a telescope in a vehicle that was involved in a traffic collision at 9:03 that morning in Daly City. Investigators determined the subjects involved in the traffic collision were the ones who burglarized the house—they were in possession of some of the victim's stolen property. The two subjects, a 20-year old San

Francisco resident and a 28-year old Pacifica resident, were arrested for burglary and for outstanding warrants.

On Saturday, 07-09-16 at approximately 4:46 a.m., officers were dispatched to the **Walgreen's** store at **Westlake Shopping Center** on a report of a victim who tracked his stolen phone to the store. The victim said he was robbed in San Francisco earlier that night and that he would be able to describe the suspect as well as the vehicle the suspect drove. Officers saw three subjects entering the vehicle and contacted the subjects. The victim positively identified the suspect who robbed him, and officers found in the vehicle the victim's credit cards that were stolen. The suspect who robbed the victim was implicated in three other robberies in San Francisco and was interviewed by a San Francisco Police sergeant. That subject, a 39-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for identify theft, burglary, conspiracy to commit a crime and for driving with a suspended license. One of other subjects, a 21-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for receiving stolen property, and the other subject, also a 21-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for conspiracy to commit a crime, misappropriation of property and for possession of a controlled substance (hydrocodone).

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Wednesday, 07-06-16 between 6:00 a.m. and 9:03 a.m., a residence on the 900 block of **Skyline Drive** was burglarized. The suspects entered via smashing the front door and took jewelry, cash, electronics and a telescope. Officers took a burglary report at 1:30 p.m. when the homeowner called saying his house was ransacked. While the officers were taking inventory of what was stolen, Officer Castillo remembered seeing a telescope in a vehicle that was involved in a traffic collision at earlier that morning in Daly City. The two subjects, a 20-year old San Francisco resident and a 28-year old Pacifica resident, were arrested for burglary and for outstanding warrants.

On Sunday, 07-10-16 between 3:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m., an apartment on the 400 block of **91st Street** was the victim of an attempted burglary by an unknown subject who attempted to force open the front door and the door leading into the garage area. No entry was made.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between Sunday, 07-03-16 at approximately 7:00 a.m. and Monday, 07-04-16 at approximately 7:30 p.m., an unknown subject burglarized a storage locker in the underground parking garage on the 200 block of **Coronado Avenue**. The loss was four Dolce brand vehicle rims and tires and other vehicle parts.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 100 block of **Canterbury Avenue**—tools were taken from the toolbox of a 2016 Ford F250. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 07-03-16 at 2:00 p.m. and 7/4/16 at 7:30 a.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot (near JC Penney)—a backpack containing clothing was taken from a 2016 Ford Flex. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-05-16 between 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.
- **Round Table** parking lot—a gym bag containing make-up, a jacket and work I.D. was taken from a 2015 Toyota Corolla. Occurred on 07-09-16 between 9:00 p.m. and 9:05 p.m.
- Unit block of **Acton Street**—a bowling bag containing two bowling balls was taken from a 2003 Ford Expedition. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-10-16 between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. The bag was found a short distance from the vehicle.
- 15 **Poncetta Drive** (garage)—photography equipment was taken from a 2012 Kia Soul. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 07-10-16 and 7:00 a.m. on 07-11-16.
- **2nd Avenue/Castle Street**—nothing was taken from a 2005 Dodge Ram. The rear sliding glass window was smashed. Occurred between 8:30 p.m. on 07-08-16 and 7:40 a.m. on 07-09-16.
