When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 07-13-16 at approximately 5:37 p.m., Officer Brandon Scholes was on patrol in the area of **Washington Street** and **Hill Street** and saw a vehicle that was reported stolen earlier in the day. The vehicle entered northbound Highway 280, and the officer followed it, waiting for another officer to arrive. The officer activated his emergency lighting equipment and siren and pulled over the vehicle. The officers commanded the occupants get out of the car. The officers searched the driver and found had a shaved piece of metal wrapped up in tape inside his pants pocket, as well as methamphetamine. Officers asked the passenger if she had anything illegal in her possession, and she said she had a pipe (referring to a pipe used to smoke crystal methamphetamine) in her purse. In addition to the pipes, officers also found a VIN plate from another vehicle and shaved down keys—typically used to bypass ignition systems on vehicles. The driver, a 36-year old Pinole resident, was arrested for vehicle theft, possession of a stolen vehicle, vehicle theft with a prior conviction, possession of burglary tools (shaved keys) and for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). The passenger, a 35-year old San Pablo resident, was cited for possession of burglary tools (shaved keys) and for possession of drug paraphernalia (glass pipes.)

On Saturday, 07-16-16 at 9:08 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 400 block of **Southgate Avenue** on a report of a male subject sleeping in the reporting party’s vehicle. Officers woke up the subject, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, and they smelled an odor of alcohol emitting from his breath. The officers asked the subject if they could search him, and the subject consented. The officers found a black push-start vehicle ignition in his pocket, along with a pair of Kate Spade sunglasses. After determining no crime was committed, the officer drove the subject to his residence in San Francisco and asked the subject if he could keep the vehicle ignition that was in his pocket. A short time later, officers were dispatched to a report of an auto burglary on the unit block of **Elmwood Drive** in which a vehicle ignition was taken from a 2013 Lexus. The officer determined the ignition the subject had in his possession was the one that was stolen from the Lexus. Officers went back to the subject’s residence and arrested him for burglary, attempted auto theft and tampering with a vehicle.

On Thursday, 07-14-16 at 2:25 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **Junipero Serra Boulevard** and **92nd Street** on the report of a male subject who was discarding items into the bushes.

Officers contacted the subject who became excited, agitated and yelled at the officers. The subject, a 42-year old Broadmoor resident, was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Thursday, 07-14-16 at 1:15 p.m., officers were dispatched to an apartment on the 800 block of **Hillside Boulevard** on the report of a possible home invasion robbery. The 23-year old resident said he was asleep with two male subjects broke into his home, forced open his bedroom door and pointed firearms at him. The victim said the subjects held him at gunpoint and rummaged through his drawers and stole property including his hover board, tablet, wristwatch and cell phone. The victim said his 21-year old roommate's shoes were stolen. The victim recognized one subject from his "Snapchat" account. The officer asked the victim if there was a reason why he would have been targeted, and the victim said he didn't know. The officer asked the victim if he was selling drugs, and the victim admitted to selling ecstasy. Investigators were able to identify the suspects via the "Snapchat" account and other investigative measures. Subsequently, both subjects, 20 and 23-year old San Francisco residents, were arrested for burglary, robbery, conspiracy, assault with a deadly weapon, carrying a concealed weapon in a vehicle, carrying a loaded firearm with the intent to commit a crime, and for possession of an unregistered gun with ammo.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

On Wednesday, 07-13-16 between 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., a residence on the 200 block of **Ardendale Drive** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who forced entry into the front door and took jewelry and electronic items.

On Saturday, 07-17-16 at 12:41 a.m., officers were dispatched to the 400 block of **John Daly Boulevard** on a report of residents who woke up to an unknown female in their home who fled in an unknown direction. The female entered the residence via an open kitchen window and was described as being white, European, 5'8" to 6' tall, very skinny, either blonde or brown hair, wearing a green and brown plaid pea coat and was all wet from taking a shower with her clothes on. The loss was a cooking pot and a bag containing a baby carriage. These items were found nearby the residence. Officers were unable to locate the female.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 07-14-16 at 11:50 a.m., three unknown female suspects walked into a market on the 300 block of **East Market Street** and stole a purse near the cash register. Vehicle Burglaries

There were three vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Buffalo Wild Wings—a backpack and suitcase containing clothing was taken from a 2012 Nissan Versa. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 07-15-16 between 7:15 p.m. and 7:45 p.m.
- Unit block of **Elmwood Drive**—an ignition and Kate Spade sunglasses was taken from a 2013 Lexus ES350. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 07-16-16 between 7:00 p.m. and 9:08 p.m. An arrest was made in this case.

Scams/Other

Jury Duty Scam

The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office has issued a warning to the public to beware of phone calls from individuals claiming to represent themselves as members of the Sheriff's Office in an effort to defraud them. In this scam, a number of people have recently received unsolicited phone calls from an individual who fraudulently claims to be a sworn member of the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office who told them they must pay fees for failure to appear for jury duty. The caller instructs the victim to pay the fees by purchasing a pre-paid "green dot card" or be subject to arrest. The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office wants you to know that they, nor another law enforcement agency, will never contact you a member of the public demanding fees be paid or threaten arrest for failure to comply. On Friday, 07-15-16, a 65-year old Daly City resident was the victim of this very same scam and went so far as to purchase a green dot money card for \$867.00 before she was alerted by the employee that this could be a scam.
