When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 07-25-16 at 2:20 a.m., officers were dispatched to the unit block of **Garibaldi Street** on a report of a possible DUI collision. The reporting party said a male subject was attempting to drive away from the collision after hitting two parked vehicles. Officers contacted the subject and smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath and person. They conducted field sobriety tests and determined the subject, a 37-year old San Francisco resident, was under the influence of alcohol. The subject was arrested for driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and for driving on a suspended license.

On Wednesday, 07-27-16 at 1:40 p.m., officers were dispatched to the City of Daly City corporation yard on **Niantic Street** on a report of a subject creating a disturbance with city employees by yelling at them. The subject who was causing a disturbance said he received a parking ticket in Daly City and felt it was unjust, given the street construction in the area. Officers cited the 36-year old male from Temecula for disturbing the peace.

On Friday, 07-29-16 at 8:10 p.m., Officer Tualalelei contacted a subject sitting on the curb on the 100 block of **Hillside Boulevard**. The subject, a 36-year old transient, was on parole and the officer asked the subject if he had any weapons or anything illegal on his person. The subject said “no”, and the officer said that when the subject got up to throw away a cigarette butt into a receptacle, he heard the sound of a weighted object drop. The officer checked the receptacle and found a clear glass pipe. The officer asked the subject why he dumped the pipe, and the suspect said he didn’t want to get arrested for it. The officer searched the subject and found a small clear plastic Ziploc baggie containing a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine. Officer Chittenden arrived to assist and checked the subject’s backpack and found a plastic rod with a handle—altered to be used as a baton. The subject was then arrested for being in possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a baton, and for a parole violation.

Robberies

There were three robberies and two attempted robberies during the past week.

On Friday, 07-29-16 at 9:35 p.m., officers were dispatched to the **Smart and Final** store on a report of a suspect who had threatened to kill an employee when being confronted about a theft. The suspect was not at the store when officers arrived, but with the description that the employee provided, the officers found the suspect near the store. The suspect, a 35-year old Oakland resident, was subsequently arrested for robbery and criminal threats. The 31-year old employee was unharmed.

On Sunday, 07-31-16 at 9:30 a.m., officers were dispatched to the CVS Pharmacy on **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of an in-progress robbery via knife. Two employees reported seeing two subjects shoplifting items, and when they confronted the suspects, a scuffle ensued. One suspect, a female adult, grabbed the 46-year old female employee by her hair, pulling her towards the main entrance of the store. The employee punched the suspect in the stomach, and the suspect released her grip on her hair. The other suspect, a male adult, became irate and said, "You're going to get shot" and brandished a knife from his pocket at the 33-year old male employee. The suspects then left with the merchandise in a black Dodge Charger. The male employee was able to take a photo of the vehicle. Later that afternoon, San Francisco P.D. stopped the vehicle and the suspects, a 25-year old male and 28-year old female from San Francisco, were in the vehicle. They were subsequently arrested for this crime.

On Sunday, 07-31-16 at 9:04 p.m., a 56-year old **Dollar Tree** employee was the victim of robbery via firearm by an unknown suspect. The employee confronted the suspect, described as a black male adult, 6'2", thin build, dark eyes, swollen lips, wearing a tan fishing hat, dark brown jacket and blue jeans, for concealing items inside of his personal pull-cart. The employee said the suspect then removed a small silver/metallic semi-automatic handgun from his right jacket pocket and pointed it at her. The suspect was last seen exiting the store with the unpaid items, fleeing on foot westbound on Geneva Avenue.

On Monday, 07-26-16 at 3:41 p.m., a 57-year old Daly City resident said he was listening to music with his ear buds when he was walking home on the 100 block of **MacDonald Avenue** when he felt an unknown suspect wrap his right arm across his chest from behind him. The victim managed to break free from the suspect's grip, and the suspect grabbed his backpack. The victim was able to get the backpack back and ran into the street, noticing another suspect standing there watching. The victim said he looked back and saw the first suspect pull out a black handgun from his right pocket and pointed it at him as he ran eastbound in the street and up to his house. When the suspects realized the victim lived there, they ran eastbound on MacDonald Avenue and turned southbound on Allan Street towards Geneva Avenue. The victim described the first suspect as a black male, early 20's, 6'0", light skinned, thin build, wearing a black pullover hoodie with the hood over his head and blue jeans. The victim described the second suspect as a black male, early 20's, 6'0", thin build, wearing a gray pullover hoodie with the hood over his head and blue jeans. Officers could not locate the suspects.

On Thursday, 07-28-16 at 1:48 a.m., a 36-year old Daly City resident was the victim of an attempted robbery by three unknown suspects who punched him several times on the face and head. This occurred on a Sam Trans bus in the area of **Mission Street** and **Como Avenue**. The subjects were last seen fleeing the area in a light gray newer model Toyota Camry northbound on Mission Street. Below are photos of the suspects.
