When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 08-29-16 at 11:14 a.m., officers were dispatched to a retirement home on a report of a verbal argument between two staff members and a patient’s relative. The Administrator said she advised a family member that her mother-in-law was being moved to a different room. The staff member said the family member became irate. Another staff member, the Director of Community Relations, tried to talk to the family member. When the Administrator attempted to leave the office, the family member pushed her by the shoulders and up against the wall. The family member then blocked the entrance to the office by using her body and a chair, preventing the staff members from leaving. The staff members said they were in the office for approximately 20 minutes. The family member, a 60-year old Brisbane resident, was arrested for battery and false imprisonment.

On Tuesday, 08-30-16 at 9:25 a.m., officers were dispatched to the **Lucky’s** supermarket for a shoplifting incident that occurred earlier. The store security advised the suspect stole items and fled the store, leaving the merchandise behind, and left in a gold Camry. Store security obtained the license plate and advised the suspect has been doing this same thing for the last couple of months, and when store security stopped her this time, the suspect gave an excuse that her money was inside her vehicle. A store security officer used his cell phone and took a photo of both the suspect and her vehicle. Officers went to the suspect’s home in Daly City, and she would not open the door for officers. The following day, officers arrested the 39-year old suspect and placed a parole hold on her. (She is currently on parole for shoplifting and robbery.)

On Tuesday, 08-30-16 at 9:28 a.m., Officer Sabins was dispatched to the 300 block of **Innisfree Drive** on a report of two subjects living inside a vehicle for five days and that there was trash and needles around the vehicle. The officer didn’t see any trash or needles but saw two subjects sleeping in the vehicle. The subject in the driver’s seat, an 18-year old Vallejo resident, was subsequently arrested for possession of a concealed firearm (found in the vehicle) and for tampering with a serial number of a firearm.

On Thursday, 09-01-16 at 8:38 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Public Storage facility on **King Drive** on a report of a male subject who had jumped over the fence and was walking through the business. Officers contacted a subject matching the description the property manager gave and asked him if he rented a storage unit. The subject said he did but that he was behind on payment. The property manager advised he put another lock on the unit and that the subject's gate code no longer worked. The officers asked the subject if he had anything illegal on his person and if he would consent to be searched. The subject advised he only had a knife and "lock picks" on him. The subject, a 29-year old South San Francisco resident, was issued a citation for being in possession of burglary tools.

On Friday, 09-02-16 at 8:51 p.m., officers working a two-officer vehicle patrolled the parking lot of **Mussel Rock Park** noticed vehicles in the parking lot after sunset—in violation of a Daly City municipal code. The officers contacted subjects in a vehicle, which ultimately led to the arrest of a 35-year old female from Pacifica for possession of a controlled substance (suspected methamphetamine) and for possession of unlawful paraphernalia. The second suspect, a 23-year old male from Pacifica, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance (suspected cocaine).

On Sunday, 09-04-16 at approximately 2:28 a.m., Officer Chittenden and Officer McQuade were on patrol in the area of **Mission Street** and **Eastlake Avenue** when they saw a male cross against the signal. They contacted him and asked him if he had anything on his person that he shouldn't have, and the subject said he had some syringes. Officer McQuade asked if the subject had any heroin on him, and he said yes. When searching the subject, officers found heroin, syringes, a metal punch (typically used to smash car and commercial windows), as well as a stun gun. Officers issued a citation to the suspect, a 37-year old San Francisco resident, for possession of a controlled substance, paraphernalia, burglary tools and a stun gun.

On Sunday, 09-04-16 at 8:36 p.m., Officer Fulmore and Officer Collins were patrolling the parking lot of **Mussel Rock Park** and checked an occupied vehicle for parking after sunset hours. The officers contacted the passenger and saw in clear view marijuana on a tray. The subjects said they were going to smoke marijuana in the vehicle. When the officers contacted the driver, they observed she was acting nervous, and she said it was because she had a warrant for driving with a suspended license. The driver, a 22-year old Pacifica resident, had 14 Xanax pills for which she had no prescription and was cited for possession of a controlled substance.

On Monday, 09-05-16 at 3:30 a.m., Officer Chittenden and Officer McQuade were on patrol in the area of **Geneva Avenue** and **Carter Street** when they observed a vehicle driving approximately 60-65 mph. When the officers attempted to get the license plate of the vehicle, they advised it was swerving between lanes, driving the wrong way, and not stopping for a light—all prior to the officers' activating the vehicle's emergency lights. The vehicle eventually stopped on the unit block of Oakridge Drive. The officers observed there were two open beer cans in the center console and that the driver had slurred speech, bloodshot watery eyes and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath and person. In doing a search of the vehicle, officers found baggies of suspected methamphetamine packaged for sale. The suspect, a 32-year old Daly City resident, was subsequently arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sale, transporting a controlled substance for sale, driving while under the influence of alcohol, reckless driving, driving on the wrong side of a divided highway and for driving on a suspended license.

On Friday, 09-09-16 at approximately 9:50 p.m., a 30-year old Daly City resident was the victim of an assault with a deadly weapon via metal pry bar strike to his head. Additionally, a 26-year old San Francisco resident who was with the victim was also the victim of a battery via punch to the head. This occurred at the intersection of **Partridge Avenue** and **Rio Verde Street**. The suspect also damaged the victim's vehicle with a golf club. The first victim was transported to the hospital, and the second victim declined medical attention. The suspect is described as a tall black male in his mid 30's, approximately 5'10", 200 lbs., with a goatee and wearing a white tee-shirt. This case has been referred to investigators.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past two weeks.

On Thursday, 09-08-16 at 4:18 a.m., a 43-year old Daly City resident was the victim of an assault with a deadly weapon via a possible wrench and robbery with the loss of his wallet and currency. The victim said after her parked his vehicle at **Belcrest Avenue** and **Longview Drive**, he said he began to get out of his vehicle to check if it was blocking the crosswalk, and the door closed on him. He said on his second attempt to get out of the vehicle, he was struck in the face with something that felt like a wrench by a subject who yelled at him before hitting him again. The victim identified the subject, a 54-year old South San Francisco resident, and officers later arrested him for assault with a deadly weapon and robbery.

On Saturday, 09-10-16 at 10:10 a.m., a 56-year old Daly City resident said she was walking to **Edgewood Park** and was walking up the stairs that lead to Edgewood Court when she saw two males smoking a cigarette by a tree. She said one of the males shouted at her, but she didn't understand what he said. She said when she proceeded down the stairs, she sensed someone was behind her. She said she turned around and a male, described as a black male in his mid to late 20's, slender build, dark complexion and a skinny face, long hair in a bun and wearing a black jacket, said a few words to her that she did not understand. The victim said she turned around, put both of her hands in her jacket pockets, and then the suspect put both of his hands in her pockets and tried to take everything out of her pockets. The victim said she tried to pull away but said the suspect was stronger than her. The victim said the suspect pulled her cell phone and hand purse containing money and an identification card, punched her in the face, causing her to fall and faint. The victim could only identify the second suspect as a black male, approximately 6', 180 lbs., with a slender build, dark complexion and skinny face. The victim was transported to the hospital for her injuries. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past two weeks.

On Tuesday, 08-30-16 at 5:15 p.m., a 45-year old transient was arrested for burglary after he walked into the open garage of a residence on the 300 block of **Lakeshire Drive**.

Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

Between Thursday, 09-08-16 at 10:00 p.m. and Friday, 09-09-16 at 6:30 a.m., a business on the 6400 block of **Mission Street** was burglarized. The suspect(s) broke the glass store front door and took four vacuum cleaners.

On Friday, 09-09-16 at 9:30 a.m., **Bed Bath and Beyond** was the victim of a commercial burglary by an unknown suspect described as a white male adult, bald, medium build, wearing a light blue button up long sleeve shirt and blue jeans, who took an espresso machine without paying and left the area in a gray, two-door Dodge pickup with no license plates.
