When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Friday, 10-14-16 at 11:15 a.m., Officer Bray conducted a neighborhood check for stolen property from a vehicle burglary in the **Midway Village** area. Officer Bray noticed three subjects walking from a vehicle and stopped to speak with them. One of the subjects, a 35-year old transient, made spontaneous statements and admitted to possessing and operating a stolen vehicle and that his two passengers didn't know the vehicle was stolen. The vehicle was stolen from Daly City, and the subject was arrested for auto theft.

On Saturday, 10-15-16 at 7:43 p.m., officers responded to the intersection of **John Daly Boulevard** and **Junipero Serra Boulevard** on a report of a collision. Officers were called because one of the drivers did not have identification. The officer asked the driver if he had identification, and the driver said he did not speak English. The officer looked into the driver's wallet for identification, and he found a carefully folded dollar bill. Knowing that this was a common method of packaging narcotics, the officer unfolded the bill and found a white powdery substance containing cocaine. The officer brought the driver, a 20-year old San Jose resident, to the station, and the subject said the wallet was his and admitted to buying the cocaine in San Jose. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and for driving a vehicle without being licensed.

On Thursday, 10-13-16 at 6:50 p.m., Officer Fulmore conducted a routine business check at the Shell Gas station on **Hickey Boulevard** and saw a vehicle without a rear license plate at the gas pumps. The officer saw a subject exit the vehicle and walk toward the mini mart. He called for the subject to stop and asked him to come back to the vehicle where there was a person in the passenger seat. As the subject opened the door, the officer smelled a distinct odor of marijuana. The officer asked the subjects if they had a medical marijuana card, and neither did. The officer asked the passenger how much marijuana was in the vehicle, and the passenger said there was approximately an ounce and a digital scale in the backpack on the floorboard. Other officers arrived at the scene and asked the subjects if there was anything illegal on them. The first subject began to tremble and admitted to having “dope” in his front pocket. When the officer checked the subject's pockets, he found a baggie containing several smaller clear plastic bags which contained cocaine. The subject, a 28-year old

Antioch resident, was arrested for possession of cocaine for sales and an outstanding misdemeanor warrant from Riverside County.

On Wednesday, 10-12-16 at 3:00 p.m., a 19-year old San Jose resident was arrested for attempting to pass a counterfeit check at the Bank of America after an alert teller noticed inconsistencies in the check.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 10-13-16 between 3:30 p.m. and 5:50 p.m., a condominium on the 7500 block of **Mission Street** was burglarized and vandalized. The resident suspects her former roommate is responsible, as the resident told the suspect she was no longer welcome to stay at the residence. This investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between Tuesday, 10-11-16 at 5:10 p.m. and Wednesday, 10-12-16 at 4:30 a.m., an unknown suspect cut the lock of a gate and storage container at a construction site in the parking lot of **Serramonte Shopping Center** and miscellaneous tools.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were thirteen vehicle burglaries during the past week. Most of these occurred in commercial parking lots. Please do not leave anything of value visible in your vehicle, and do not put objects into your trunk after you park your vehicle. (Someone may be watching you do this.)

Scams/Other

Computer Scam

On Sunday, 10-16-16 at approximately 10:00 p.m., a 52-year old Daly City resident said he was at his iMac computer looking at websites when a message prompted and froze his screen. The victim said the message said his computer was infected with malware and spyware that was going to destroy his hard drive. There was also a computer-generated voice telling him to call Mac Security and listed a phone number. The victim said he called the number, and a subject with an Indian accent answered the phone. The subject told the victim his company was a 3rd party company not affiliated with Apple, but was authorized by Apple to fix his problem. The victim said the subject said it would cost \$1,000 to fix the problem, and then lowered it to \$900 and then to \$800. The victim said he only had \$20. The victim said the suspect put him on hold after telling him he needed to check with his supervisor. When he returned to the phone, he said he would fix the problem for a one time fee of \$25. The victim agreed to that amount and said he was watching his computer screen and saw programs working and icons moving. After approximately a half hour, the victim said the computer started working, and the subject said the computer was repaired. The victim said he provided the subject with his bank account information and later started to get a funny feeling and called Apple Customer Care the following morning. The Apple Care representative said they are not affiliated with any company in regard to repairs and advised the victim it was a scam. The victim closed his bank account, and he said it appears he only lost \$25.
