When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

## Notable Cases

On Monday, 10-17-16 at 8:33 p.m., Officer Clinkscales contacted an occupied vehicle in the parking garage at 1851 **Junipero Serra Boulevard**. The officer smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle and noticed tarp was covering a broken window. There were three people in the vehicle, and one of them, a 55-year old San Francisco resident, was on searchable probation. The officer asked the subject to exit the vehicle to make sure he did not have any weapons or narcotics. When the 55-year old subject exited the vehicle, he told the officer he didn't want his daughter to see him being searched. The officer searched the subject anyway and found a pill bottle in the subject's jacket sleeve. At that time, the subject made a spontaneous statement about the contents of the pill bottle. The officer continued to search the subject and found heroin and a glass pipe. The officer then asked the subject's daughter, a 15-year old Grass Valley resident, to step out of the vehicle and asked her if she had anything she should not have in her possession. The daughter had a pipe used for smoking methamphetamine and a container with a green leafy substance rolled into a cigarette. The officer later learned the subject's father gave her those items. Inside the vehicle, the officer found a tool used to commit auto burglaries. Officer Tone, who responded to assist Officer Clinkscales, found the vehicle was an unreported stolen vehicle from New Mexico. Based on this, the other subject in the vehicle, a 30-year old San Francisco resident, and the 55-year old subject were taken to the police station for questioning. The 55-year old subject said he wanted to take his daughter to a movie and paid the 30-year old to drive as he does not have a car. He stated the 30-year old subject's father is his good friend. The 30-year old told the officers he did not know the vehicle was stolen and that one of his friends gave him the vehicle. Officers were concerned that the 15-year old may be a victim of human trafficking and determined after speaking with her mother, that this was not the case. The 55-year old was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and for child endangerment. The 30-year old was arrested for being in possession of a stolen vehicle and burglary tools. The 15-year old was released to her grandmother.

On Thursday, 10-20-16 at 4:18 p.m., officers from the “Crime Suppression Unit” were patrolling the **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Target due to the rash of auto burglaries over the past

couple of days. One of the officers saw a subject in a vehicle with all of the windows rolled down and went over to contact him. As the officer was approaching the vehicle, the officer noticed the subject became nervous and quickly threw a baggy of pills in the glove box. The subject told the officer it was Xanax, prescribed for his anxiety. A subsequent investigation revealed the subject, a 25-year old San Francisco resident, possessed a large amount controlled substances for sales as well as a large amount of cash. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sales, as well as transportation of a controlled substance for sales.

On Friday, 10-21-16 at approximately 12:06 p.m., the Boys and Girls Club on **Martin Street** received an e-mail stating there was an explosive at the site. The San Francisco P.D. K-9 Bomb Squad responded to search, and they did not find any explosives.

On Sunday, 10-23-16 at 4:44 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 300 block of **Santa Barbara Avenue** on a report of a suspicious person looking through a vehicle. The reporting party gave a description of the subject, and Officer Tommy Yip located a subject matching the description. The subject, an 18-year old Oakland resident, had items belonging to two other victims of nearby auto burglaries. He was arrested for auto burglary.

On Saturday, 10-29-16 at 3:17 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **John Daly Boulevard** and **Junipero Serra Boulevard** on a report of a subject who brandished a firearm from a vehicle. The reporting party gave the dispatchers a description and license plate number of the vehicle, as well as a description of the occupants of the vehicle. The reporting party, a 60-year old Pacifica resident, said he was teaching his daughter how to drive when they were stopped at Park Plaza Drive and John Daly Boulevard. The reporting party said the driver of the vehicle behind them “laid on their horn”, apparently mad because their vehicle was not moving. After his daughter made the turn, the vehicle pulled up alongside the driver’s side of the vehicle, and the front passenger yelled expletives at them through his rolled down window and then pointed a shiny chrome semi-automatic handgun above the window sill. The reporting party told his daughter to back off and let the vehicle pass. The reporting party described the subject with the gun as a black male, approximately 23 years old, with dark brown shoulder length dreadlocks, a mustache and a goatee. The reporting party could only describe the other two subjects as being black males. This investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, 10-29-16 at 8:08 p.m., officers were dispatched to a 911-hang up call from a residence on the 700 block of **Niantic Avenue**. Officers made contact with the caller who said he needed help finding a rehabilitation center. The 50-year old subject was on probation and because it had a “search and seizure” clause, officers searched the subject and his immediate area where he was sitting. Officers found a glass cylindrical pipe with a bulb on one end—which is commonly used to ingest methamphetamine. The officers asked the subject when he last ingested methamphetamine, and he said about noon that day. Officers arrested the subject for possession of the pipe and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

## Robberies

There were five robberies during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 10-17-16 at approximately 2:55 p.m., a 15-year old Daly City resident was the victim of a strong arm robbery by a 16-year old Daly City resident. This occurred in the area of **Price Street** and **1<sup>st</sup> Avenue** after the victim bought \$45 worth of marijuana from a 16-year old San Bruno resident. During an interview, the first suspect admitted to conspiring with the other suspect to “distract” the victim into setting down his backpack so the suspect could take back the marijuana another suspect, a 17-year old Daly City resident, just sold him. All three suspects were identified and arrested.

On Friday, 10-21-16 at approximately 7:30 p.m., a 29-year old Daly City resident said he was robbed by gunpoint by three unknown suspects on the 6300 block of **Mission Street**. The victim said the suspects took his brown leather wallet containing currency, an inactive debit card and two house keys. The victim described the first suspect as a black male, early 20’s, 5’9”, 180 lbs., dark gray hooded sweater with black pants. The victim described the second suspect as a black male, mid 20’s,

approximately 5'7", 160 lbs., bald head, beard, wearing a light gray shirt with the word "KING" in big white lettering. The victim described the third suspect as a black male adult, 5'10", 220 lbs., short dread locks, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, black beanie, black pants and black shoes. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 10-27-16 at approximately 2:10 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 500 block of **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of a robbery that just occurred. The victims, a 29-year old female Daly City resident and a 26-year old male Daly City resident, said they went to the Bank of America on Gellert Boulevard and withdrew money. They then went to Sprouts to do some shopping and then drove to their residence. The victim said when she got out of her vehicle, she saw two black male adults exit a black four door sedan approximately 15 feet north of them, and they approached her from behind. The female said the subjects grabbed her friend and tried to push him to the ground. The female said she tried to push the suspects away but failed. She said one of the suspects was able to push the male victim to the ground, and held him down as he tried to take the envelope containing the money but was only able to take \$100 from the envelope. The female said the driver of the vehicle then exited the vehicle and joined in with the robbery. She said one of the three suspects grabbed her wallet containing currency, her driver's license, three credit cards and her phone. The victim said the suspects all ran back to their vehicle and drove northbound on Gellert Boulevard. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 10-28-16 at approximately 8:40 p.m., a **Macy's** loss prevention officer was the victim of a strong armed robbery by four suspects as they were being detained for shoplifting. The loss prevention officer, a 51-year old San Francisco resident, did not suffer any visible injuries during the scuffle. A 15-year old female suspect from San Francisco was arrested and booked into the San Mateo County Youth Services Center, and a 23-year old female from San Francisco was arrested and booked into the Redwood City Jail. Two days later, the other two suspects, a 15-year old female from San Francisco and a 19-year old male from San Francisco, were arrested.

On Sunday, 10-30-16 at approximately 5:27 a.m., officers responded to the unit block of Lausanne Avenue on a report of a possible armed robbery that occurred on the 100 block of **East Vista Avenue**. The reporting party told the dispatchers she and her friend were robbed by two unknown black males near the entrance of Edgewood Park. The two 23-year old victims, from San Francisco and Daly City, said they took Uber from San Francisco and were dropped off at the corner of Hillside Boulevard and East Vista Avenue. The victims said they began walking when they saw a cream colored Cadillac Escalade driving toward them. The victims said two black male adults exited the vehicle and said, "Don't move or we'll kill you". One suspect said, "We'll shoot you. Give me your sh-t". The victim panicked and took off her backpack and handed it to the suspect. The first suspect pulled the backpack off the other victim. The victims said the suspects drove away in the Cadillac. The victims described the first suspect as a black male in his late 20's, approximately 5'10", 200 lbs. with a stocky or heavy set build, chubby face and a short faded haircut which connected with his short beard, and he wore a white tee-shirt and unknown color pants. They described the second suspect as a black male in his late 20's or early 30's, approximately 6'1", 190 lbs., average build, tall messy hair and was wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt with a red tee-shirt underneath. This investigation is continuing.

## Residential Burglaries

There were four residential burglaries and two attempted residential burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Thursday, 10-20-16 between 7:10 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., a residence on the unit block of **Oceanside Drive** was burglarized. The suspect(s) entered the residence via an unsecured rear sliding glass door and took several high-end basketball shoes and jewelry items.

Between Thursday, 10-20-16 from 5:00 p.m. and Friday, 10-21-16, at approximately 8:00 a.m., two new residences on the 1500 block of **Annie Street** were burglarized by an unknown suspect who broke the rear window and took a microwave oven from each residence.

On Friday, 10-21-16 between 2:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m., an unknown suspect entered a residence on the unit block of **Alta Vista Way** via the unlocked rear single swing door and took currency, a garage door remote, a jewelry box and miscellaneous jewelry.

On Saturday, 10-22-16 at approximately 1:30 a.m., a resident on the unit block of **East Moltke Street** said he was sleeping in the lower unit and woke up to see an unknown subject opening his bedroom window and peering through the blinds. The 37-year old victim screamed, and the subject ran away in an unknown direction.

On Tuesday, 10-25-16 at 12:13 p.m., a resident on the 200 block of **Wilshire Avenue** reported she heard glass break in her kitchen and then saw a subject running away across the front lawn. Officers responded to the area but could not locate the suspect. There was no property taken.

## Commercial Burglaries

## Scams/Other

### “Grandma” Scam

I have written about this scam in the past in which a caller poses as a granddaughter or grandson and tells the “grandma” or “grandpa” that the caller has been in an accident and needs money. Unfortunately on Thursday, 10-28-16, an 83-year old Daly City resident fell victim to this scam. The

victim sent two transactions via a Money Gram in the amount of \$2,500. The subject was actually in the country of the Dominican Republic. Please share this information with the elderly people you know.

### **Car Purchase Scam**

On Wednesday, 10-19-16, a 44-year old Daly City resident found a vehicle (a 2004 Toyota RAV4) on Facebook she wanted to purchase for \$2,500. The victim said she sent a message to the seller who advised the vehicle was in Wichita Kansas, but if she wanted to purchase the vehicle, the vehicle would be shipped for free. The seller suggested they use eBay as a third party to assist in the money transaction. After the victim agreed, she said she received an email message from "eBay" shortly after with all the information she needed to purchase. Believing this was legitimate, the victim contacted the phone number on the message, and the agent who answered instructed the victim to purchase a \$2,500 Visa card and to read off the numbers on the back of the card to him. After she did that, she received a phone call saying she needed to pay for insurance to chip the vehicle. At this point, the victim became suspicious and contacted the police. Unfortunately, the victim fell prey to this scam and lost \$2,500.

### **Bank Account/Text Message Scam**

A 33-year old Daly City resident said he received a text message on his cell phone thinking the sender was from Chase Bank, where he had an account. The reporting party clicked on the link provided in the text message which opened into a mobile application website, seemingly owned by Chase Bank. The website requested the reporting party to confirm his identity by providing his name, birthday, address and social security number. The reporting party said he provided the information and was prompted to provide his bank account password on the next page. The reporting party grew suspicious and phoned Chase Bank who advised him the bank did not send him a message and to stop providing more information to the website. The victim did not lose any money, but he is concerned he could potentially be a victim of identity theft.
