When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 11-08-16 at 12:57 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **Mission Street** and **Alp Avenue** on a report of several subjects fighting. One subject, a 37-year old transient, displayed signs of being under the influence. Officers conducted field sobriety tests and arrested the subject for being under the influence of a controlled substance and also for a parole hold.

On Wednesday, 11-09-16 at 10:10 p.m., Officer Nick McCarthy stopped a vehicle for a tail light violation at the intersection of **John Daly Boulevard** and **Park Plaza Drive**. The driver did not have a driver's license, and the officer asked her to step out of the vehicle. When she stepped out of the vehicle, she placed a cell phone in a red case on the driver's seat. The officer observed as the phone was being placed on the seat, a rolled one dollar bill sticking out of the top of the cell phone case. Recognizing this rolled up one dollar bill as an instrument used to ingest controlled substances, Officer McCarthy asked for another officer, Officer Fulmore, to assist. The female consented to the vehicle being searched and admitted ownership of the cell phone. Officer McCarthy opened the cell phone case and found a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine inside of it. Officer Fulmore asked the subject if there was anything else illegal in the vehicle, and the driver responded, “Yes”. Inside the driver's purse were three baggies containing suspected cocaine. The subject, a 21-year old Redwood City resident, was subsequently arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sales, transportation of a controlled substance for sales, possession of unlawful paraphernalia and for driving without a valid driver's license.

On Friday, 11-11-16 at approximately 3:20 p.m., Officer Lee Aquila conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle at **Mission Street** and **Templeton Streets**. The driver, a 27-year old San Francisco resident, initially gave false information regarding his identity to the officer. This traffic stop ultimately resulted in the subject being arrested for providing false identification to a police officer, possession of equipment used to produce fraudulent access cards, possession of altered access cards, possession of a forged California disabled placard and driving without a license.

On Friday, 11-11-16 at 8:25 p.m., Officer Murillo was on patrol in the **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot and saw an occupied vehicle with five males inside of it. The officer made contact with the subject in the driver's seat and asked how the subject was doing. The subject said he didn't have a license. The officer saw an open can of beer in the center console, smelled a strong odor of marijuana from inside the vehicle and observed there were four other males in the vehicle who appeared to be juveniles. Only one subject had a driver's license, and he was the only adult among the group. Officer Murillo asked that subject to step out of the vehicle, and as he was doing so, the officer saw a medium sized bag of marijuana on the inside of the passenger door. Officer Murillo asked the subject if he had any guns, knives or drugs, and the subject said he had a small knife in his pocket. The officer asked him to remove it and then asked if he would give him permission to check his pockets. The officer pulled out a wallet containing over \$1,500 in currency from the subject's pants pocket. The officer conducted a search of the vehicle and found marijuana and items indicating that the marijuana was for sale. After a thorough investigation, officers arrested the suspect, a 24-year old San Francisco resident, for contributing to the delinquency of a minor, being in possession of a controlled substance for sale and for possession of marijuana for sale. The four juveniles were released to their parents.

On Tuesday, 11-15-16 at 5:20 p.m., Officer Don McCarthy observed a Honda Civic parked in a dark lot on the 7600 block of **El Camino Real**, ran a check on the vehicle and discovered the vehicle was stolen from San Francisco earlier in the day. Officers conducted surveillance on the vehicle and saw a male subject walking back and forth, to and from the vehicle, several times. The officers contacted the subject and detained him for auto theft. The subject, a 36-year old subject from Orlando, had a bent key in his pocket, a pair of pliers in another pocket and an identification card not belonging to him in his other pocket. The officer looked into the vehicle and saw the stereo was ripped out and wires were hanging from the dashboard. The subject was arrested for vehicle theft, possession of a stolen vehicle and for possession of burglary tools.

On Friday, 11-18-16 at approximately 10:00 a.m., a 24-year old Daly City resident said she was running in the area of **Lincoln Avenue** and **Lakeshire Drive** when a subject standing next to a white or silver vehicle said, "Hey hey" and exposed and grabbed his erect penis. The victim said she kept running. The suspect was only described as a Hispanic male in his mid-40's, approximately 5'10", 160 lbs., black curly hair, wearing a blue jacket and light blue jeans.

On Friday, 11-18-16 at approximately 4:20 p.m., Officer Don McCarthy and Officer Newton were on a special detail at the **Serramonte Shopping Center** due to an increase in auto burglaries when they saw a suspicious vehicle parked in the disabled stall near Macy's. The vehicle did not have a disabled placard or license plate, and two subjects were smoking and standing outside, as well as watching people walk into the parking lot. The subjects got back into the vehicle, and the officers stopped the vehicle. There were four occupants of the vehicle, and one of the occupants provided a false name. After his identity was confirmed, the officers found out the subject, a 22-year old San Francisco resident, was a convicted felon. When the officers searched that subject, they found bullets in his pocket. The other subject, a 31-year old San Francisco resident, admitted to having a rifle concealed in his right pants leg. After an investigation, officers placed the subjects under arrest for possession of a concealed weapon, possession of a concealed weapon in a vehicle, and for possession of an unregistered concealed firearm. Additionally, the 22-year old suspect was placed under arrest for possession of a firearm by a felon, possession of ammunition by a felon and providing a false name two times and for a misdemeanor warrant. The other subjects in the vehicle were released.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 11-07-16 at approximately 9:20 p.m., three females (ages 12, 41 and 50) were the victims of an armed robbery via handgun by two unknown subjects. This occurred on the eastern sidewalk of **Irvington Street** just south of **Evergreen Avenue**. The 12-year old female said they were walking on the sidewalk when two men approached them and struck the two other victims and took a purse and duffle bag they were carrying. They left in a dark colored newer 4-door vehicle, similar to a Toyota Corolla. One of the victims complained of pain to her back and right side of her jaw and was treated by

emergency personnel. The first suspect was described as a unknown race male, 30's, 5'10", medium build with a "chubby" face, last seen wearing all dark clothing and had a firearm in his waistband. The second suspect was described as an unknown race male, 6'0", and had a large build.

On Thursday, 11-10-16 at 3:27 p.m., officers responded to the **Target** store on a report of a suspect who brandished a knife during a theft. The loss prevention officer said he was watching the security cameras when he saw a female subject conceal items into her backpack while her male companion appeared to act as a look out. The loss prevention officer then saw the female conceal items into her companion's backpack. After the subjects walked past the last point of sale towards the exit door without paying for the items in their backpacks, they were stopped by uniformed security guards who told them to come back to the security office. The male subject pulled out a switchblade knife, made a threat but did not open the knife. After seeing the knife, the loss prevention officer immediately stopped trying to detain the subjects and asked them to return the items. The subjects gave some of the items back, and the male subject told the loss prevention officer he would be back the next day. Shortly after, officers found the subjects in the parking lot and detained them. The female, a 20-year old San Jose resident, was arrested for burglary, conspiracy and for misappropriation of lost property after officers found a credit card not belonging to her in her possession. The male subject, a 24-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for burglary, conspiracy, criminal threats and for being in possession of a switchblade knife.

On Saturday, 11-12-16 at 1:44 a.m., officers were dispatched to a report of a carjacking that occurred at the intersection of **Hanover Street** and **Whittier Street**. One victim, a 43-year old San Francisco resident, said he was stopped at the intersection in his vehicle, and as he was about to move forward, a blue unknown make and model vehicle blocked his path from moving forward into the middle of the intersection. The victim said two subjects got out from the car—one subject went to his side of the vehicle, and the other subject went to the passenger side of the vehicle. The victim said the suspect, described as a black male wearing a black short sleeve shirt and blue jeans, pulled him out of the car and pointed a black firearm at him. The victim said the suspect told him to give him his money and everything in his pockets. The victim handed the suspect his phone, keys, and his wallet containing his international identification card, and cash. The victim said he looked around for his passenger, and he noticed he took off running. The victim said the suspect then sat in the driver's seat of his vehicle (a 1995 Toyota Avalon), while the second suspect, described only as a white male, got back into the blue car and drove away. The next day, San Jose P.D. officers found the vehicle occupied by a subject who was sleeping. After an investigation, officers arrested the subject, a 25-year old Oakland resident, for robbery, carjacking, conspiracy and assault with a deadly weapon.

Residential Burglaries

There were six residential burglaries and one attempted residential burglary during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 11-07-16 between 5:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., a residence on the 400 block of **Accacia Street** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who entered the residence via an unknown means. The residents reported rooms were ransacked. The loss was an iPad, an Android tablet, credit cards, cash, and shoes.

On Saturday, 11-13-16 between 7:00 p.m. and 11:15 p.m., a hotel room at the Mylo Hotel on **Geneva Avenue** was burglarized. An unknown suspect forced open the front door and took clothing.

Between 9:30 p.m. on Monday, 11-14-16 and 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, 11-15-16, an unknown suspect forced open a lower unit rear garage door of a residence on the 100 block of **Northgate Avenue**. Nothing was taken.

On Wednesday, 11-16-16 at approximately 12:00 p.m. a 33-year old Daly City resident said her 23-year old tenant barged into her residence on the 400 block of **Price Street** without her consent and took a wallet containing her phone, debit card and identification card. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 11-17-16 at 7:31 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Cypress Lane** on a report of a female stating her boyfriend was intoxicated and trying to break into her residence. Officers subsequently arrested the subject, a 26-year old Daly City resident, for burglary, criminal threats, exhibiting a deadly weapon, and spousal abuse.

On Saturday, 11-19-16 at 12:02 p.m., officers were dispatched to an apartment on the 300 block of **Philip Drive** on a report of a cold residential burglary that actually occurred on 11-04-16 between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. The victims believe a suspect forced entry through the front door and took multiple electronic items—an Apple laptop, an Xbox One and an Apple computer monitor. The victims believe they know who committed the burglary, and this case is under investigation.

On Wednesday, 11-09-16 at 7:53 p.m., a residence on the 400 block of **Accacia Street** was the victim of an attempted residential burglary. An unknown suspect removed the screen and opened the bathroom window when an audible burglary alarm sounded. A K-9 search was conducted, and it was determined that no entry was made by the suspect.

Commercial Burglaries

There were seven commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Saturday, 11-12-16 at 10:50 p.m., an unknown suspect smashed the front entry doors of the Flyers Gas Station on **Serramonte Boulevard**. Nothing was taken.

On Sunday, 11-13-16 at approximately 5:38 a.m., an unknown suspect threw a rock through the window at the Round Table Pizza Restaurant on **Mission Street** and took a safe. The suspect activated the burglar alarm and left prior to police arrival.

On Sunday, 11-13-16 at approximately 11:39 a.m., the DSW Shoe store at **Westlake Shopping Center** was the victim of a burglary by two subjects—one described as a black male, 20-25 years old, wearing an orange Giants jersey, jeans, black shoes and a hat, and the other subject described as a black female, approximately 20-25 years old, wearing a brown hat, a black spaghetti strap top, blue jeans and “Uggs”, who stole six pairs of “Uggs” boots from boxes, placed them into a bag and left the store without paying for the boots.

On Monday, 11-14-16 between 6:30 p.m. and 7:20 p.m., an unknown suspect cut the padlock off of a gym locker at the **Planet Fitness** facility. The loss was a pair of jeans and a black backpack containing the victim’s wallet, identification, cash and a debit card.

On Thursday, 11-17-16 at 6:05 p.m., the Verizon Wireless store at **Westlake Shopping Center** was the victim of a commercial burglary by two suspects who stole five Google cell phones. The suspects fled in a dark blue older model, 4-door, Mercedes Benz sedan.

On Thursday, 11-17-16 at approximately 7:45 p.m., the Verizon Wireless store at **Westlake Shopping Center** was again the victim of a commercial burglary by two unknown suspects who took three headphones valued at almost \$1,000. These suspects were last seen fleeing on foot.

On Saturday, 11-19-16 at 5:00 p.m., an unknown suspect stole 20 pairs of Levi jeans from **JC Penney’s** and fled in a 2007-2012 gray Nissan Sentra with no front license plate. The suspect was described as a black male in his 30’s, 6’1” to 6’2”, bald, wearing a dark jacket and dark pants.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were 26 vehicle burglaries during the past two weeks. The victims in the majority of these cases left their valuables in plain sight. This is extremely tempting to auto burglars, and I cannot impress more that leaving your valuables in plain sight is not a wise thing to do.

- **Mission Plaza** parking lot—a purse containing cash, credit cards, cosmetics, medication, sunglasses and a garage door opener was taken from a 2010 Mercedes Benz C300. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 11-07-16 between 10:35 a.m. and 10:59 a.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Buffalo Wild Wings—a backpack containing textbooks and paperwork was taken from the floor behind the driver's seat of a 2016 Toyota Prius. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 11-08-16 between 9:25 p.m. and 9:31 p.m.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Event—Saturday, December 10, 2016

San Mateo County residents can safely dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) free of charge on Saturday, December 10 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. only by appointment. Residents are required to schedule an appointment at San Mateo County's HHW program on line at www.smchealth.org/hhw or by phone at (650) 363-4718 and select option 3. You will be given the drop off location after you make your appointment.

Accepted items include acids/bases, aerosol cans, automotive supplies (car batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid), cleaning products, fertilizers, pesticides, flammable liquids, fluorescent lights (compact and tubes), paint, inks, and photo chemicals. No radioactive, explosive, medical or commercial waste is allowed. All waste collected is reused, recycled, or stabilized for proper disposal to achieve zero waste being landfilled.
