When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Thursday, 12-08-16 at 11:15 a.m., officers were dispatched to the McDonald’s restaurant on **Geneva Avenue** on a report of an intoxicated subject who was disturbing customers. The subject told the officers his name was “Santa Claus” and eventually gave his true name. The subject had a pint of vodka and a pint of whiskey in his pant pockets. His level of intoxication was so high that he could only mumble his words. Officers arrested the 50-year old San Francisco resident for public intoxication.

On Friday, 12-09-16 at approximately 12:53 p.m., Officer Murillo was dispatched to the **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Dick’s Sporting Goods on a report of a vehicle collision in which one of the drivers was attempting to leave. One of the drivers said he had just dropped off his 6 month old son’s mother at work (the son was in the vehicle), and as he was trying to make a turn, another car collided with his vehicle. As the officer was speaking with the subject, the officer noted the subject had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath and person and had an unsteady gait. Officer Murillo conducted field sobriety tests on the 33-year old subject from San Francisco and determined he was under the influence of alcohol. The son was released to his mother, and the subject was arrested for driving under the influence, child endangerment and for threatening the other driver. There were no injuries as a result of this collision.

On Friday, 12-09-16 at 11:06 p.m., Officer Ortiz was patrolling **Lincoln Park** and contacted a group of subjects who were smoking at the park after curfew. Officer Taylor arrived to assist, and the officers asked all of the subjects to sit in the seating area. Officer Ortiz asked the first subject if he had any guns, drugs or knives, and the subject said he had a knife in his pocket. The officer noticed what appeared to be a rolled up marijuana joint in the second subject’s right ear. The officer also asked if he had anything illegal in his possession, and the subject said he also had a knife. This knife was a switchblade knife with a blade that was approximately 4” long. The officer arrested the subject, a 17-year old San Francisco resident, and asked to check the subject’s backpack. The officer found a stun gun in the front pocket of the backpack. The subject was also arrested for being a minor in possession of a stun gun, a minor in possession of marijuana and being a minor in possession of tobacco products. The three other 18-year old subjects had small knives in their possession.

On Friday, 12-09-16 at 11:15 p.m., Officer Collins was on patrol in the parking lot of **Planet Fitness** and saw a white pit bull inside of a parked vehicle. Officer Collins conducted a computer check of the vehicle and found out the registered owner was a parolee/sex offender he had arrested in the past for possession of a controlled substance and for possession of unlawful paraphernalia. About five minutes later, the subject walked out of the gym with a backpack to his vehicle. Officer Collins asked the subject if he had anything illegal in his vehicle or in his person, and the subject said no and asked to leave as he was cold and feeling sick. Because the subject was on parole, he was subject to search and seizure. The officer told him he couldn't leave and searched the subject, finding two shotgun shells in the subject's pocket. The subject's girlfriend then walked out of the gym with a backpack. When the officer checked the male's backpack, he found a "sawed off" shotgun and attempted to locate a serial number; however, it was scratched. Officer McQuade arrived to assist, and they searched the bed of the subject's mobile home/camper and found boxes of unspent rifle and handgun ammunition, as well as methamphetamine pipes. The male, a 52-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for being a felon in possession of a firearm, illegal possession of a firearm, a felon in possession of ammunition, possession of a short barrel firearm, possession of a concealed firearm on his person, possession of high capacity magazines, possession of a firearm with an altered serial number and for a parole violation. His girlfriend, a 24-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of unlawful paraphernalia. They two subjects were transported to jail, and the SPCA took custody of the dog.

On Saturday, 12-10-16 at 6:13 a.m., Officer Riney was dispatched to the area of **3rd Avenue** and **Habitat Way** on a report of a subject looking into car windows. The officer stopped a subject in the area and asked him what his name was. The subject gave a name and a date of birth, but the dispatcher could not find a match with the name and birthdate provided. The officer told the subject that if he didn't provide his real name, he would be arrested for providing false information to a police officer and that he would fingerprint him to find out his real name. The subject then admitted to the officer that he lied about his name because he was worried about missing a court date in San Francisco. The subject, a 56-year old San Francisco resident, had a misdemeanor warrant in San Francisco. He was cited for providing false information to a police officer.

On Saturday, 12-10-16 at 7:17 a.m., the Daly City Parks Department reported a subject who had shown up intoxicated to a work release program on the 700 block of **Niantic Avenue**. The 24-year old San Mateo resident said he drank a beer before coming to the facility. He was arrested and taken to jail.

On Saturday afternoon on 12-10-16, Officer Jackson, Officer Lemere, Officer Shiu and Sgt. Hussain worked a "shoulder tap" detail aimed at detecting and deterring adults from providing alcoholic beverages to minors. Thanks to funding from the North County Prevention Partnership, they went to several establishments that sold alcohol and used an underage decoy to attempt to purchase alcoholic beverages. Three citations were issued to people from three different businesses throughout the city for furnishing alcohol to a minor.

On Sunday, 12-11-16 at 1:14 p.m., a 60-year old South San Francisco resident was shopping at **Sprouts** and realized her purse was open and her wallet was missing. Shortly thereafter, the victim learned that a subject tried to use her credit cards at Target. This case will be referred to investigators pending surveillance footage from both stores.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 12-05-16 between 9:40 a.m. and 10:55 a.m., an unknown male (pictured below) forced open a door to the downstairs living area of a residence on the unit block of **Lincoln Court**. The suspect stole Nike Air Jordan shoes, clothing, men's watches, clothing and electronics. The suspect was last seen leaving in a 4 door black Acura TSX with "Hanmi" dealer plates. On Tuesday, 12-06-16 at 12:35 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 400 block of **South Hill Boulevard** on a report of an interrupted residential burglary. Dispatchers advised that the suspects were wearing black masks and got into a red 4 door vehicle, possibly a Dodge SUV. The victim said she just arrived home and was parking her vehicle when she saw the subjects run out of her residence. The suspects entered the residence through a second story window and stole an Apple Macbook Pro, Tiffany jewelry and other items yet to be determined. This investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Sunday, 12-11-16 between 7:45 a.m. and 7:57 a.m., a jewelry store at the **St. Francis Square** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who pried open the rear door and stole jewelry. This investigation is continuing.
