When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 12-14-16 at 1:51 a.m., a 50-year old subject was sleeping on the ground in front of a business on the 6900 block of **Mission Street**. The subject was a sex registrant who failed to register as one. He was arrested for this offense.

On Wednesday, 12-14-16 at 5:36 p.m., Officer Murillo and Officer Clinkscales were working a plainclothes detail assigned to work a burglary suppression detail at the **Serramonte Shopping Center**. While on patrol, they saw an occupied parked vehicle and contacted the occupants. Officer Clinkscales approached the vehicle and saw a subject in the driver’s seat who had a glass jar containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana on his lap. After seeing and smelling an odor of marijuana in the vehicle, the officer asked the subject if could search the vehicle. The subject, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, consented to a search, and the officer found a small baggie of marijuana in the subject’s pocket. Officer Murillo contacted the subject in the passenger seat and asked him to exit the vehicle. The subject spontaneously told the officer that he had brass knuckles and a knife, as well as marijuana in his hand. Officer Murillo found those items and 27 Xanax pills in his pocket for which the subject did not have a prescription for. Officer Clinkscales asked the subject who was originally in the driver’s seat if there were any weapons inside the vehicle, and the subject said there was one under the driver’s seat. Officer Clinkscales recovered a loaded firearm under the driver’s side floor mat. After placing the subject under arrest for the firearm, the officers searched the vehicle and found a digital scale, more marijuana, and a bottle of codeine. The second passenger of the vehicle was a 2-year old child. Officers contacted the child’s mother to take custody of the child. When the mother, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, arrived, she had a credit card in her possession that didn’t belong to her. The subject who had the firearm was arrested for being in possession of a loaded firearm in a vehicle, possession of a stolen firearm, possession of marijuana for the purpose of sales and for child endangerment. His passenger, a 19-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of metal knuckles, possession of marijuana for the purpose of sales, possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of sales, and for possession of prescription pills without a prescription. The mother was cited for misappropriation of lost property and her child was released to the grandparent.

On Thursday, 12-15-16 at 1:00 p.m., Officer Sabins was dispatched to **Jefferson High School** on a report of an 18-year old student who gave edible marijuana (in brownie and candy form) to five students. The students admitted to ingesting the edible marijuana but they all said they did not purchase it. The 18-year old student was booked in jail, and the school officials suspended the other students.

On Friday, 12-16-16 at 7:56 a.m., officers were dispatched to the Starbucks on **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of a male subject who was harassing customers. The manager reported that he week before, he asked the subject to leave and not to return. The subject, a 75-year old South San Francisco resident, was arrested for trespassing.

The following day at 3:45 a.m., officers were dispatched to the **24 Hour Fitness** facility on the report of a trespassing subject who had been admonished multiple times to not return to the business. The reporting party said the suspect had been constantly returning to the business and did not have a membership. The reporting party said the subject had a strong stale urine smell, had attempted to go to the sauna and was asleep on a bench in the basketball court. When officers woke the subject and asked him to sit up, the subject reached into his pocket as if he was concealing something and resisted the officer's request to pull his hand out of his pocket. The subject was the same one in the case above, and he was arrested for trespassing and for resisting arrest.

On Friday, 12-16-16 at 6:42 p.m., Officer Clinkscales was dispatched to the AT&T store on **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of a suspicious male inside the store. The officer contacted the suspect outside of the store, and the officer noticed the subject could not control the movement of his hands, had rapid speech and kept looking over his shoulder as if someone was following him. The officer asked the subject if he had used drugs recently, and the subject admitted to using methamphetamine a week prior. The subject agreed to do some field sobriety tests, and the officer determined he was under the influence of a controlled substance. The subject, a 46-year old San Francisco resident, was booked for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Saturday, 12-17-16 at approximately 12:07 a.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Fairview Avenue** on a medical call/domestic dispute. A 23-year old resident with severe injuries was taken to San Francisco General Hospital where she succumbed to her injuries a short time later. The victim's 24-year old boyfriend was on scene, and officers arrested him for murder. This investigation is ongoing.

On Sunday, 12-18-16 at 4:05 p.m., Officer Clinkscales and Officer Bowman were dispatched to the **TJ Maxx** store on a report of two subjects concealing merchandise into a bag. As the officers arrived on scene, the two subjects exited the store, and when officers told one subject to stop, the subject dropped a bag and ran towards the parking lot and ran into a person in the lot who received minor lacerations to his arms and knees during the incident. When the officers and the loss prevention officer were attempting to subdue the subject, a 22-year old Fairfield resident, the subject kicked the loss prevention officer. Both subjects admitted to stealing items from various stores in the Westlake Shopping Center. The first subject was arrested for a parole violation, robbery, resisting arrest, battery, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for possession of burglary tools. The second subject, a 24-year old Oakland resident, was arrested for shoplifting, possession of burglary tools and for conspiracy to commit a crime.

On Sunday, 12-18-16 at 6:35 p.m., two 12-year old Daly City residents were identified as being involved in an arson that occurred on the 600 block of **Lake Merced Boulevard**. The subjects set fire to a cardboard box next to a dumpster in a carport. Westlake Security extinguished the fire. The subjects were released to their parents. This case is being referred to the Juvenile authorities.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 12-15-16 at 10:24 p.m., officers were dispatched to the unit block of **Wakefield Avenue** on a report of an armed robbery that occurred a few minutes prior. The 44-year old reporting party/victim said he had just arrived home and parked his vehicle in the driveway. He said his wife was walking to the house when he saw a vehicle double parked on the wrong side of the street in front of his neighbor's house. The victim found it suspicious and told his wife to call the police. The victim said the driver of the vehicle, described as a black male wearing a dark gray jacket with the hood up and a mask covering his nose and mouth and carrying a small black handgun, exited the vehicle and told the victim to shut up and give him the money. Shortly after, two passengers in the vehicle exited as well. The other two subjects, described as black males with dark jackets, had masks covering the lower portion of their faces. The victim told the suspect he did not have anything on him but pulled out approximately \$80 in cash from his pants pocket. He said the suspect didn't believe him and frisked him with one hand, while he held the gun in the other hand. The suspect didn't take anything else and fled in a late 1990's or early 2000's model silver Lexus GS300 or GS400, with tinted windows, a moon roof, spoiler and rims. Officers were not able to locate the vehicle.

On Saturday, 12-17-16 at 1:08 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **Evergreen Avenue** and **Winchester Street** on a report of a carjacking that just occurred. The victim, a 29-year old San Francisco resident, said he was a driver for Uber and had two customers in his vehicle and approached the intersection of Evergreen Avenue and Winchester Street when a black Chevrolet Suburban ran a stop sign and almost caused a collision by suddenly stopping. The victim said four Hispanic males got of the vehicle and one suspect threw a beer can at his car. The victim said one of the subjects stood in front of his car, one subject was punched him through his open driver's side window, while another subject opened the passenger door and started punching him. The victim said they finally left after a couple of minutes and ran back to their vehicle. The victim said he noticed his cell phone was missing and got out of his vehicle to see if the phone was thrown in the street. The victim said when he got out of his vehicle, the driver of the Suburban got out of his vehicle and said, "You want me to pull my gun?" The victim said the other two subjects jumped out of the vehicle and started running towards where he was. The victim said the first suspect got into the driver's seat of his vehicle and drove away with the two Uber passengers still inside the vehicle. Officers from the Broadmoor Police Department located the victim's unoccupied vehicle in San Francisco. The suspects are currently outstanding. The first suspect was described as a Hispanic male, early 30's, 5'6", 150 lbs., medium build with a goatee, wearing jeans and a red jacket with stripes. The second suspect was described as a Hispanic male, late 20's, long hair, no facial hair, wearing a black jacket, pants and hat. The third suspect was described as a Hispanic male, approximately 5'9", 180 lbs., "husky" build, goatee and short hair, wearing a black jacket and pants. The victim was unable to provide a description for the fourth suspect. The victim did not suffer any injuries and refused medical attention. Investigators are assigned to this case.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary and one attempted residential burglary during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-13-16 between 12:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m., a residence on the 200 block of **Lakeshire Drive** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who pried open the front door. The suspect(s) ransacked each room. The property stolen is still to be determined.

On Friday, 12-16-16 at approximately 5:20 p.m., a residence on the 100 block of **Los Olivos Avenue** was the victim of an attempted burglary. A resident said he heard a loud sound in the backyard and noticed the rear door was broken and "split", but the suspect did not gain entry.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one attempted commercial burglary during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-13-16 at 11:57 p.m., three unknown suspects attempted to pry open the pharmacy roll up door at the Walgreen's on **Mission Street**. No entry was made.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were six vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Burlington Coat Factory** parking lot—a bag containing cosmetics was taken from the front passenger seat of a 2016 Toyota Prius. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-12-16 between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.
- **PetSmart** parking lot—a backpack containing miscellaneous property and \$3,000 in cash was taken from the front passenger seat of a 2016 Hyundai Elantra. The left front window was smashed. Occurred on 12-13-16 between 4:50 p.m. and 4:59 p.m.
- 100 block of **Canterbury Avenue**—tools were taken from a utility box of a 2016 Ford F250. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 1:00 p.m. on 12-13-16 and 5:05 a.m. on 12-14-16.
- 200 block of **Rio Verde Street**—nothing was taken from a 2015 Acura MDX. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred at an unknown time on 12-14-16. **On-line report.
- 300 block of **Coronado Avenue**—sunglasses, paperwork and artwork was taken from a 2010 Chevrolet Camaro. An unknown window was smashed. Occurred between 9:55 p.m. on 12-13-16 and 12:10 p.m. on 12-14-16. **On-line report.
- 1400 block of **South Mayfair Avenue**—tools were taken from a 2003 Toyota Tundra. The left front window was smashed. Occurred between 10:00 p.m. on 12-18-16 and 5:35 a.m. on 12-19-16.

Stolen Vehicles

There were four vehicles stolen during the past week. Two were recovered.

Scams/Other

Fraudulent Car Sale via “Offer Up” App

On Tuesday, 12-13-16 at 9:17 p.m., a 51-year old Daly City resident said the day before, she inquired about purchasing a vehicle for \$2,000 via the “Offer Up” application on her smart phone. The victim said she replied to the seller, and there were numerous emails exchanges between her and the seller, “Sabrina Maxwell”. The victim said she also received emails from who she thought was “eBay Motors”

who were helping to facilitate the sale of the vehicle. The victim said she asked the seller if she could purchase the vehicle using her credit card, and she said she was notified by eBay Motors that she would have to send cash. The victim said the seller advised her to purchase eBay gift cards and provide her with the gift card serial numbers and security codes. The victim was told the vehicle would be delivered to her at 8:00 p.m. When the vehicle was not delivered, the victim said she sent numerous emails and did not receive a response. She said she then contacted eBay, who said there was no record of the purchase. The email looked similar to eBay, but it was fraudulent.

“Hacked Computer” Scam

On Monday, 12-12-16 and Tuesday, 12-13-16, an 80-year old Daly City resident was the victim of theft via false pretenses by an unknown caller who convinced the victim to send two \$500 payments via “MoneyGram” to fix and debug her “hacked” computer. The victim she received a call from a man named “Adam Wilson” who convinced her that her computer was hacked, and all her private data would be compromised unless she made a \$500 payment so he could remotely fix her computer. The victim agreed to purchase a “MoneyGram” and gave the caller the information. The next day, the victim received another call from “Adam Wilson” who asked for more money to fix the problem. The victim once again purchased a “MoneyGram” for \$500 and provided it to the suspect. When the suspect called and asked for more money, the victim became suspicious and contacted her daughter who advised her to call the police. We advised the victim that there were no leads and advised her to change her passwords to any accounts she feels may have been compromised. Please do not fall prey to these types of phone calls.
