When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Thursday, 12-29-16 at 1:31 a.m., Officer Wagnon conducted a traffic stop on the 2600 block of **Geneva Avenue**. This resulted in the arrested of a 33-year old San Francisco resident for possession of a stolen vehicle, vehicle theft with priors, personate to make others liable, possession of burglary tools and for an outstanding no-bail felony warrant issued by the San Francisco Sheriff's Department.

On Thursday, 12-29-16 at 8:06 a.m., officers were dispatched to **St. Andrews church** on a report of a subject leaning up against a bench in front of the church. Officers arrived to find the subject with several abrasions to the left of his forehead and appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The subject was unable to communicate to officers any information due to his level of intoxication and was arrested for disorderly conduct.

On Thursday, 12-29-16 at 10:52 a.m., Officer Andrade was doing a routine check of the Seven Eleven store on **Hillside Boulevard** and was flagged down by an employee who said a female had purchased tobacco for a minor and that the minor was still in the store. When Officer Andrade asked the subject for his name and date of birth, the subject gave his brother's name. The subject, a 19-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for providing false information to the police officer and also for an outstanding warrant from Alameda County for making criminal threats.

On Saturday, 12-31-16 at 12:48 p.m., Officer Bowman and Officer Brenes were dispatched to the unit block of 100 **Canyon Drive** on a report of an occupied suspicious vehicle. The officers saw a subject sleeping inside the vehicle and woke up the subject. The subject said he was just taking a nap. The officers smelled marijuana in the vehicle and asked the subject to step out of the vehicle. Officer Brenes searched the subject's person and found miscellaneous loose rounds in his jacket pocket, as well as an empty magazine in his pants pocket. Officer Brenes asked the subject if he had a firearm, and he told him, “not on me”. The officer asked him if the firearm was in the vehicle, and the subject

said no, but that there was a large knife and marijuana. The officers found a 12" unsheathed knife, a bottle of methadone pills not prescribed to the subject, two baggies of marijuana and fireworks in the vehicle. The subject also had a rifle registered to him in his trunk. The officer asked why the subject told him there were no firearms in the vehicle, and the subject said he forgot it was there. The subject, a 22-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for being in possession of a controlled substance, carrying a concealed dirk or dagger and possession of fireworks without a permit.

On Saturday, 12-31-16 at 7:46 p.m., Officer Ortiz checked on a vehicle that was stopped near the intersection of **Schwerin Street** and **Cypress Lane**. The driver said he was waiting for a friend. Dispatchers advised the driver had a suspended license. Officer Ortiz asked the subject if he had any guns, knives or drugs in the vehicle, and the driver said no. When Officer Ortiz searched the vehicle, he found metal knuckles in the driver's side door. The officer cited the driver, a 32-year old San Francisco resident, for being in possession of metal knuckles and for driving with a suspended driver's license.

On Sunday, 01-01-17 at 11:23 a.m., a 24-year old Daly City resident said she was jogging at Gellert Park 20 minutes prior and was walking towards her residence. When she got near **Wembly Drive** and **Parkrose Avenue**, she said she felt something on her back side and realized a subject grabbed her butt. The victim could only describe the subject as a dark skinned, possible Hispanic male, approximately 30 years old, wearing a white and silver hoodie with the hood pulled over his head. The victim said the subject ran away. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate the subject. The victim was not physically harmed.

On Sunday, 01-01-17 at 5:44 p.m., Officer Clinkscales was dispatched to a residence on the 300 block of **Frankfort Street** on a report of a subject hearing voices. Dispatchers told the officer that the subject said he had recently consumed ecstasy. When the officer talked to the subject, the subject said he was not hearing voices but believed that people inside of the residence were plotting against him. Officer Clinkscales determined the subject was under the influence of a controlled substance. The 48-year old Daly City resident was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

## Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-27-16 at 2:02 p.m., a 28-year old male Pacifica resident reported he went to the **Wells Fargo Bank** at Serramonte Shopping Center, gave his 4-year old daughter his cell phone and told her to sit in the chair and watch videos while he conducted his bank transaction. The reporting party said he went back to his daughter and saw that she was not holding the cell phone in her hands and asked her what happened to the phone. The daughter said an unknown male hit her left hand with his fist and took the cell phone away from her and left the bank. The victim gave conflicting descriptions about the suspect and showed no visible injuries. This investigation is continuing.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Friday, 12-30-16 between 6:15 a.m. and 6:35 a.m., an unknown suspect entered an apartment on the 600 block of **Serramonte Boulevard** through an open kitchen window and took cash from two envelopes that were on the kitchen table.

- **Bank of America** parking lot (Gellert Boulevard)—a Coach purse containing cash was taken from under the front passenger seat of a 2007 Acura RDX. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-27-16 between 4:55 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.
- 600 block of **Crocker Avenue**—a Karaoke machine was taken from the trunk area of a 2007 Honda CRV. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-31-16 at 6:10 p.m.
- Unit block of **Eastmoor Avenue**—a HP laptop was taken from the front seat of a Ford F150. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 01-01-17 between 3:00 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- **Hillside Boulevard/Alp Avenue**—a backpack containing a Lenovo laptop was taken from a 2013 Ford Explorer. The rear window was smashed. Occurred between 4:00 p.m. on 01-01-17 and 6:00 a.m. on 01-02-17.

- 200 block of **Palmcrest Drive**—a 2002 Honda Civic. Occurred between 1:00 p.m. on 12-29-16 and 1:55 p.m. on 12-30-16.
- 100 block of **Shipley Avenue**—a 1994 Honda Accord. Occurred on 12-29-16 between 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. \*\*Recovered by Daly City P.D. on 12-31-16.
- The owner of a 2013 Lexus CT 200 used a third party company called “HyreCar” on 12-23-16 to rent his vehicle to a subject. The renter didn’t return the vehicle by 12-30-16 as per contract. This investigation is continuing.
- Unit block of **Oceanside Drive**—a 1994 Acura Integra. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 01-01-17 and 9:00 a.m. on 01-02-17.

Christmas tree recycling collection is available on regular service days. Republic Services (formerly Allied Waste Services) requests that you please follow these collection guidelines when placing your tree out for collection:

- Trees must be cut into 4 foot sections.
- The stands, lights and decorations must be removed.
- Flocked trees will be collected but not recycled.
- Multi-family residents must call Customer Service at (650) 756-1130 to arrange for pick-up.
- Place trees next to yard waste bin for removal.
- After January 31, please cut your tree in pieces to fit into your green waste collection bin.
