When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 04-03-17 at 3:26 p.m., an unknown subject stole a package belonging to a resident of an apartment complex on the 300 block of **Philip Drive**. Investigators were able to determine the identity of the subject and contacted him at his apartment in the same complex. The subject, a 35-year old Daly City resident, was on probation and subject to search and seizure. Officers found numerous packages not belonging to him, as well as methamphetamine. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sale, a probation violation, receiving stolen property, possession of person identifying information not belonging to him, and possession of unlawful paraphernalia.

On Tuesday, 04-04-17 at approximately 5:30 p.m., a 16-year old Colma resident was arrested for possession of a large capacity magazine, possession of an unsafe handgun, being a minor in possession of a concealed firearm, being a minor in possession of ammunition, possession of a handgun without a valid handgun safety certificate and possession of an unconventional pistol. This occurred at an apartment on the 300 block of **F Street** in **Colma**, following an on-going disturbance between two groups of students at Jefferson High School. During the investigation of the altercation between the two groups of students, officers located a two-month old “Snapchat” video (on a student’s cell phone) of the subject brandishing a firearm loaded with a high capacity magazine. The officers contacted the subject at his residence, and his mother consented to a search. The subject admitted to being in possession of the firearm and showed where it was hidden, along with the magazines and ammunition. The subject was booked in the Youth Services Center.

On Wednesday, 04-05-17, at 9:23 p.m., Officer Cook and Officer Gregorio were involved in a pursuit which began in the **Westlake** area and was terminated in South San Francisco. Further investigation lead to the identification an apprehension of all of the occupants in the vehicle. The driver, a 28-year old male Salinas resident, was arrested for evading, obstructing/resisting a peace officer, false

registration, driving with a suspended license, commercial burglary, possession of stolen property, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for a parole violation. The second suspect, a 29-year old male San Jose resident, was arrested for being a convicted felon in possession of pepper spray, possession of burglary tools, commercial burglary, possession of stolen property, conspiracy to commit a crime and for an outstanding felony warrant. The third suspect, a 26-year old female San Jose resident, was arrested for possession of identification of more than 10 persons, impersonating, possession a forged check, possession of stolen property, commercial burglary, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for two outstanding felony warrants.

On Friday, 04-07-17 at 1:00 a.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the 100 block of **Mariposa Avenue** on the report of a possible prowler in the house. The reporting party said she believed there was someone inside her house or in the yard. Officers saw that the reporting party appeared to be under the influence of a controlled substance and conducted tests to see if she was under the influence. The 33-year old resident was subsequently arrested for being in possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Saturday, 04-08-17 at 1:03 a.m., subsequent to a check of a suspicious vehicle on the 500 block of **Florence Street**, Officer Fulmore arrested a 42-year old Daly City resident for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) for sales, transportation of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) for sales, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for two outstanding warrants. During the same encounter, the officer arrested the subject's girlfriend, a 41-year old Daly City resident, for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) for sales, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for possession of drug paraphernalia.

On Saturday, 04-08-17 at 6:13 p.m., Officer Clinkscales conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle at **Schwerin Street** and **MacDonald Avenue** when the driver drove off at a high rate of speed before the officer could make contact. A pursuit ensued, and the vehicle was found abandoned a short while later in San Francisco. The subject, a 37-year old Antioch resident, was apprehended on 04-11-17 and booked for evading a police officer, possession of a stolen vehicle, and possession of ammunition.

On Saturday, 04-08-17 at 10:25 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **Gellert Boulevard** and **Hickey Boulevard** on a report of an intoxicated subject. The 61-year old reporting party said he was driving southbound on Gellert Boulevard when he saw a subject lying in the #2 lane of Gellert Boulevard. He said he pulled over and woke up the subject and walked him to the curb. The subject, a 22-year old Daly City resident, was subsequently arrested for possession of a controlled substance (cocaine) and for being intoxicated in public.

On Sunday, 04-09-17 at 9:52, officers responded to the intersection of **Westlake Avenue** and **Willits Street** on a report of a Hispanic male adult trying to open car doors in the neighborhood. The anonymous reporting party thought the subject was most likely on "angel dust". Officers arrived and met with the subject matching the description. The subject was very incoherent and appeared to be under the influence. After failing to adequately pass the field sobriety tests, the subject, a 47-year old Hayward resident, was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance and for being in possession of a controlled substance (prescription pills).

On Sunday, 04-16-17 at 1:38 a.m., a 36-year old Daly City resident was arrested for driving under the influence of drugs (methamphetamine), being in possession of unlawful drug paraphernalia and being in possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). This occurred following a call for service in which the subject's vehicle collided with a parked vehicle on the unit block of **Hillcrest Drive**.

On Sunday, 04-16-17 at 4:59 a.m., Officer Soyangco and Officer Fulmore were dispatched to the Public Storage facility on **Mission Street** on a report of loud banging coming from inside the complex. The officers contacted two subjects who said they were there to pick up property belonging to a friend. Several storage units in the complex were burglarized. After officers interviewed the subjects, they arrested one subject, a 32-year old Pacifica resident, for possession of a controlled substance for sales, transportation of a controlled substance for sales, possession of burglary tools, commercial burglary, conspiracy to commit a crime, possession of a switchblade knife and for being under the

influence of a controlled substance. The other subject, a 38-year old Pacifica resident, was arrested for commercial burglary and conspiracy to commit a crime.

On 04-17-17 at 2:00 p.m., a 17-year old **Westmoor High School** student was found in possession of marijuana, marijuana for sale, possession of prescribed drugs and possession of a stun gun on school grounds. The subject sold a gram of marijuana to another student. Prosecution is sought against the student, and he was released to his mother.

On Thursday, 04-20-17 at 9:19 a.m., a 14-year old student at **Pollicita Middle School** was arrested for being in possession of edible marijuana and a lighter. He was released to the custody of his mother.

On Saturday, 04-22-17 at 9:42 p.m., a 49-year old Santa Clara resident was arrested for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), being under the influence of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and resisting arrest. This occurred after the subject was stopped for jaywalking at the corner of **Bellevue Avenue** and **Guttenberg Street**.

On Wednesday, 04-27-17 at 9:59 p.m., Officer Tualalelei noticed a subject sitting in a vehicle at the **Home Depot** parking lot. The subject was attempting to not make eye contact with the officer. The officer ran the license plate and determined the vehicle was stolen from San Francisco a week earlier. The subject, a 32-year San Francisco resident, was subsequently arrested for vehicle theft, possession of stolen property, possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of drug paraphernalia (pipe) and for outstanding warrants.

On Friday, 04-28-17 at 12:39 p.m., a 15-year old **Westmoor High School** student pulled the school fire alarm while school was in session, causing more than 1,600 students and staff to evacuate the school temporarily. The subject was placed under arrest and released to his uncle with a signed promise to appear in court.

On Saturday, 04-29-17 at 12:47 a.m., Officer Fulmore was on patrol in the area of **Bel Mar Avenue** and **Park Plaza Drive** and saw four subjects walking to a vehicle with a paper license plate. When he contacted the subjects once they got inside the vehicle, the officer smelled an odor of marijuana. This stop resulted in the arrest of a 17-year old South San Francisco resident for possession of a controlled substance (cocaine) for sales, transportation of a controlled substance (cocaine) for sales, possession of marijuana for sale, committing an adult offense by a juvenile and conspiracy to commit a crime. Another subject, a 20-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance (cocaine) for sales, committing a felony while out on bail, conspiracy to commit a crime, and for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Robberies

There were eleven robberies during the past four weeks.

On Wednesday, 04-05-17 at 2:04 p.m., a 36-year old transient subject was arrested for robbery, commercial burglary, and possession of burglary tools after he was detained for shoplifting. The **Macy's** loss prevention officer was punched four times in the chest.

On Monday, 04-17-17 at approximately 11:25 a.m., a uniformed loss prevention officer and an assistant manager at **Lucky's** were the victims of a robbery by two unknown subjects who threatened bodily harm as they left the store with merchandise. Investigators were able to determine the identity of one the subjects, a 21-year old San Francisco resident, and arrested him on 04-29-17 for robbery and conspiracy. The investigation is continuing for the identity of the other subject.

On Tuesday, 04-18-17 at approximately 11:20 a.m., a 24-year old Daly City resident was the victim of a robbery of her cell phone by two unknown subjects as the victim was walking on the 200 block of **Hillcrest Drive**, towards the Daly City BART station. Witnesses were able to identify one of the

subjects, a 16-year old Oakland resident. He was arrested and booked into the Youth Service Center for robbery and conspiracy. The investigation is continuing for the identity of the other subject.

On Tuesday, 04-18-17 at approximately 6:20 p.m., a 17-year old San Bruno resident was the victim of a robbery by four subjects via punches and kicks to the face and body. The victim said he was waiting for a ride on the 300 block of **Gellert Boulevard** when the subjects walked by him. The subjects fled the area. The victim sustained minor visual injury to his face, hands and forearms. The investigation is continuing.

On Wednesday, 04-19-17 at 8:14 p.m., a 42-year old Hayward resident was arrested for robbery, possession of unlawful drug paraphernalia (glass crack pipe) and an outstanding warrant, after he was detained for shoplifting at **Macy's**.

On Thursday, 04-20-17 at 6:55 p.m., a store clerk at the Dollar Tree on **Geneva Avenue** confronted a female subject who shoplifted items. The subject threw bleach at the clerk's face and clothing and fled the business. Officers are working on leads to identify the subject. The 57-year old clerk experienced burning to her skin and eyes.

On Friday, 04-21-17 at approximately 9:00 p.m., a 27-year old Daly City resident was the victim of an armed robbery and conspiracy to commit a crime by two 17-year old subjects who took the subject's iPhone 7 and wallet. This occurred as the victim was walking home on **Valley Street** from the Colma BART station. Officers were able to determine the identity of the two subjects and subsequently booked them into the Youth Services Center.

On Sunday, 04-23-17 at 6:25 p.m., an 18-year old Patterson resident was arrested for robbery after he pushed and elbowed loss prevention officers at **Macy's** after he stole clothing.

On Thursday, 04-27-17 at 7:51 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of **John Daly Boulevard** and **Junipero Serra Boulevard** on the report of a male subject who grabbed a cell phone from an unknown female subject and took off running. Officers were able to track down two subjects who were running in the area. One of the subjects, an 11-year old male from San Francisco, had marijuana in his pocket. He was booked into the Youth Services Center. The other subject, a 14-year old female from San Francisco, was issued a promise to appear. The victim, an 18-yr old Daly City resident, said she was unharmed during the incident.

On Friday, 04-28-17 at approximately 5:20 p.m., an 18-year old San Francisco resident was the victim of a strong arm robbery via intimidation by eight unknown suspects. This occurred on the 200 block of **Woodrow Street**. The loss was a backpack. The suspects were last seen running northbound on Woodrow Street into the Marchbanks Park. This investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, 04-29-17 at 7:34 p.m., an 18-year old South San Francisco resident was the victim of a strong arm robbery by three unknown suspects who took the victim's "VSS" black and white hat and \$10. This occurred at the Triton Gas Station on **Callan Boulevard**. This case is suspended pending further leads.

Residential Burglaries

There were four residential burglaries and one attempted residential burglary during the past four weeks.

On Monday, 04-17-17 between 7:00 a.m. and 4:40 p.m., a residence on the 100 block of **Alta Vista Way** was burglarized by an unknown subject who broke the door frame of the front door. The loss was a laptop.

Between 11:20 a.m. on Tuesday, 04-18-17 and 2:20 p.m. on Thursday, 04-20-17, a residence on the 700 block of **Skyline Drive** was burglarized by an unknown suspect who pried the rear window of her residence. The loss was several items of jewelry.

On Saturday, 04-22-17 at 6:00 p.m. a resident on the 3200 block of **San Jose Avenue** reported a subject opening the back door to her residence. With the assistance of San Francisco P.D. officers, the subject, a 19-year old San Francisco resident, was detained and subsequently arrested for burglary.

On Wednesday, 04-26-17 at approximately 2:30 p.m., two residents on the 100 block of **Wembley Drive** were the victims of an interrupted residential burglary via window smash of the rear sliding glass door of their home. One subject was described as a black male, early 20's, wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and dark pants. The other subject was described as a black male, early 20's, wearing a dark colored hoodie with dark pants. The subjects were in a new model bronze Infinity FX35 SUV.

On Monday, 04-03-17 between 9:50 p.m. and 10:15 p.m., an unknown subject removed the motion sensor lights, moved a video camera and tampered with a circuit breaker box to a residence on the unit block of **Oakmont Drive**. No entry was made into the residence

Commercial Burglaries

There were eight commercial burglaries and two attempted commercial burglaries during the past four weeks.

On Monday, 04-03-17 at approximately 10:30 p.m., two subjects drilled and pried open the change machine door at M and R Car Wash on **Sullivan Avenue** and took quarters. Surveillance footage showed one subject prying the door and the other subject who appeared to be washing a vehicle. The license plate was obtained, and with the assistance of Rohnert Park P.D., the two subjects, a 38-year old female and a 41-year old male, both from Turlock, were arrested.

On Wednesday, 04-05-17 at approximately 9:23 p.m., the **Burlington Coat Factory** store was the victim of a commercial burglary by unknown subjects. A Westlake patrol security officer provided the officers with a vehicle description, and officers initiated a pursuit which ended in South San Francisco. Three subjects, a 26-year old female from San Jose, a 29-year old male from San Jose and a 28-year old male from Salinas were booked into jail for commercial burglary and conspiracy to commit a crime.

On Wednesday, 04-12-17 at 5:00 p.m., **Dick's Sporting Goods** was the victim of a commercial burglary when three subjects, only described as black females ranging from 20-25 and varying in height and weight, stole approximately 70 Golden State Warrior basketball jerseys from the store. The subjects fled in a silver two door Honda Civic with an unknown license plate.

On Sunday, 04-16-17, a storage locker at the Public Storage facility on **Mission Street** was burglarized by an unknown subject who forced entry via tearing the sheet rock off of an interior wall. The loss was miscellaneous clothing, several boxes of tennis shoes and a bag of purses.

Between Thursday, 04-27-17 and Friday 04-28-17 at an unknown time, the **Thomas Pollicita Middle School** was burglarized by an unknown subject(s) who stole a two Samsung tablets and an iPad. Entry was made via an unknown means.

On Saturday, 04-29-17 between 6:40 p.m. and 7:43 p.m., an unknown suspect broke the lock from a locker in the men's locker room of the **24-Hour Fitness** facility and took the victim's wallet containing a credit card and debit card. The subject immediately used the cards.

On Saturday, 04-30-17 at 1:50 a.m., an unknown subject smashed the front glass door of the Red Bowl Noodle restaurant on **Mission Street** and stole money from the cash register. The suspect is only described as a white or Hispanic male, early 20's, thin build, black hair with goatee, wearing a baggy white t-shirt, black jeans, brown boots, and a Cincinnati Reds baseball hat.

On Sunday, 04-30-17 at 1:56 a.m., an unknown subject threw a concrete block through the front glass window of Subway Sandwich on **Mission Street** and attempted to steal from the register. Aside from a soda, there was no loss. The suspect is the same as the one in the case above. Here is the subject:



On Monday, 04-03-17 at approximately 5:04 a.m., an unknown male attempted to drill the locks of the change machine at M&R Car Wash on **Sullivan Avenue** but left after failing to open the machine.

On Tuesday, 04-11-17 at approximately 5:51 p.m., two subjects attempted to pull up a roll up locked window screen to gain entry into **Fernando Rivera Middle School**. No entry was made. The first described as a black male approximately 5'7", 150 lbs., wearing a brown shirt and khaki pants. The second subject is described as a white male, approximately 5'6", 140 lbs., wearing all black clothing.

On Wednesday, 04-05-17, a 46-year old Daly City resident saw an ad on Craigslist for a 1997 Toyota Tacoma pick up for sale. The reporting party e-mailed the seller regarding his interest in buying it, and he received a phone call from the seller. The reporting party said he could purchase the pickup with cash and that he could meet her that day. The seller responded saying she no longer lived in the area but that she “prearranged the deal” with Amazon, saying it was ready to be shipped once they received payment. The seller e-mailed the reporting party saying she was going to “register the transaction” with Amazon, and they would provide him with “step-by-step” details on how to complete the transaction. The reporting party said he received an e-mail from “Amazon” who instructed him to make payments via purchasing Amazon Gift Cards. The following day the reporting party received an e-mail from Amazon confirming payment but that there was a problem and that he needed to send an additional \$1,000 for insurance. When the reporting party did not receive the pickup by the estimated date, he attempted to contact the seller and Amazon with no results.
