When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 05-09-17 at 8:30 p.m., Officer Murillo and Officer Clinkscales were working an auto burglary suppression detail near the In N Out restaurant (a site where numerous auto burglaries have occurred) and saw a vehicle with no headlights on that did not come to a complete stop at the intersection of **92nd Street** and **Sullivan Avenue**. Officer Clinkscales asked the driver and passenger if they had anything in the vehicle that they should know about, and the driver stated he had a gun he owned in his backpack. The officer found a Glock 9mm firearm, as well as a fully loaded magazine (31 rounds) inside the backpack. The subjects said they were in the area to visit girls they knew near In N Out. The driver, a 23-year old Hayward resident, was arrested for possession of a concealed firearm in a vehicle, possession of a large capacity magazine and for an outstanding warrant from Napa County. The passenger, a 23-year old San Francisco resident, was released.

On Wednesday, 05-10-17 at approximately 10:29 p.m., a 42-year old San Francisco resident was the victim of an assault with a deadly weapon via knives and attempted robbery by a 24-year old Richmond resident and a 21-year old San Francisco resident. This occurred at the El Camino Inn on **Mission Street**. The victim, a hotel clerk, said one of the subjects came to the night window and wanted to rent a room. The subject gave the clerk an identification card that didn't match his description, and the clerk would not accept the identification. The clerk said the subject became upset and left, screeching his tires as he was leaving. The victim left the desk and ran after the vehicle to confront the subject about screeching his tires. As the victim knocked on the window of the vehicle, he said another subject exited the vehicle and came after him with knives, swinging them as both of the subjects advanced toward him. The victim said one subject punched him in the face and believed he was going to be robbed. The victim's wife came outside called the police. Other officers found the vehicle matching the description at Alemany and Sickles Street in San Francisco. The subjects were positively identified by the victims, and they were arrested for assault with a deadly weapon, attempted robbery, conspiracy to commit a crime, impersonate to make another liable, misappropriation of lost property and for possession of stolen property.

On Thursday, 05-11-17 at approximately 2:20 p.m., a 10-year old South San Francisco resident was found to be in possession of a black BB gun on school grounds at the **Susan B. Anthony School**. The student was suspended from school and released to his father, pending prosecution.

On Friday, 05-12-17 at 1:22 p.m., a 16-year old student pulled the fire alarm at **Westmoor High School** while school was in session, causing more than 1,600 students and staff to temporarily evacuate the school. Subsequently the student was found to be in possession of marijuana, via cannabis oil in a smoking instrument ("vape pen"), on school grounds. The student was placed under arrest and released to his mother pending prosecution.

On Friday, 05-12-17 at 2:30 p.m., Officer Chittenden was dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **West Cavour Street** on a report of a noise complaint. The reporting party said his neighbor was playing drums excessively loud and that this was an ongoing issue. The reporting party wanted the subject cited. The officer noted the noise was excessively loud—hearing it from approximately five houses away from the subject's house. The officer cited the subject, a 34-year old Daly City resident, for a noise ordinance violation.

On Sunday, 05-14-17 at 5:45 p.m., Officer Taylor was dispatched to the area of **Lake Merced Boulevard** and **Belmar Avenue** on the report of an off-duty San Francisco police officer following a stolen vehicle that was wanted in connection with multiple burglaries. Officer Taylor pulled in front of the suspect vehicle, and the driver jerked the vehicle forward and collided with the front bumper of the patrol car. Officer Taylor re-positioned his vehicle so that if the suspect vehicle pulled forward again, the impact would be minimal, but the suspect then pulled forward again and side-swiped Officer Taylor's patrol vehicle. The driver then sped away and side-swiped another patrol car driven by Officer Chittenden. A pursuit ensued, and Officer Taylor saw debris fly from the suspect vehicle, as well as white smoke—leading him to believe the vehicle may have collided with another vehicle. The vehicle soon became disabled and came to a stop on **Lake Merced Boulevard** and **Winston Drive** in San Francisco. The suspect, a 26-year old San Francisco resident, was subsequently arrested for assault with a deadly weapon (vehicle) on a peace officer, possession of a burglary tool, possession of a controlled substance, hit and run collision, being under the influence of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), driving under the influence of a drug, and driving with a suspended driver's license.

Robberies

There was one robbery and three attempted robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 05-11-17 at 3:56 p.m., a manager at the Metro PCS store on **Mission Street** was the victim of a robbery by a male who walked into the store and held a small black semi-automatic handgun in his left hand, pointed it downward near his right hip. The suspect demanded the manager to open the cash drawer and told two people on the sales floor to stay still. The suspect took cash from the cash drawer and left on foot. He is described as a black male, 25 years old, wearing a black baseball hat, green/black hooded sweatshirt, gray/black shorts and black shoes. This case is referred to investigators.

On Monday, 05-08-17 at 6:26 p.m., a 27-year old San Francisco resident was arrested for attempted robbery, commercial burglary and obstructing/delaying a peace officer after he was stopped for stealing merchandise from the **Safeway** store and threatening to strike store manager with a bottle of wine.

On Tuesday, 05-09-17 at 1:16 p.m., officers were dispatched to an attempted strong arm robbery which was occurring at the Bank of America ATM on **Mission Street**. The reporting party said he was sitting in his car and saw a subject who was trying to grab money from someone who was getting money from the ATM. The suspect drove away in a gold colored 1990-2005 4-door Honda. Both the victim and the suspect were gone upon officer arrival. This investigation is continuing.

On Wednesday, 05-10-17 at 8:16 p.m., two Daly City residents, 16 and 17-year olds, were walking west on **Serramonte Boulevard** near the McDonald's when one a vehicle with its lights off pulled up alongside them. A subject got out of the passenger side of the vehicle and approached the victims on the sidewalk and asked where they were from. The 16-year old victim said the suspect grabbed his arm and tried to take his cell phone. The victim was able to put the phone in his pocket and started wrestling with the suspect. The victim's friend ran towards Serramonte Center as the victim continued to struggle with the suspect. The victim said then the driver of the suspect vehicle yelled at his friend to get back into the vehicle, and they fled the area. The victim was able to retain his cell phone. The suspect is described as a black male, 6'0", slender build, dark complexion, with an afro, wearing a gray headband, gray hooded sweatshirt and gray sweat pants. The victims did not sustain any injuries.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Wednesday, 05-10-17 between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m., an unknown suspect entered a residence on the 500 block of **Delong Street** via the side garage door and took two laptops and a desktop computer.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Monday, 05-08-17 at 6:39 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of 350 **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of two males with masks who were running out of the shopping area who then got into a gray Jeep Cherokee. Officers could not locate the suspects but found that a money transfer business was burglarized by unknown suspects who accessed the business by going through the roof to gain entry. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were ten vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 1901 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** (parking lot—1st floor)—a backpack containing a MacBook Pro was taken from the right rear floorboard of a 2010 Honda Civic. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 05-08-17 between 4:15 p.m. and 6:15 p.m.
- **Planet Fitness** parking lot—a backpack containing high end cameras, a laptop, a charger, and an external hard drive was taken from the passenger seat of a 2007 Dodge Sprinter van. The front passenger window and right sliding glass door were shattered. Occurred on 05-10-17 at 12:40 p.m.
- 2001 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** (parking lot—3rd floor)—two backpacks and one suitcase containing clothing, a laptop, a kindle, a hand bag, and two shoulder bags were taken from a 2017 Dodge Caravan. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 05-10-17 between 6:30 p.m. and 7:03 p.m.
- **IHOP** parking lot—a backpack containing a wallet, identification, work clothes, miscellaneous paperwork, a passport and credit cards was taken from the front seat of a 2016 Dodge Journey. The right front window was smashed. Occurred on 05-10-17 between 9:45 p.m. and 10:12 p.m.
- **IHOP** parking lot—nothing was taken from a 2017 Jeep Cherokee. The rear trunk window was smashed. Occurred on 05-10-17 between 9:45 p.m. and 10:12 p.m.
- 1901 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** (parking lot—2nd floor)—pocket knives, a cell phone charger and sunglasses were taken from a 2004 Saturn Ion. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred between 7:00 p.m. on 05-11-17 and 1:00 a.m. on 05-12-17.

- **Thornton Beach Vista** parking lot—two backpacks containing school work and school supplies were taken from a 2006 Subaru Outback. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 05-12-17 between 4:45 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Target—a laptop and cell phone were taken from a 2016 Dodge Caravan. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 05-12-17 between 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- **In N Out** parking lot—a Canon T31 camera was taken from the backseat of a 2017 Ford Mustang. The right front window was smashed. Occurred on 05-13-17 between 6:45 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near 85 Degree Bakery—a backpack containing a wallet, credit cards, money, a passport and cosmetics was taken from a 2007 Toyota Yaris. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 05-14-17 at 4:00 p.m.
