



Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 08-01-17 at 4:10 p.m., a 27-year old San Francisco resident was cited for misusing a disabled placard that was not issued to him. This occurred at 331 **Park Plaza Drive**. The subject used his grandfather’s expired placard, and his grandfather was not with him at the time.

On Thursday, 08-03-17 at 7:45 a.m., an officer contacted a subject who appeared to be transient who was sitting on the steps on the 6200 block of **Mission Street**. The officer saw a subject manipulating something in his hands and saw the subject snorting a substance via a straw inserted into a small plastic bottle. The subject did not know the officer was behind him. The officer asked what the subject was snorting, and the subject admitted it was heroin. The subject, a 29-year old Daly City resident, was cited for possession of a controlled substance.

On Thursday, 08-03-17 at 8:20 a.m., Officer Haas was on patrol in the area of **Mission Street** and **Crocker Avenue** and saw a subject drinking from a large red can in a brown paper bag. The officer said the subject looked directly at him and then put the bag inside another bag he was carrying. Officer Haas asked the subject if he had anything illegal on him, and the subject stated he had new needles from a “clean needle exchange”. The officer cited the subject, a 47-year San Francisco resident, for possession of narcotics paraphernalia.

On Saturday, 08-05-17 at 2:32 a.m., Officer Murillo and Officer Ortiz were on patrol and saw a disabled vehicle in the area of **Callan Boulevard** and **Southgate Avenue**. The driver of the vehicle was sitting on the curb near his vehicle. The officers could smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the subject, and the subject told the officers he was hit by another vehicle at Classic Bowl. After officers conducted field sobriety tests on the subject, they determined he was under the influence of alcohol. The subject, a 46-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol and for having a suspended driver’s license. It was later determined that the subject was involved in a collision with an iron gate of a church on Southgate Avenue.

On Saturday, 08-05-17 at 2:40 p.m., Officer McCarthy conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle failing to stop at an intersection at **MacDonald Avenue** and **Schwerin Street**. Officer McCarthy's initial observation of the driver was that he was extremely nervous and would not stop putting his hands in his front pockets while seated in the vehicle. Officer McCarthy smelled and saw marijuana in the vehicle. The subjects said they were on their way to the hemp convention at the Cow Palace. While the officer was waiting for the dispatchers to confirm the driver and passenger's identification, the officer saw the subject push something down under the driver's seat. The officer asked the subject what he had just put under the seat, and the subject admitted it was a gun. Officer McCarthy arrested the subject, a 21-year old San Francisco resident, for being in possession of a concealed firearm, being a felon in possession of a firearm, being a felon carrying a loaded firearm, carrying a concealed loaded firearm and for being in possession of high capacity magazines.

On Sunday, 08-06-17 at 7:45 p.m., Officer Riney was dispatched to **Dick's Sporting Goods** on a report of juveniles who had shot paintball rounds at cars in the parking lot in front of the store. According to a store employee, seven subjects went to the paintball area and collected items. The subjects attempted to steal the items but were confronted by store personnel. The reporting party said the subjects then left the store and to a nearby parked car and removed paintball guns from the trunk. The reporting party said all seven subjects had paintball guns in their hands and some of them began shooting sporadically into the air and the ground. One subject was seen walking into the mall, and the reporting party called security. Shortly after, two 14-year old victims from Pacifica reported they were walking out of the food court area near the south wall of Target when an unknown subject in a moving vehicle fired 6-7 paintballs at them, hitting each of them two times. Neither victim suffered any major injury. The victims described the subject who shot them as a black teenager with a dark complexion, with a possible "flat top" haircut and possible wearing a hooded sweatshirt. The suspect vehicle was described as a newer model black Hyundai Elantra. This investigation is continuing.

Robberies

There were no robberies during the past week.

Residential Burglaries

There were two residential burglaries during the past week.

Between Saturday, 08-05-17 at 2:00 p.m. and Sunday 08-06-17 at 5:00 a.m., an unknown subject shattered the rear sliding glass window of a residence on the 1000 block of **Crocker Avenue** and stole loose change from a bedroom.

On Sunday, 08-06-17 between 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 p.m., four residents in an apartment on the unit block of **Lausanne Avenue** reported they were burglarized of Sony and Microsoft gaming consoles, games and bobble heads by someone they know who had access to the property. This case is under investigation.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

Between Thursday, 08-03-17 at 11:30 p.m. and Friday, 08-04-17 at approximately 9:00 a.m., an unknown suspect took two window screens and attempted to open a window of a dental office on the 6200 block of **Mission Street**.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were eight vehicle burglaries during the past week. In the majority of these cases, the window of time that the crime occurred was short. Please never leave valuables in your vehicle, even if you think it will only be for a few minutes. Vehicle burglars are quick at getting in and out of cars.

- **Kukje** Parking lot (2350 **Junipero Serra Boulevard**)—a Marc Jacobs tote bag containing a laptop, two hard drives, a Bluetooth ear piece, cash and a house key was taken from the front passenger seat of a 2015 Lexus RX350. (The victim covered the bag with a jacket.) The right front window was smashed. Occurred on 07-31-17 between 9:00 p.m. and 9:15 p.m.
- **CVS** parking lot on Pierce Street—a backpack containing a laptop, clothing and a passport was taken from a 2002 Ford Expedition. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 07-31-17 between 8:45 p.m. and 8:49 p.m. The backpack was found nearby but the laptop was missing.
- **KFC** on Geneva Avenue—several backpacks containing cash, a passport and a laptop were taken from a 2017 Jeep Cherokee. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-01-17 between 8:15 p.m. and 8:35 p.m.
- 100 block of **Rio Verde Street**—a Timbuktu messenger bag containing a MacBook Air, three iPhones, and miscellaneous electronics was taken from a 2003 Saturn Vue. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 08-04-17 between 8:23 a.m. and 8:33 a.m.
- **Krispy Kreme** parking lot—a Vince Camuto purse containing a Michael Kors wallet, miscellaneous cosmetics, driver's license, credit cards, checkbook and paperwork was taken from the driver's seat of a 2012 Honda Civic. The left front window was smashed. Occurred on 08-05-17 between 9:10 p.m. and 9:45 p.m.
- Parking garage at 1901 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** (4th floor)--\$3,799 worth of miscellaneous items was taken from a 2014 Subaru Forester. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-05-17 between 7:10 p.m. and 9:57 p.m.
- **Maddux Drive/Southgate Avenue**—a blue checkered suit was taken from the rear passenger seat of a 1987 Volvo 740GLE. The left rear window and right rear windows were smashed. Occurred on 08-06-17 between 11:00 a.m. and 11:53 p.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near JC Penney—a Northface backpack containing a laptop and binoculars was taken from the trunk of a Jeep Cherokee. The rear window was smashed. Occurred on 08-06-17 between 4:00 p.m. and 7:50 p.m.

In an emergency situation, an alert will be sent by San Mateo County authorized personnel and you will receive messages on your cell phone or mobile device. This private network ensures that only those who live in your neighborhood can join; users must go through a verification process. Neighbors ask each other for business recommendations; help in locating missing pets; discuss relevant local government issues; or connect for other reasons.
