



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Monday, 10-02-17 at 1:06 a.m., a 31-year old San Francisco resident was cited for being in possession of a controlled substance and for carrying a concealed dagger. This occurred following a pedestrian stop at **Lincoln Park**, as the subject was violating the curfew rules of being in the park after hours.

Between 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, 09-30-17 and 4:15 p.m. on Monday, 10-02-17, a 31-year old Daly City resident was the victim of arson to the inside of his 2006 Ford truck. This occurred on the 600 block of **Hillside Boulevard**. The suspect is unknown.

On Tuesday, 10-03-17 at 2:05 p.m., a 53-year old **Macy's** employee was cited for embezzlement after bringing in tags from items she bought for her son at another Macy's location and charged the returns back to her bank card.

On Tuesday, 10-03-17 at approximately 9:20 p.m., Officer Brenes and Officer Hamilton were dispatched to the **Denny's** parking lot on a report of a man who was passed out in a vehicle. The officers arrived on scene and saw a subject sleeping in the front seat. Officer Hamilton knocked on the driver's door window several times to wake up the subject. The subject woke up, and the officers determined he was on parole for domestic battery and assault with a deadly weapon. Officer Hamilton told the subject he was going to search him, and the subject did not want to get out of the vehicle. After the subject got out of the vehicle, he kicked his feet and flailed his body. The subject, a 42-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for obstructing, resisting or delaying a police officer and was transported to jail after he was medically cleared.

On Wednesday, 10-04-17 at 6:39 p.m., Officer Sunga was dispatched to the **Safeway** store on a report of a subject who stole from the store and backed his vehicle into the reporting party twice. The reporting party is a 28-year old Safeway employee who said she chased the subject from the store to a

parking lot where the subject entered a vehicle. She said she walked to the rear of the vehicle to take a photo of it, and as she took the photo, she said the suspect backed his vehicle and tapped her on her left leg. The victim said the suspect drove away approximately 20 feet and then backed into her a second time. The suspect then drove off in a white 2014 Toyota Corolla towards Southgate Avenue. The victim described the suspect as a white male, approximately 40-50 years old, 6'0", 200 lbs., bald, facial hair, and last seen wearing a blue or gray hoodie, gray shorts and black socks. This case is referred to investigators.

On Friday, 10-06-17 at approximately 4:50 p.m., a 60-year old **Macy's** employee was cited for embezzlement after being in possession of a cake pan during a routine bag check. The asset protection agent witnessed the employee putting the pan in her bag and leaving the store without paying for it.

On Sunday, 10-08-17 at approximately 3:06 a.m., a 31-year old transient subject was cited for possession of a controlled substance and for giving false identification to a peace officer. This occurred following a consensual pedestrian encounter in the area of **North Parkview Avenue** and **San Diego Avenue**.

## Robberies

There were three robberies during the past week.

On Tuesday, 10-03-17 at approximately 2:46 p.m., Officer Jackson-Berrios and Officer Baroni were dispatched to **San Pedro Road** and **Sullivan Avenue** on a report of an armed robbery via a knife. The victim, a 20-year old San Bruno resident, said he was walking north on Sullivan Avenue near CVS looking at his phone in his one hand and had his wallet in the other hand. The victim said the suspect was five feet in front of him and then pulled out a serrated knife with a blade approximately 4-5" and said, "Give me your f-checking wallet". The victim provided a description of the suspect, but officers were unable to locate him. Investigators are currently working on leads.

On Wednesday, 10-04-17 at approximately 10:55 p.m., Officer Palafox and Officer Poti were dispatched to the 300 block of **Palmcrest Drive** on a report of an armed robbery via a gun. Officers met with one of the victims, a 31-year old Daly City resident, who said he was smoking a cigarette in front of the address and two African American males contacted him and his roommate, a 42-year old Daly City resident, at gunpoint. He said one subject pointed the gun at his head and asked him to give him all his money and cell phone. When the suspect looked in the victim's wallet and saw no money, he asked where the money was. The victim said the suspects then forced them at gunpoint to take him to their apartment where the suspects stole more cash, wallets, cell phones and a ring. There were three other victims (21-42 years old) in the apartment when the suspects entered the residence. They were all held at gunpoint. The suspects fled in an early 2000's model Nissan Maxima. One of the victims tried to follow the vehicle but lost them northbound on Highway 280. The victims were physically unharmed.

On Thursday, 10-05-17 at 4:40 p.m., Officer Farrar and Officer Jackson were dispatched to the **Lucky** store on a report of a theft by two unknown suspects. The 28-year old security guard was the victim of a strong armed robbery when he tried to stop the suspects for stealing alcohol. The subjects fled the store. One suspect was described as a Filipino male, 18-20 years old, 5'6", 130 lbs. wearing a gray and white jacket. The other suspect was described as a black male 18-20 years old, 6'2", 140 pounds last seen wearing a red beanie and blue jeans.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Friday, 10-06-17 between 3:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., an unknown suspect burglarized a garage to a condo on the 1000 block of **San Antonio Circle** by prying the side door. The loss was two bicycles and two drills.

## Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

At an unknown time on Monday, 10-02-17, the **Cigarettes Cheaper** store was the victim of a commercial burglary, and the suspect stole cash and merchandise. This case is under investigation.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near JC Penney—a suitcase containing clothes, shoes and keys was taken from a 2017 GMC Acadia. The right rear window and rear window were smashed. Occurred on 10-02-17 between 9:15 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.
- **In N Out** parking lot (**Washington Street**)—a backpack containing a laptop was taken from a 2015 Toyota Corolla. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 10-03-17 between 4:30 p.m. and 4:50 p.m.
- Parking garage of 1293 **Hillside Boulevard**—a bag containing miscellaneous paperwork and two iPhone chargers was taken from a 2011 Nissan Cube. The right front and right rear windows were smashed. Occurred between 8:00 p.m. on 10-03-17 and 9:05 a.m. on 10-04-17.
- **In N Out** parking lot (**Washington Street**)—backpack containing gym clothes, a towel and a Kindle was taken from a 2016 Toyota Prius. The trunk window was smashed. Occurred on 10-04-17 at 12:32 a.m.
- **Krispy Kreme** parking lot—a Vince Camuto purse containing cosmetics was taken from the back seat of a 2007 Toyota Sienna. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 10-06-17 between 2:20 p.m. and 2:40 p.m.
- 700 block of **Southgate Avenue**—data communication tools were taken from a 2006 Toyota Sienna. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred between 9:00 p.m. on 10-07-17 and 12:00 p.m. on 10-08-17.
- **Denny's** parking lot—a MacBook laptop, four German passports, a Bose music box and cash was taken from a 2015 Kia Sorrento. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 10-08-17 at 10:15 a.m.

## Scams/Other

### **Found Money Scam**

On Wednesday, 10-04-17 at approximately 3:00 p.m., a 67-year Daly City resident said she parked in front of TJ Maxx at Westlake and began walking to DSW Shoes. While she was inside the shoe store, the victim said an unknown suspect tapped her on her shoulder and said she dropped something next to her vehicle. The victim said she didn't think she dropped anything, but she went to go back to check. The victim said as she was walking back to her vehicle, she saw a female standing next to her vehicle. Once she got back to her vehicle, she said the first subject followed her back to her vehicle and began pulling out a small black box from her handbag. The subject told her to take the box because she dropped it. The victim said the box was not hers. The subject insisted the victim open the box and handed it to her. The victim saw a stack of cash inside the box and also said there was a loose \$100 bill that fell on the ground. The second subject picked up the \$100 bill and gave it to the victim. The first subject advised the victim that there was approximately \$250K in the box and thinks there could be a reward for finding the money. The victim felt something wasn't right and said the first subject told her she works for a bank and knows somebody who could split the money between the three of them to make the transaction look legitimate. The first subject told the victim that all she had to do was drive her to the Chase Bank on Southgate Avenue and Park Plaza and she would handle the rest. The victim drove the subjects to the rear of the bank and the first subject exited the vehicle. The subject returned to the vehicle and told the victim that she needed her to withdraw some money from her account to give it to her to make the transaction seem legitimate. (I know what you're thinking: these women are convincing.) Long story short, the victim withdrew \$2,000, the women walked back to the "bank" and never returned. The first subject is described as an African American female, approximately 70 years old, 5'4", 125 lbs., thin build, curly hair and holding a black handbag full of bibles. The second subject was described as an African American female, approximately 40 years old, 5'5", 160 lbs., heavy set and wearing a brown long haired wig.
