When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

**This bulletin contains two weeks of information.

Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 02-28-18 at 1:12 a.m., Officer McCarthy attempted to stop a vehicle at the Kentucky Fried Chicken parking lot on **Mission Street**. Sgt. Begley arrived to assist and was driving into the parking lot when the driver of the suspect vehicle reversed his vehicle and nearly rammed Sgt. Begley’s vehicle. The subject led the officers onto a pursuit into San Francisco for 1.4 miles and hit two parked vehicles along the way. The subject, a 34-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for assaulting a police officer with a deadly weapon, recklessly evading police, hit and run, and for having two warrants.

On Thursday, 03-01-18 at 9:00 p.m., the San Francisco Police Department Night Investigations Unit requested our assistance in serving a search warrant at a residence on the unit block of **Grandview Avenue**. San Francisco P.D. was on scene to arrest a 55-year old resident who was wanted for an assault with a deadly weapon incident that recently occurred in San Francisco. During a protective sweep of the residence, the San Francisco Police sergeant found a large amount of marijuana and indicia belonging to another resident, as well as a box of 9 mm rounds. The subject was booked for the warrant and also for being a felon in possession of ammunition. A warrant is requested for the other resident for possession of narcotics for sale, possession of a large capacity magazine and possession of marijuana for sale.

On Friday, 03-02-18 at 3:50 p.m., subsequent to a traffic stop by Officer Haas at the intersection of **Geneva Avenue** and **Bayshore Boulevard**, a 21-year old San Francisco resident was cited for

possession of a baton, possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and for possession of drug paraphernalia.

On Friday, 03-02-18 at approximately 4:36 p.m., Officer Jackson-Berrios was dispatched to a welfare check at the intersection of **Southgate Avenue** and **Westridge Avenue** on a report of a man who fainted and then got into a vehicle and fled the area. The reporting party said the subject almost hit her with his vehicle and was possibly drunk. The reporting party said the vehicle was driving towards the Westlake Shopping Center. Officer Taylor found the vehicle parked in two spots on the 600 block of John Muir Drive, near to where the vehicle was registered. The subject, a 58-year old San Francisco resident, had trouble keeping his balance once out of the vehicle. He was subsequently arrested for driving under the influence after failing the field sobriety tests.

On Saturday, 03-03-18 at 6:24 p.m., a 56-year old Millbrae resident reported that his vehicle was burglarized in parking lot D6 at the **Serramonte Shopping Center**. The subject claimed that \$1,430 in valuables was taken from his 2005 Kia Sedona. The investigating officer looked at surveillance footage of the parking lot and saw no one coming near or tampering with the subject's vehicle during the time frame he had reported the burglary occurred. The subject later admitted he filed a false report. A complaint is sought against the subject for the crime of falsifying a police report.

On Saturday, 03-03-18 at approximately 10:18 p.m., a 36-year old South San Francisco resident was arrested for driving under the influence following a collision with a moving vehicle at **Gellert Boulevard** and **Serra Vista Avenue**. Her 58-year old father was a passenger in the vehicle and was sent home in a cab due to his level of intoxication.

On Sunday, 03-04-18 at approximately 2:01 a.m., Officer Ciucci checked on a vehicle that was double parked on the 1500 block of **Southgate Avenue**. When Officer Ciucci asked the subject if he was stranded or in distress, he noticed there was a ziplock-style bag containing a green leafy substance on the driver's side floorboard of the vehicle. The officer also noticed a ziplock-style baggie containing marijuana that was protruding out from his sweatshirt pocket. The subject was extremely nervous and refused to make eye contact with the officer. While speaking with the subject, the officer noticed a distinct bullet hole in the rear driver's side door of the vehicle. There was no rust around the hole, which indicated to him that it was from a recent incident. Officer Ciucci elected to conduct a pat search of the subject, due to the subject's nervous behavior, his inconsistent statements regarding why he was double parked and the noticeable bullet hole. As he began to pat search the subject, the officer said the subject twisted his torso, causing the front of his waistband to become out of his reach. Officer Ciucci immediately reached around the subject and felt the handle of a firearm that had fallen into the crotch area of the subject's pants. Officer Ciucci subsequently determined the subject, a 25-year old resident, was at that location to sell marijuana to a resident who was outside to greet him. The subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance while armed, possession of a controlled substance (MDMA) for sales, unlawful possession of marijuana for sale, having a concealed firearm on a person, having a concealed firearm in a vehicle, carrying an unregistered loaded firearm, and for possession of a large capacity magazine.

On Sunday, 03-04-18 at 7:17 p.m., the **Safeway** store was the victim of a commercial burglary and vandalism by a subject who used a screwdriver to pry open a cash register and stole cash. The subject fled in a black Dodge Charger. Officer Murillo attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle, and the driver led officers on a pursuit into San Francisco. The vehicle was involved in a minor collision with a magazine stand in the area of 16th Street and Market Street in San Francisco. Officer Murillo was able to apprehend one suspect, a 46-year old Oakland resident, and placed him under arrest. The other suspect is unknown and still outstanding.

On Monday, 03-05-18 at 3:06 a.m., a 19-year old Daly City resident was arrested for driving under the influence and for being under 21 with a BAC of .05% or more following a collision with a parked vehicle at **Hillcrest Drive** and **Santa Cruz Avenue**.

On Monday, 03-05-18 at 3:18 a.m., Officer Mahan arrested a 23-year old San Lorenzo resident for driving under the influence in the area of **Southgate Avenue** and **Callan Boulevard**. At the police

station, the subject became combative and kicked the officer in the groin. The subject was additionally arrested for battery on a police officer.

On Thursday, 03-08-18 at 8:00 a.m., Officer Andrade was dispatched to the 6500 block of **Mission Street** on a report of an in-progress theft from an apartment garage. The dispatcher relayed the description of the suspect to the officers in the area, and with the help of the reporting party, the officers were able to locate the suspect. The reporting party, a maintenance worker for the apartment, said he arrived at work and found the suspect in the garage sitting against the wall with a shopping cart full of items he recognized that belonged to him and the apartments. The subject, a 37-year old transient, was arrested for commercial burglary and for possession of narcotics paraphernalia.

On Thursday, 03-08-18 at approximately 5:20 p.m., Officer Perdomo was on patrol in the BART parking lot on **Delong Street** and **John Daly Boulevard** and recognized an unoccupied parked white Toyota Prius that led Officer Aquila on a pursuit the day before. Officer Perdomo determined the vehicle was stolen from Petaluma in early January. Within minutes, two female subjects approached the doors to the Prius, and when they saw the patrol vehicle, the subjects walked away from the Prius. Officer Perdomo stopped the subjects and subsequent to his investigation, one subject, a 35-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of a controlled substance and for a probation violation. The other subject, a 30-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of drug paraphernalia, and for being a felon in possession of a stun gun.

On Thursday, 03/08/18, at 6:30 p.m., a 32-year old Daly City resident was arrested for a \$350,000 felony arrest warrant for domestic violence. The subject and his 30-year old friend were in the parking lot of Home Depot at the **Westlake Shopping Center** at the time of the arrest. Both subjects were found to be in possession of over 14 pounds of marijuana and were booked into the San Mateo County Jail.

On Friday, 03/09/18, 2:01 p.m., a 24-year old subject was served with an arrest warrant for attempted murder and assault with a deadly weapon. The subject was hiding in a room at his aunt's apartment on the 300 block of **Imperial Way** at the time of his arrest. When the officers searched the subject's bedroom, they found brass knuckles and a pressure cooker containing marijuana wax. The subject was arrested for the warrant and for manufacturing a controlled substance (concentrated cannabis), possession of marijuana for sales, possession of brass knuckles, and for committing a felony while out on bail.

On Friday, 03-09-18 at 2:52 p.m., Officer Clinkscales was on patrol in the **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near Target and located an unoccupied parked Landrover that was stolen from Oakland in February. A short time later, Officer Clinkscales observed a male subject with a female and two young children approach the vehicle and saw the female place the two children inside the vehicle parked next to the Landrover. The male subject, a 32-year old Alameda resident, was subsequently arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, vehicle theft with priors, failure to obey a uniformed police officer, possession of a controlled substance, and for possession of drug paraphernalia.

On Saturday, 03/10/18, at 8:42 p.m., officers conducted a check of an illegally parked vehicle at **Abbot Avenue** and **Thiers Street**. The driver, a 21-year old San Francisco resident, was subsequently arrested for a warrant for domestic violence, possession of a Glock 23 semi-automatic handgun with live ammunition in a high-capacity magazine, and for possession of a plastic bag containing suspected black tar heroin. The 20-year old passenger from Daly City was arrested for being in possession of seven bags of cocaine, a digital scale, three loaded high-capacity magazines and one unloaded high-capacity magazine.

Robberies

There were three robberies during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 02-26-18 at 3:20 p.m., officers responded to the 500 block of **Gellert Boulevard** on a report of a battery that just occurred. The victim, a 23-year old Daly City resident, had a swollen bottom lip with an open bleeding wound. The victim said he was driving on Gellert Boulevard and noticed a newer model Honda Pilot tailgating behind him. The victim said it seemed like the vehicle was attempting to pass him, so he slowed down to allow the driver to pass. The victim said the Honda Pilot sped up and abruptly cut him off. The victim said the driver of the Honda Pilot pulled in front of him, and on foot, approached the driver's side of his vehicle. The victim said the suspect then proceeded to strike him multiple times in the face. The victim managed to exit his vehicle and then use his cell phone to record the suspect running towards him. The victim said the suspect reached inside his vehicle and took his wallet and car keys. The victim said the suspect then threw the keys across the road and fled in the Honda Pilot. Fearing for his safety, the victim retreated. Officers were able to determine the owner of the vehicle and several hours later, they arrested the suspect, a 35-year old San Francisco resident, for robbery and assault and battery.

On Tuesday, 02-27-18 at 11:10 a.m., an AT&T store employee at the **Gellert Boulevard** store said he was working on the sales floor when an unknown subject walked up to him. The employee offered to help him, and the suspect took an iPad out of the employee's hands and fled the store. The employee described the subject as a black male, early 30's, 5'9, medium length afro, gray hooded sweatshirt and gray pants. The employee was unharmed, and officers were unable to locate the suspect.

On Saturday, 03-03-18 at 10:42 a.m., officers were dispatched to a strong arm robbery at a market on the 400 block of **Bellevue Avenue**. The victim, a 51-year old Cantonese speaker, was working as a cashier when an unknown male walked through the front door and pushed her with his hands, causing her to fall. The suspect then took cash that was nearby and opened a tray next to the register and took money. The victim said she attempted to grab the suspect's legs as she was on the ground but the suspect pushed her again. The victim described the suspect as an unknown race, wearing a black mask, approximately 5'7-5'9, 150 pounds, wearing a black long sleeve shirt with blue jeans. The victim refused medical attention. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past two weeks.

Between Sunday, 03-04-18 at 10:45 a.m. and Monday, 03-05-18 at 3:30 a.m., an unknown suspect entered the victim's apartment on the 1000 block of **St. Francis Boulevard** and took an iPad, earrings and a wallet. There were no signs of forced entry.

Commercial Burglaries

There were five commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Tuesday, 02-27-18 at 12:30 p.m., a 51-year old San Francisco resident was arrested for stealing a tip jar from a restaurant on the 2500 block of **Geneva Avenue**. The suspect picked the wrong time to steal the tip jar—two of our officers were having lunch at the restaurant at the time the suspect stole the tip jar!

On Tuesday, 02-27-18 at 1:33 p.m., the Verizon Wireless Store at **Serramonte Center** was the victim of a burglary of two Samsung Galaxy Note 8 cell phones. The store manager said a subject walked into the store, grabbed two cell phones on display and used wire cutters to remove them from the display. The subject then walked out of the store and got onto a red mountain bike. The employee

described the suspect as a black male, 25 years old, approximately 6'0 with a "loose Jerry curl afro", wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans, sunglasses and gloves. Officers were unable to locate the suspect.

On Wednesday, 02-28-18 at approximately 8:47 p.m., the AT&T store on **Gellert Boulevard** was the victim of a burglary by two males who took four iPads and seven cell phones from the display area. The two suspects were described as black male adults, both wearing black hoodies covering their faces, one subject had acid washed blue jeans, and the other had torn/ripped blue jeans. This investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 03-04-18 at 7:17 p.m., a 46-year old Oakland resident, used a screwdriver to pry open a cash register at **Safeway** and stole cash. The subject fled in a black Dodge Charger and was subsequently arrested in San Francisco following a pursuit. (See "notable reports".)

On Thursday, 03-08-18 at 8:00 a.m., a 37-year old transient male was arrested for commercial burglary and for possession of narcotics paraphernalia after he was found by the apartment complex maintenance worker. This occurred on the 6500 block of **Mission Street**. (See "notable reports".)

Scams/Other

Car Dent Scam

On Saturday, 03-04-18 at 3:00 p.m., a 63-year old San Francisco resident said he was in the parking lot at Starbuck's on Gellert Boulevard when he was approached by two Hispanic subjects driving a newer silver Chevrolet truck with decals on it. The victim said one of the subjects noticed there was front end damage to the victim's Subaru Forester. The two males told the victim they could fix the damage for \$600. The victim believed it was a good deal and took the subjects up on their offer. The victim said the two subjects began to rub a coating on the hood of his vehicle, and he believes sometime during this time, one of the men managed to go inside of his vehicle and take a blue leather Chase Bank bag containing approximately \$3,000 in cash and checks. The victim said after the two men rubbed a coating onto his car, they asked him to follow him up to their apartment complex to get tools and parts. The victim followed them to the back side of Ward Court near Clarinada Avenue. The victim said the subjects said they were going to the dealership to purchase a new headlight and would return. The victim said he waited for approximately 15 minutes but had to go to the bank. He stated at that time, he was unable to find the Chase Bank bag and believes one of the subjects took the bag.

Facebook Prize Scam

On Thursday, 03-08-18, a 61-year old Daly City resident reported that she was the victim of a fraud. The victim said she spoke with a subject on Facebook on 03-04-18 named "John" who informed her she had won a contest she entered on Facebook. The subject told her she won \$250,000, and in order for her to receive the prize money, she had to send in a fee. The called instructed her to send \$12,000 to a Wells Fargo Bank account. The subject told the victim she would receive a check after the fees were paid. The victim wired the fees and contacted the subject on Facebook to inform him the fees were sent and to send the prize money. The victim realized she was scammed after the subject told the victim she would have to pay taxes on the prize money and told her to send the taxes.
