When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 09-24-18 at 3:58 a.m., Officer Sunga conducted a check of a vehicle parked in the **Denny’s** parking lot. The vehicle’s windows were covered with blankets, and there was condensation on the windows. The dispatchers advised the vehicle was stolen from Colma a few days prior. Other officers arrived to assist, and they contacted a female in the vehicle. The female, a 24-year old Daly City resident, was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of a master key and for an outstanding warrant.

On Tuesday, 09-25-18 at 2:35 a.m., Officer Martin conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on the 7400 block of **Mission Street**. Dispatchers advised the vehicle was stolen from South San Francisco. Officer Martin arrested the subject, a 49-year old Pacifica resident, for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of methamphetamine and for driving on a suspended license.

On Thursday, 09-27-18 at 7:38 a.m., Officer Graner was dispatched to a residence on the 100 block of **Bismark Street** on a report of a family disturbance where a female was heard screaming after a male forced entry into her home. The reporting party flagged down the officer and asked him to enter the residence. Officer Graner said the female was sobbing and reported that she lives with her 21-year old daughter at the residence. The reporting party said her daughter had broken up with her boyfriend after dating him for approximately two years. The reporting party said the ex-boyfriend has come to their home several times to speak with her daughter, and on this particular morning, the suspect knocked at the door loudly. The reporting party yelled at the suspect to leave, and the suspect pounded the door even louder. The reporting party said she opened the door slightly, and the suspect pushed in the door and then entered the residence. The reporting party said the suspect began yelling at the victim, started throwing things around the house and, at one point, pushed the victim. After the

reporting party started recording the incident on her iPad, she said the suspect quickly left the house. Officers were able to locate the 22-year old suspect nearby, and they placed him under arrest for burglary, battery, criminal threats and for battery on a peace officer.

On Thursday, 09-27-18 at 10:35 a.m., Officer Prudden was dispatched to the area of **Geneva Avenue** and **Bayshore Boulevard** on a report of an auto burglary in progress. The reporting party heard an audible vehicle alarm and saw a subject inside a vehicle. The reporting party followed the subject and gave the dispatcher updates of the suspect's location. Officer Prudden contacted the subject, and after the reporting party positively identified the subject, Officer Prudden arrested the suspect, a 59-year old San Francisco resident, for burglary.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at 5:47 a.m., Officer Dhaliwal was dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Westpark Drive** on a report of a transient subject who entered a residence and was chased down by the victims. The 25-year old reporting party said he heard a loud sound in the garage, and when he went to check, he saw a subject who walking down the street with a blanket that was kept in the cupboard in the garage. Officers contacted the subject, a 45-year old San Francisco resident, and subsequently arrested him for burglary and for a parole violation.

On Saturday, 09-29-18 at 10:38 p.m., a 29-year old Daly City resident was arrested for prowling after a neighbor reported seeing the subject looking into parked vehicles in the area of **Acton Street** and **Frankfort Street**. The subject admitted to the officers as being "high" from drugs.

On Saturday, 09-29-18 at 12:24 p.m., several officers were dispatched to a residence on **Palomar Drive** on the report of a male subject who called dispatchers and stated he had pushed his mother out of a chair and needed to be arrested for assault and battery. Officers arrived and learned the 58-year old son had a verbal argument with his mother, and in his frustration, he pushed his 88-year old mother out of her chair. The subject was arrested for elder abuse, and the mother was taken to the hospital for a complaint of pain with unknown injuries.

On Sunday, 09-30-18 at 8:32 a.m., several officers were dispatched to an apartment at 890 **Campus Drive** on a report of a verbal dispute between neighbors. The 35-year old victim said she and her son had been assaulted by a female who lived directly below her in the building. The victim said the female suspect forced herself into their apartment and grabbed her from the neck and also slapped her 19-year old son. The 25-year old suspect was subsequently arrested for burglary, assault and battery, and criminal threats.

On Monday, 10-01-18 at 3:34 p.m., Officer Moody was dispatched to the parking lot of **Westlake Shopping Center** near **Trader Joe's** on a report of a male subject tampering with vehicles and looking into vehicles. Officer Moody contacted a subject matching the description, and he asked the subject if he had anything illegal on his person. The subject consented to a search, and the officer found an abundance of keys, a screwdriver, a wallet with miscellaneous gift cards, credit cards and a Costco card—all not belonging to the subject. The subject, a 24-year old transient, was arrested for possession of burglary tools and for possession of stolen property.

On Tuesday, 10-02-18 at 3:54 p.m., Officer Taylor was dispatched to the 400 block of **Allan Street** on a report of a subject who was riding a bicycle and looking inside of parked vehicles. Officer Taylor found a subject matching the description on **MacDonald Avenue** near **Schwerin Street**. The officer asked the subject for his identifying information, and the subject said he did not have any documents with his name on them. The subject provided a name and a date of birth, and the subject had difficulty spelling his first name and gave a birth date which would make him 8 years old. The subject ultimately gave his real name and date of birth. Officer Jackson-Berrios arrived to assist, and when she searched the subject, she found a glass pipe in the subject's pants pocket. The subject, a 24-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for possession of narcotics paraphernalia and for giving false identifying information to a police officer.

On Tuesday, 10-02-18 at 9:12 p.m., Officer Farrar attempted to stop a vehicle at **Clarinada Avenue** and **Callan Boulevard** for not stopping at the posted intersection. He said the vehicle continued to drive, even after the officer sounded the siren, used his emergency lights and ordered him over the

vehicle's public address system to pull to the side of the road. Officer Farrar said the subject finally pulled into the parking lot and into the drive-thru lane of the McDonald's restaurant on **Serramonte Boulevard**. When Officer Farrar went over to talk to the subject, he could smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage about the driver. The subject refused to take field sobriety tests and said he was picking up food for his kids. The subject, a 53-year old Daly City resident, was placed under arrested for driving

On Wednesday, 10-03-18 at 3:03 p.m., Officer Moody was flagged down by the **Jefferson High School** principal who stated one of his students was caught selling marijuana brownies to other students in class. The principal requested the student be arrested for possession of drugs on a school grounds. Officer Moody arrested the 16-year old student and released him to the custody of his older sister.

On Saturday, 10-06-18 at 2:16 a.m., Officer Clinkscales was on patrol and observed a subject talking to himself in front of the **Starbucks at Westlake Shopping Center**. The officer walked over to the subject and asked him his name. The subject, a 32-year old transient, was on court probation with the conditions of search and seizure. Officer Clinkscales asked the subject if he had anything in his possession that he shouldn't have, and the subject said "no" and walked away from him. A second officer came to assist, and they searched the subject. The subject had a bag containing suspected methamphetamine in his shirt pocket. The subject did not wish to provide a statement, and the officers arrested him for possession of a controlled substance and for resisting arrest.

On Saturday, 10-06-18 at 9:50 a.m., Officer Covarrubias was dispatched to the front lobby of the police station on a report of a male subject who stated he was being followed. Officer Lickness responded to assist and said the subject said he was being followed by ten cars. When the officers were talking to the subject, they the subject was not making any sense and was speaking about unintelligible topics. The officers asked the subject how he arrived at the police station, and the subject said his deacon dropped him off, and he was waiting in a vehicle in the parking lot. Officer Lickness confirmed that, and Officer Covarrubias continued to talk to the subject. Believing the subject may be under the influence of a controlled substance, Officer Covarrubias conducted some field sobriety tests. Based on the initial results of the field sobriety tests, coupled with the subject's admission of smoking crystal methamphetamine the previous day, the officer placed the subject, a 28-year old Daly City resident, under arrest for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Sunday, 10-07-18 at 9:33 a.m., dispatchers broadcasted information regarding an armed carjacking that occurred in San Francisco, near the border of Daly City, and that the victim's cell phone was pinging in the area. Several officers located the vehicle, and the subject in the vehicle pulled away from the officers and started a pursuit. The driver of the suspect vehicle collided with vehicles and ended up hitting the center concrete median on **Lake Merced Boulevard** near Original Joe's of Westlake. The driver of the vehicle exited and ran away from the officer and continued to run. At this point, San Francisco police officers were also on scene, and they arrested the subject, a 32-year old Daly City resident, for carjacking, being a felon in possession of a firearm, felony evading a peace officer causing injury, felony hit and run, and for resisting arrest.

Robberies

There were five robberies and one attempted robbery during the past two weeks.

On Wednesday, 09-26-18 at 10:10 a.m., Officer Greene was dispatched to a report of a strong-arm robbery that occurred in the area of **Wellington Avenue** and **Irvington Street**. The reporting party said he was driving and saw a female screaming so he stopped to assist her. The female wanted to use the reporting party's cell phone to call the police. The victim, a 29-year old Daly City resident, said she was walking on the 6300 block of **Mission Street** and saw four subjects sitting on the stairs near the Pacific restaurant. The victim said she continued walking near Wellington Avenue when she became aware that she was being followed. The victim said someone pushed her in the back and caused her to fall. The victim said one of the subjects removed her cell phone from her rear pants pocket while she was on the ground. Another subject removed the victim's glasses from her face and threw them away from her. The victim said that after the subjects took her phone and removed her

glasses, one subject pulled her hair and punched her in the face one time. The subjects then fled the area. The victim described one suspect as a black male, approximately 20 years old, 5'5", skinny build wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans. She described the second subject as a Hispanic female, approximately 20 years old, 5'5", skinny build, wearing a yellow or pink shirt. The victim could not provide a description of the third suspect, but said she was an unknown race female, possibly wearing a red shirt. Even though the suspects fled the area, the victim said she caught up to two of them and requested her phone back. The male suspect threw a phone on the ground, but it wasn't her phone. The subjects then fled the area again. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 09-27-18 at 6:33 p.m., a 29-year old **Lucky's** employee was the victim of a robbery after he confronted two subjects for stealing alcohol. One suspect pushed the employee in the chest and then left the store with a backpack full of alcohol. The employee described the first suspect as a black male in his early 20's, approximately 6'0, wearing a thick black jacket, black pants, blue baseball cap, glasses and carrying a black backpack. The victim described the second suspect as a black male in his 40's, 6'3", black hair, missing rows of teeth and wearing jeans and a big purple and white jacket.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at 8:55 a.m., a loss prevention officer for **Home Depot** said he saw a subject walk out of the store with several Milwaukee brand power tools without paying for them. The loss prevention officer said as the suspect was walking out of the store, he gestured to his waist line as if he had a weapon and told the store employees to get back or they would be sorry. The suspect loaded the items into a black vehicle. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at 10:58 a.m., a 62-year old Daly City resident said he was sitting down on a bench inside the **Serramonte Mall** in the **Target** wing and was looking at his cell phone when, all of a sudden, a male suspect forcibly grabbed the phone from his hands. The victim said the suspect ran, and he chased after him. The victim said he chased the suspect out of the east exit doors towards the parking lot and lost sight of him. The victim said he immediately drove to the Sprint store to cancel his service. Around this same time, Officer Hyink was flagged down by mall security on a report of a subject who was being treated for an injury to his shin. This subject was the one who stole the cell phone, and in his attempt to get away, he collided into a metal cart! The suspect, a 17-year old San Francisco resident, had to be transported to the hospital to be treated for his injuries. After he was medically cleared, he was placed under arrest for robbery and an outstanding warrant and was transported to the San Mateo County Youth Services Bureau.

On Sunday, 10-07-18 at approximately 8:30 a.m., a 39-year old resident of London, England was the victim of a robbery by subjects who stole his backpack after blocking his pathway as he was walking under the 280 over pass on **King Drive**. The backpack contained a MacBook Pro, Nintendo Switch and Bose headphones. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at 3:30 p.m., two subjects, 15 and 17-year old Daly City residents, said they went into a clothing store on the 6700 block of **Mission Street** and said there was a group of teenage males standing at the entrance watching them as they entered the store. The 15-year old felt uncomfortable and exited the store to walk with his friend to his residence. Both reported that the group of teenagers followed them as they were walking westbound on **Vista Grande Avenue** near **Woodrow Street** and suddenly, two of the males began to chase after them. One male grabbed the 15-year old's book bag and ripped it from his back. The other male grabbed the 17-year old, held him against his will, and hit him in the face. A pedestrian saw this happen and yelled at the boys to stop attacking the victims. The subjects fled the area. The 17-year old described the first suspect as a Hispanic male juvenile, wearing a black hoodie and blue pants and described the second suspect as a Hispanic male juvenile, wearing a gray hoodie. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There were four residential burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Monday, 09-24-18 at approximately 2:13 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the 200 block of **Oriente Street** on a report of a residential burglary. A neighbor saw three males wearing

hooded sweatshirts running out of a residence who got into a blue Nissan and fled the area. The entry was made via a pry to the front security gate, pry to the front entrance door and to two interior entrance doors. The suspects stole currency, jewelry, a Samsung tablet and old Chinese money. This investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 09-27-18 at 7:38 a.m., a 22-year old Daly City resident pushed in a slightly open door of his ex-girlfriend's residence on the 100 block of **Bismark Street** and entered the residence. See "Notable Reports" for more information.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at 5:47 a.m., a residence on the unit block of **Westpark Drive** was burglarized. See "Notable Reports" for more information.

On Sunday, 09-30-18 at 8:32 a.m., a 25-year old Daly City resident was arrested for burglary and other charges after forcing her way into her upstairs neighbor's apartment at 890 **Campus Drive**. See "Notable Reports" for more information.

Commercial Burglaries

There were five commercial burglaries during the past two weeks.

On Wednesday, 09-26-18 at 8:47 p.m., **Dick's Sporting Goods** was the victim of a commercial burglary by five unknown suspects who, in a "grab and run" style theft, took an undetermined amount of clothing and fled the store into two awaiting vehicles. Four of the suspects were described as black females between 20-25 years old, and the other suspect was described as a black male, 20-25 years old, 5'8", 175 last seen wearing a white "Derby" hat and a black shirt with a white design.

On Friday, 09-28-18 at approximately 3:00 a.m., an unknown suspect entered a business through an unlocked office window on the 400 block of **Allan Street** and rummaged through the business. The suspect took approximately \$10 and a pair of pants.

Prior to Tuesday, 10-02-18 at 7:32 a.m., an unknown suspect pried a window of an abandoned building on the 2100 block of **Junipero Serra Boulevard**. There was no loss.

On Thursday, 10-04-18 at 4:55 p.m., the T-Mobile Store on **Gellert Boulevard** was the victim of a commercial burglary by three unknown suspects took an iPhone XS and iPhone SX Max and fled the store. The suspects were only described as younger black males with an average build. This investigation is continuing.

On Friday, 10-05-18 at 1:40 p.m., three unknown suspects entered the **Victoria's Secret** store and grabbed multiple items of clothing valued at over \$3,700 and fled the store. This investigation is continuing.

Community Events/Information

Public Safety Dispatch Centers in San Mateo County Now Able to Receive Text to 911 Emergency Calls For Service

Effective immediately, all San Mateo County Law Enforcement and Fire Agencies' 911 Dispatch Centers are equipped to receive and respond to mobile phone SMS Text to 911 messages. All phones or devices must include a text or data plan, be text capable, and have their location services enabled to send a text message to 911.

Callers who cannot communicate verbally are now able to use the text to 911 service to request help directly from local public safety agencies. This technology directly benefits members of our deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired communities as they will now have a more efficient and effective way to request emergency services in times of need. Additionally, those who find themselves in a situation where it may be too dangerous to dial 911 will have another option to call for help during an emergency.

For the deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired communities, texting to 911 is always an acceptable way to contact 911 for help. Others should only use the text to 911 feature when speaking to a 911 Dispatcher is not possible or may place an individual at risk. Examples include a domestic abuse situation, an active shooter incident, or an incident that has caused injury resulting in an inability to speak. Otherwise, it is always best to dial 911 and speak with a dispatcher directly.

Here are some helpful tips when using the Text to 911 service:

- Always provide the exact location of the emergency
- Text messages should be brief and easy to understand
- Do not use abbreviations, emojis or slang
- Remember that the ability to send/receive images and videos is limited and often dependent on the cellular provider
- Texts can only be received in English at this time - this service will be available in additional languages in the near future
- Do not include others when texting to 9-1-1 (no group texting)

REMEMBER Please only call 911 in the event of an emergency and only text to 911 when calling is absolutely not an option. For more information on text to 911 visit the San Mateo County Communications Manager's Association website at www.CMASMC.com

Please note: the City of Daly City and/or the Police Department cannot see what residents post—we are only allowed to post information.
