



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

### Notable Cases

On Monday, 12-10-18 at 4:38 p.m., Officer Greene was dispatched to the parking garage at 2001 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** on a report of a hit and run collision. The security guard saw a vehicle collide with another car and then drive to another floor of the garage. The security guard led the officer to the suspect vehicle, and the officer contacted the subject in the vehicle. The subject, a 43-year old female San Francisco resident, admitted to driving the car and was subsequently arrested for driving under the influence, hit and run and driving while unlicensed.

On Tuesday, 12-11-18 at 7:22 a.m., officers were dispatched to **Lake Merced Boulevard** and **Southgate Avenue** on a report of a brandishing of a knife. A maintenance worker at Westlake Shopping Center said he was working on some lights with a fellow coworker when a subject approached him and asked him for a job. The worker/victim told the subject he did not have a job for him and continued to work on the lights. The victim said the subject then took a knife from the front of his hooded sweatshirt and pointed the blade in a threatening manner at him. The victim said, to defend himself, he walked over and grabbed a broom. The victim called security, and the subject started running away from him and into the breezeway of the mall. Officers found the suspect, a 27-year old transient, and arrested him for assault with a deadly weapon.

On Wednesday, 12-12-18 at 10:27 a.m., Officer Lizana and Officer Andrade were on patrol and saw a blue sedan being pushed by several individuals from the southbound **Washington Street** offramp onto **Washington Street**. Officer Lizana positioned his patrol vehicle behind the vehicle and pushed it into the gas station parking lot. When the officer contacted the subject, he immediately smelled an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from him. The subject, a 30-year old Daly City resident, was subsequently arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

On Wednesday, 12-12-18 at 7:22 p.m., following a report of a female subject looking into windows of the **Home Sweet Home** convalescent facility on **Bryant Street**, officers cited a 34-year old transient for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Thursday, 12-13-18 at 12:53 a.m., Officer Tualalelei was dispatched to the **City Hall** building on a report of a subject who was in the women's restroom on the first floor for several hours. A 37-year old San Francisco resident was cited for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and for appropriation of lost property, after she was found to have credit cards not belonging to her in her possession.

On Saturday, 12-15-18 at 12:58 p.m., a 35-year old Elk Grove resident was the victim of a brandishing of a replica firearm by a 22-year old transient subject. This occurred during a "road rage" incident in the area of **Lake Merced Boulevard** and **Southgate Avenue**. Officers found the subject nearby in his vehicle and arrested him for brandishing a firearm.

On Sunday, 12-16-18 at 7:10 a.m., Officer Covarrubias was dispatched to the **Arco** station on **Washington Street** on a report of a subject who stated he was being followed. The subject, a 25-year old Modesto resident, said he drove all the way to Daly City because he was being followed by gang members. The officer said the subject pointed to a nearby parked unoccupied vehicle and said the gang members were in the car. The subject exhibited signs of being under the influence of a controlled substance, and Officer Covarrubias subsequently arrested the subject for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

On Sunday, 12-16-18 at 3:00 p.m., Officer Edwards was dispatched to a residence on the 6100 block of **Mission Street** on a report of a disturbance. The reporting party said her step son was yelling and would not come out of his room. She said he threw a metal bar outside the window which left shattered glass on the sidewalk. The 22-year old subject was subsequently arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance.

## Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-11-18 at 6:14 p.m., Officer Jackson-Berrios was dispatched to the **Bayshore Market** on **Geneva Avenue** on a report of a subject who threw items outside the store and was walking towards the **McDonald's**. The reporting party said she was working in the store when she saw a man place fruit in a bag and left without paying. The reporting party said she grabbed the bag from the subject outside the store. The subject then yelled an obscenity at her and grabbed the bag, causing it to rip. The reporting party said the subject then grabbed half of a coconut and threw it at her co-worker. The subject next picked up rocks and threw them at both the reporting party and her co-worker. A Brisbane police officer spotted the subject and detained him. The subject, a 63-year old transient, was arrested for robbery, failing to register as a sex registrant, resisting arrest and for an outstanding warrant.

On Saturday, 12-15-18 at 4:36 a.m., Officer Premenko was dispatched to a report of a robbery at the **Arco Station** on **Washington Street**. The 50-year old clerk said two subjects entered the store, and one subject punched him in the face and took money from the cash register and his pocket. The victim said while the first suspect was doing this, the second subject took cigarettes. The subjects fled the gas station in an 80's to early 90's Chevrolet S15 Blazer. The victim could not provide a description of the subjects—other than to say they covered their heads with hoods, and that the first subject had a mustache.

## Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Tuesday, 12-11-18, at 11:40 a.m., a resident on the 1000 block of **Wildwood Avenue** said she heard noises in the living room upstairs and went up to check on it. The victim/resident said she initially looked out the window and saw a gray vehicle backed up in her driveway and thought it was unusual. The victim said when she got onto the second floor, she saw a suspect begin to enter a room. The suspect saw her and uttered an expletive and ran out the front door. The victim told another resident in the house to call 911. The victim described the suspect as a black male, approximately 6'3", thin build wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt covering his face and dark sweatpants. The victim said the suspect fled in the vehicle that was in the driveway. The method of entry was via a pry to the front door. The investigation is continuing in this case.

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

On Thursday, 12-13-18 at 3:45 p.m., two unknown suspects entered the **Nordstrom Rack** store and one of the suspects cut the security cables on a high value purse and left the store. The second suspect attempted to cut the cable on another purse but was unsuccessful. The loss prevention officer described the first suspect as a black female in her 20's, 5'3", skinny build wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black sweat pants. She described the second suspect as a black female in her 20's, approximately 5'1", heavy build, wearing a blue jacket and camouflage colored sweatpants.

On Saturday, 12-15-18 at approximately 9:03 p.m., four unknown suspects carrying large bags entered the **H&M store** at **Serramonte Shopping Center** and took approximately \$1,000 worth of clothing and fled the store. The store manager described the suspects as one black male and three black females wearing various clothing. The investigation is continuing.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There were seven vehicle burglaries during the past week

- Parking Garage at 2051 **Junipero Serra Boulevard** (2<sup>nd</sup> floor)—a Fastrak, \$5 and sunglasses were taken from a 2012 Infiniti FX35. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-10-18 between 10:15 a.m. and 5:08 p.m.
- Parking lot of **Via Mare** restaurant on **Mission Street**—a backpack containing an iPad and an iPhone was taken from the rear passenger seat of a 2018 Ford Explorer. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-11-18 between 2:09 p.m. and 2:14 p.m.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot near **JC Penney's**—an iPad and toys were taken from a 2006 Toyota Sienna. The victim said her key fob was taken whilst she was shopping in the mall. Occurred on 12-11-18 between 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 pm.
- 100 block of **Main Street**—unknown what was taken from a 2013 Honda Fit. The front passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-16-18 at an unknown time.
- 100 block of **Main Street**—a jacket, GPS unit, binoculars, cell phone holder and \$26 was taken from a 2007 Honda Ridgeline. The right rear window and right front window was smashed. Occurred between 3:30 p.m. on 12-15-18 and 8:48 a.m. on 12-16-18.
- 100 block of **Del Prado Drive**—a jacket was taken from a 2013 BMW 328i. The right rear window and right front window was smashed. Occurred between 3:00 p.m. on 12-15-18 and 9:20 a.m. on 12-17-18.
- Unit block of **Muirwood Drive**—shoes and an umbrella were taken from a 2010 Toyota Prius. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-16-18 between 9:20 a.m. and 11:20 a.m.
