



Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Monday, 04-15-19 at 8:17 p.m., officers were dispatched to the **Alliance** gas station on **South Mayfair Avenue** on a report of a subject with a knife. This occurred during an argument over a stolen bicycle from in front of **Jamba Juice** at **Westlake Shopping Center**. The 14-year old bicycle owner said he locked his bike outside Jamba Juice at 5:15 p.m. and saw subject with bolt cutters by his bicycle. The victim told the subject he owned the bicycle. The victim said when he left the store, he noticed his bicycle was gone, and the cable lock was on the ground. The victim and his two 21-year old friends found the subject at the gas station, and they said the subject pulled out a knife and threatened them. The subject, a 24-year old Pacifica resident, was arrested for assault with a deadly weapon, possession of methamphetamine and petty theft.

On Tuesday, 04-16-19 at 1:49 p.m., a 20-year old transient subject was arrested for trespassing and petty theft. This occurred outside the **Panda Express** restaurant at **Westlake Shopping Center**.

On Thursday, 04-18-19 at 1:39 p.m., Officer Covarrubias was dispatched to the front lobby of the police station on a report of a subject who was rambling and possibly under the influence of a controlled substance. The subject told the officer that he was being probed by an unknown government who wanted to place a device in his brain. The subject was sweating profusely and flailing his arms as he expressed his concerns. The officer asked the subject if he was under the influence, and the subject admitted to smoking Fentanyl earlier in the morning. The subject, a 32-year old San Francisco resident, was transported to Seton Hospital for a medical evaluation. A complaint will be forwarded to the District Attorney’s Office.

On Friday, 04-19-19 at 8:56 p.m., Officer Greene was dispatched to a report of a kidnapping that occurred on the 200 block of **Cerro Drive**. The 16-year old reporting party said she and her friend were walking in front of their apartment building when a male grabbed her arm and pulled her,

repeatedly telling her to “come here”. The victim’s friend believed the subject was trying to take her away and punched the suspect four or five times in the face. The victim immediately ran into her apartment building. Officers found the suspect, a 44-year old Daly City resident, in the area and subsequently booked him in jail for kidnapping. The victim was physically unharmed.

On Saturday, 04-20-19 at 1:02 a.m., Officer Cain and Officer Todaro were dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Pueblo Street** on a report of a woman banging on a resident’s door for an hour. The homeowner said he did not know the woman. The woman was intoxicated and told officers she was renting an “Airbnb” at this address. Officers arrested the 24-year year old from Soledad for public intoxication and resisting arrest.

On Sunday, 04-21-19 at 1:03 a.m., a 41-year old Brisbane resident was arrested for public intoxication after he was found wandering in the middle of the intersection of **Geneva Avenue** and **Bayshore Boulevard**.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 04-18-19 at 10:30 p.m., a 42-year old Richmond resident said she had taken the 14 MUNI bus to the area of **Mission Street** and **John Daly Boulevard** and was walking down **John Daly Boulevard** while talking on her cell phone. The victim said two males approached her from behind, and one punched her in the face and grabbed her iPhone X out of her hand. The victim said the suspects then ran up **John Daly Boulevard** towards **Mission Street**. The victim waited a day before reporting the incident. The victim sustained minor injuries and refused medical assistance.

On Wednesday, 04-17-19 at 4:57 p.m., two 22-year old **Target** Security officers were the victims of a robbery and brandishing of a box cutter by a shoplifting suspect they had tried to detain. The victims provided a description of the female shoplifter who got into a vehicle and attempted to flee the parking lot. Fortunately, officers were nearby and stopped the vehicle with the female suspect, and the victims positively identified the suspect. The suspect, a 42-year old San Francisco resident, was arrested for robbery and brandishing.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Thursday, 04-19-19 between midnight and 5:00 a.m., an unknown suspect pried open a mail door slot, reached in and opened the garage door to a residence on the unit block of **Alexander Avenue** and stole three bikes worth \$9,500.

Commercial Burglaries

There were no commercial burglaries during the past week.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were five vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 200 block of **Park Plaza Drive**—nothing was taken from a 2007 Dodge Journey. The right rear and lift gate windows were smashed. Occurred on 04-15-19 between 7:20 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.

- 400 block of **Bonnie Street**—a purse containing clothing was taken from a 2016 Honda Civic. The right rear window was smashed. Occurred on 04-16-19 between 12:30 a.m. and 1:30 a.m.
- **In N Out Restaurant** parking lot on **Gellert Boulevard**—a backpack containing three Tag Heuer watches, Oakley sunglasses and Bose headphones and another backpack containing a “ThinkPad”, headphones and credit cards were taken from a 2019 Range Rover. - Unit block of **Park Plaza Drive**—two cases of cigarettes were taken from a 2017 Honda Pilot. The rear window was smashed. Occurred on 04-18-19 between 2:15 p.m. and 2:30 p.m.
- 200 block of **San Pedro Road**—a vehicle key was taken from a 2007 BMW 328i. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 04-21-19 between 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m.
