



## Crime Alert and Community Update Bulletin

When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Crime still seems to be slowing down due to the state-wide Stay at Home Order, but there are, nevertheless, some notable crimes.

### Notable Cases

On Monday, 04-06-20 at approximately 11:37 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the 400 block of **Verducci Drive** on a report of a female who ran her vehicle into the corner of the reporting party's residence. The reporting party/victim also reported the female had intentionally tried to run him over with her vehicle. The 32-year old reporting party said the residence is a hostel and he is currently the live-in manager of the site. The reporting party said the suspect has rented a bed on two occasions but has never stayed the night as she was asked to leave both times. The victim said on this occasion, he came home to find the suspect in the residence, and he told her that she needed to leave. The victim said the suspect gathered her belongings and exited the residence and walked towards her car that was in the driveway. The victim said he was standing in the driveway when the victim quickly pulled out and put the vehicle into reverse and intentionally tried to strike him. The officers were able to find the 35-year old transient suspect at a hotel in South San Francisco and subsequently arrested her for assault with a deadly weapon, vandalism, and bringing a controlled substance into jail.

On Thursday, 04-09-20 at approximately 12:40 p.m., a 19-year old Daly City resident and a 15-year old Pacifica resident were the victims of an assault with a deadly weapon (brass knuckles) by unknown suspects. This occurred in the area of **Mission Street** and **San Jose Avenue**. The victims sustained minor injuries but refused transportation to the hospital. The victims described the suspects as approximately 6-7 Hispanic males and females, about 16-17 years old, wearing masks and driving a brown or gold van last seen driving northbound on **Mission Street**.

On Thursday, 04-09-20 at 10:57 p.m., **Officer Moody** was dispatched to the car wash on **Sullivan Avenue** on a report of a possible trash fire. When **Officer Moody** arrived, he discovered it was not a

trash fire, but, in fact, a mattress that had been on fire. The mattress was already extinguished by an unknown person. A witness nearby saw a blue pickup truck exit highway 280 with an item that was lit on fire in the rear of the truck bed. The witness said the driver of the pickup pulled into one of the car washing stations and pulled the lit item out of the truck and drove away northbound on **Sullivan Avenue**.

On Thursday, 04-09-20 at approximately 8:05 p.m., **Officer Martin** was dispatched to the **Maynila Restaurant** on **Mission Street** on a report of a brandishing. The 50-year old owner said he was standing in front of his restaurant smoking a cigarette when a male subject he had never seen before and said, "Why are you imitating an American when you are Latino?" The victim said he was from Guatemala, and he said the suspect said he didn't care where he was from. The victim said the suspect then pulled out a knife with a 4" blade from his jacket pocket and dangled it back and forth. The victim feared he was going to be stabbed so he went back into the restaurant and called the police. The suspect ran away and was not located. The victim described the suspect as a Hispanic male, approximately 17-18 years old, 5'2, 160 lbs., wearing a white hat with "LA" in blue lettering, a green bomber-style jacket and white or blue jeans.

On Saturday, 04-11-20 at approximately 2:50 p.m., **Officer Perez** and **Officer Haas** were dispatched to the **Walgreen's** store on **Mission Street** on a report of a possible assault. They arrived to find the victim lying on his back in front of the pharmacy department. The 48-year old victim said he was standing in line picking up a prescription when an unknown man who appeared to be agitated and angry was behind him. The victim said the suspect said, "Why are you looking at me?", and the victim told him he didn't know him and asked what his problem was. The victim said the suspect then said, "If you're going to do something, do something." The victim said then the subject hit his head with his fist approximately four times, causing him to fall to the floor. The victim said the suspect left the store. The victim described the suspect as an unknown black or mixed-race male adult, approximately 6', average build, wearing a baseball cap, purple jacket and had a black painter's mask with two filters. The victim was checked out by fire department personnel.

## Residential Burglaries

## Commercial Burglaries

There were two commercial burglaries during the past week.

Between Tuesday 04-07-20 at 6:30 p.m. and Wednesday, 04-08-20 at 8:30 a.m., an unknown suspect burglarized a storage shed to the rear of **St. Francis Veterinary Hospital**.

Between Wednesday, 04-08-20 at 1:26 a.m. and Thursday, 04-09-20 at 1:00 p.m., an unknown suspect possibly used a key to burglarize a hair salon on the 400 block of **Gellert Boulevard**. The suspect took a cash register containing cash.

## Vehicle Burglaries

There four vehicle burglaries during the past week.

- 600 block of **Orange Street**—nothing was taken from a 2003 Acura Rex. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred between 7:30 p.m. on 04-06-20 and 6:30 a.m. on 04-07-20. \*\*On-line report.
- Unit block of **Clifton Drive**—a used N95 mask was taken from a 2010 Honda Civic. The passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 04-08-20 at approximately 8:30 a.m. \*\*On-line report.
- 300 block of **Northgate Avenue**—a charging cable and sunglasses were taken from a 2018 Audi Q5. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 04-08-20 between 8:45 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. \*\*On-line report.
- 6500 block of **Mission Street**—nothing was taken from a 1993 Ford. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 04-12-20 between 1:03 p.m. and 1:33 p.m.
