When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Tuesday, 04-14-20 at 7:37 p.m., subsequent to a traffic stop by **Officer Herrera** near the intersection of **Callan Boulevard** and **Serramonte Boulevard**., a 45-year old Daly City resident was cited for possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and possession of drug paraphernalia. In addition, the subject was also in possession of multiple checks, bank cards and a driver's license that did not belong to her.

On Wednesday, 04-15-20 at approximately 9:15 a.m., a 42-year old Daly City resident was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol after he collided into a parked vehicle on the unit block of **Westmont Drive**. The subject was also arrested for an outstanding warrant for being drunk in public.

On Wednesday, 04-15-20 at 10:30 a.m., **Officer Tualaulelei** was dispatched to a report of a civil standby in the area of **Schwerin Street** and **Velasco Avenue**. The reporting party said she wanted to retrieve her belongings from a vehicle. The reporting party said earlier in the day, she was inside the van where she had been staying for about three weeks and stays with her friend because she is homeless. The 29-year old reporting party said her friend had stayed in a motel the night before and left the van messy. The reporting party said her friend came back and “out of nowhere” kicked her out. The reporting party told the officers that there was a gun inside the vehicle. The officer knocked on the vehicle and asked for the subject to open the door. The subject told the officer he wasn't kicking her out, but that he just wanted her to get a job because he was tired of her asking for things and he did not want to pay for them. The officer asked the 43-year old subject if it was okay for the reporting party to grab her belongings, and the subject consented. The officer asked the subject if he had a gun inside the vehicle, and the subject said no. Eventually the subject admitted to having a firearm (9mm pistol). The officer issued the subject a citation for possession of a concealed firearm and possession of an unregistered firearm.

On Wednesday, 04-15-20 at approximately 3:58 p.m., **Officer Arguelles** was dispatched to the **Peninsula del Rey** complex on a report of a homeless male subject sleeping inside the parking garage. Officer Arguelles subsequently cited the 26-year old transient subject for possession of a controlled substance (cocaine).

On Thursday, 04-16-20 at approximately 6:21 p.m., **Officer Leyson** was dispatched to the community garden at 699 **Serramonte Boulevard** on a report of a theft. The dispatchers advised the suspects brandished pepper spray and a knife and were attempting to take a rooster from the garden where the reporting party was working. The dispatcher advised three males left in a black Ford F-150. Officer Leyson saw the vehicle on the 900 block of **Campus Drive** and talked to the occupants of the vehicle. One of the subjects said he, his brother and his father went to the community garden to retrieve a rooster that the father left in the garden. When they entered the garden, they were met by two subjects who told them they couldn't have the rooster. The subject went on to say that the two subjects had picked up nun-chucks and a bat to prevent them from taking the rooster, and his father pulled out pepper spray. The subject said the altercation escalated and de-escalated quickly, and the subjects were able to retrieve the rooster.

On Friday, 04-17-20, at approximately 5:36 p.m., **Officer Serbin** was dispatched to the **Target** store on a report of a robbery that occurred 20 minutes prior. The Loss Prevention Officer said he contacted two subjects for shoplifting, and one suspect lifted his jacket and displayed what he believed to be a black revolver. The 23-year old Loss Prevention Officer said he stepped back, and the two suspects ran out of the store with the cart, through the fire doors, and into a dark 4 door Acura. The loss was over \$1,000 worth of Lego brand toys.

On Saturday, 04-18-20 at 11:42 p.m., **Officer Gill** was dispatched to the area of **Linda Vista Drive** and **Jacqueline Court** on the report of a possible vehicle collision. The reporting party heard tires screeching and a loud crash outside of his house. When the reporting party looked outside his window, he noticed a damaged vehicle on the sidewalk and a man getting out of the vehicle who appeared to be leaving the scene. **Officer Todaro** arrived to assist, and they subsequently arrested the driver, a 23-year old Daly City resident, for driving under the influence.

Robberies

There was one robbery during the past week.

On Friday, 04-17-20 at approximately 5:26 p.m., a Loss Prevention Officer for **Target** was the victim of a robbery after he confronted two subjects for shoplifting, and one of the subjects lifted his jacket to reveal a black revolver. See "Notable Reports" for more information.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Sunday, 04-19-20, at approximately 10:44 p.m., an unknown suspect took a garage door remote from a vehicle parked in the driveway of a residence on the 1000 block of **Brunswick Street** and used the remote to open the garage door. The resident in the home heard the door open and went to the garage to investigate. The resident saw a subject described as a white male, mid-20's, approximately 6' tall, wearing a gray beanie, black jacket and blue pants standing in her garage. Once the suspect realized the victim was in the garage, he exited and round westbound on Brunswick Street. This investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

Community Events/Information

San Mateo County Mandatory Face Coverings Order:

San Mateo County Health Officer Dr. Scott Morrow has issued a new order requiring members of the public and workers at essential businesses to wear face coverings outside the home in places such as grocery stores, pharmacies, medical facilities, public transit systems and rideshares. The order took effect at 11:59 p.m. on April 17, 2020 but will not be enforced until today at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, April 22, 2020. It will remain in effect until it is amended or superseded by the health officer.

According to the order, coverings can be factory-made or made from ordinary household materials (scarves, bandanas, tee shirts, etc.) Make sure you completely cover your mouth and nose. You are not required to wear a face covering while driving alone or with members of the same family or household in a vehicle not used commercially. Children under the age of 2 must not wear a face covering, and children under 12 do not need to wear face coverings. People are still allowed to walk, run or ride a bicycle without a face cover, keeping the 6 feet social distancing rule in mind. We recommend you to keep a face cover on hand in case the distancing rule is not possible.
