

**NOTICE INVITING BIDS FOR  
CENTRAL CORRIDOR BICYCLE AND  
PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

**IN AND FOR THE CITY OF DALY CITY, SAN MATEO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA**

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Sealed proposals, submitted only upon the bid proposal forms furnished by the City will be received by the City of Daly City at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 333 - 90th Street, Daly City, California 94015 at **2:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 20, 2020**. A virtual bid opening meeting will follow, scheduled at 2:30 p.m., during which time bids will be publicly opened and read.

The bid opening protocols during the “shelter in place” include the following instructions:

**Step A: Bid Drop-Off Time: 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM**

- Bid proposals will be accepted Tuesday, October 20, 2020 between 8:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m.
- Bidder attendees are restricted to a maximum of two representatives and shall be required to wear personal protective equipment including, but not limited to, gloves and masks. Furthermore, all parties must maintain social distancing requirements pursuant to the City of Daly City and the San Mateo County guidelines.
- Bidders shall drop off sealed bids at the designated box located outside of the City Clerk’s Office at City Hall between the hours of 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM. Bidders may enter City Hall from the first floor and take the elevators to the second floor.
- City representatives will accept sealed bid documents at the drop-off location, between 8:00 AM and 2:00 PM to time-stamp, collect, and ascertain that all submittals have been delivered timely for bid opening.

**Step B: Virtual Bid Opening Meeting at 2:30 PM on October 20, 2020**

- The optional virtual bid opening meeting will follow, scheduled at 2:30 PM, during which time bids will be publicly opened and read to determine the “apparent low bidder”.

The work includes curb and gutter construction, pavement repairs, thermoplastic traffic striping and pavement marking installation, new sidewalk installation, storm drain system upgrades, utility box adjustments to new grade, bridge deck modifications, and traffic signal upgrades. This project is federally funded, making the Buy America provisions applicable.

Bids shall be accompanied by a bid bond, cash, certified or cashier's check payable to City of Daly City, in an amount not less than 10% of the aggregate bid.

A valid Class A license or other combination of any Class C licenses that constitutes a majority of the contract work must be in the possession of the successful bidder at the time the bid is submitted.

The time limit for the completion of work is **ninety-five (95) working days for the base bid awarded and an additional five (5) working days for all alternate bids awarded.** The first day of this time period will be no later than the 28<sup>th</sup> calendar day after the contract award.

The project has a goal of 10% **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation.** If the DBE Commitment form (Section 00496 of these Contract Documents) is not submitted with the bid, apparent low bidder, the 2<sup>nd</sup> low bidder, and the 3<sup>rd</sup> low bidder shall complete and submit the DBE Commitment form to the City. **The DBE Commitment form shall be received by the City no later than 4:00 p.m. on the 4<sup>th</sup> business day after bid opening.** Other bidders do not need to submit the DBE Commitment form unless the City requests it. If the City requests the bidder to submit a DBE Commitment form, submit the completed form within four (4) business days of the request.

If you have not met the DBE goal, complete and submit the DBE Information – Good Faith Efforts form (Section 00497 of these Contract Documents) with the bid showing that you made adequate good faith efforts to meet the goal. Only good faith efforts directed towards obtaining participation by DBEs will be considered. **If good faith efforts documentation is not submitted with the bid, it must be received by the City no later than 4:00 p.m. on the 4<sup>th</sup> business day after bid opening.**

The project is federally funded and is subjected to the current federal prevailing wage rates as well as the other federal requirements contained in the special provision, proposal and documents. Copies of applicable prevailing hourly rates of per diem wages are available on request to the City Engineer.

In accordance with the California Labor Code, general prevailing hourly rates of per diem wages shall be paid on this project. Copies of applicable prevailing hourly rates of per diem wages are available on request to the City Engineer.

Due to the passage of Senate Bill 854, several additions and revisions were made to the California Labor Code. The addition of Labor Code 1725.5 requires all contractors and subcontractors to register with the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) to be eligible to work on public works projects. At the time the bid is submitted the Contractor and all subcontractors must be registered with the DIR in accordance with the California Labor Code to be eligible for the project. The project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR. More information about DIR registration can be viewed on the DIR's website:

California Labor Code Section 1771.1. (a) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded.

Pursuant to the California Public Contract Code, securities may be substituted for money withheld to insure contract performance.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informality in such bids and, if awarded, to award the contract in the best interest of the City.
