When I mention “the unit block” of a street, this means the incident occurred at an address anywhere between 1 and 99 of the street.

Notable Cases

On Wednesday, 12-13-17 at 6:22 p.m., Officer Clinkscales and Officer Murillo were on patrol in the **Serramonte Shopping Center** parking lot and saw a vehicle parked in a disabled parking stall without a placard. They spoke with a subject in the passenger seat and asked the subject if it was his vehicle, and the subject said it belonged to him and his girlfriend. When asked why he was parked in the disabled stall, the subject said, “Because my girlfriend just had to run in really quick.” The subject, a 30-year old San Francisco resident, was on probation in San Mateo County for forgery and identity theft. The subject gave the officers consent to search the vehicle, and the officers found a bottle of Promethazine with Codeine. The prescription information was ripped off the bottle. The subject was cited for being in possession of a controlled substance. (Codeine)

On Saturday, 12-16-17 at 5:51 a.m., officers were dispatched to the Enterprise Car Rental lot on **Geneva Avenue** on a report of an auto theft. The reporting party said three subjects entered the parking lot and stole three vehicles but were unsuccessful in exiting the parking lot with the vehicles. The suspects abandoned the vehicles and ran on foot from the parking lot towards Rio Verde Street. The investigation is continuing.

On Thursday, 12-14-17 at 2:20 p.m., a 38-year old Daly City resident was placed under arrest for felony vandalism and violation of a restraining order after he was seen throwing a rock at a vehicle and kicking the same vehicle. This occurred on the 200 block of **Hampshire Court**. The subject is restrained from the area.

Robberies

There were two robberies during the past week.

On Thursday, 12-14-17 at 7:00 p.m., a 29-year old Daly City resident said she arrived home after shopping and drove into her apartment complex parking lot at 381 **Half Moon Lane**. She said she noticed a male subject in the lot who appeared to be watching her. She said as she exited her vehicle, she continued to look back at the subject. The victim said she opened her rear driver's side door and began removing her items. She said she saw the subject walk closer to her, and the subject grabbed her arm that she used to carry her purse and cell phone. When the subject tried to pull the victim's cell phone away, it fell to the ground and broke. They struggled for the phone, and the subject grabbed two Louis Vuitton bags from the backseat and attempted to flee from the garage. The victim said she grabbed the subject's arm, and the subject pulled away, causing one bag to rip and fall to the ground. The victim attempted to grab the suspect again, and he pushed her away, causing her to fall and cut the palm of her hand and her knee. The suspect was able to run away with two of her purses, and he climbed over a wall to escape. The victim described the suspect as a black male, approximately 5'8-5'9, slim build, wearing a green jacket with a furry hood over his head, khaki pants and khaki Timberland boots. This investigation is continuing.

On Sunday, 12-17-17 at 1:10 a.m., a 37-year old Daly City resident was the victim of a robbery and assault with a deadly weapon via knife by three unknown suspects. This occurred at the corner of **Brunswick Street** and **Crocker Street**. The victim said he was walking southbound on Brunswick Street, and as he approached the corner, an unknown male attacked him from behind by punching him numerous times in the head and back with a closed fist. The victim said the male didn't say anything, but as he was being punched, a second male ran in front of him and grabbed his jacket. The victim said the second suspect began waving an object, possibly a knife, in the air and sliced a hole in his jacket. He said that subject reached into his jacket and took his wallet which contained a blank check and other miscellaneous items. The victim was also cut by the knife when the suspect was waving it. The victim said the suspects then ran towards a white Toyota Camry that was stopped at the intersection. The victim described the first suspect as a black male adult, approximately 6'0, with long curly hair, wearing a black Jordan sweatshirt and blue jeans. He described the second subject as a Filipino male, approximately 30 years old with a mustache. The victim sustained two small superficial lacerations on his right hand and a small superficial laceration on his abdomen. This investigation is continuing.

Residential Burglaries

There was one residential burglary during the past week.

On Friday, 12-15-17 at approximately 7:09 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence on the unit block of **Frankfort Street** on a report of an interrupted residential burglary. The victim said he was in his bedroom when he heard a noise from his back patio to the lower level of the house. He went to see if there was anything at the back patio area when he heard a loud thumping. The 54-year old victim shouted for the suspects to get out of the area, picked up a nearby baseball bat and then heard footsteps running back down the stairs. The victim said the subjects appeared to be scared and did not try to confront him. The victim said one subject said, "I'm only 17". The victim said he hit one subject in the leg with the bat, but the subject still managed to jump over the fence. The victim described one subject as a dark skinned black male in his 20's, 5'10, 200 pounds, with a stocky build, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black pants. He described the second suspect as a light skinned black male, possibly 17 years old, 5'8", 150 pounds with a thin build. There was no loss of property, and this investigation is continuing.

Commercial Burglaries

There was one commercial burglary during the past week.

On Sunday, 12-17-17 at approximately 5:25 p.m., an unknown suspect broke into a locker in the men's locker room of the **Planet Fitness** facility and took a victim's wallet. The suspects then made several fraudulent purchases with the victim's credit cards. This investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Burglaries

There were two vehicle burglaries and one attempted vehicle burglary during the past week.

- **Burlington** parking lot—three bags containing clothing were taken from the interior of a 2003 Mitsubishi Montero. The left rear window was smashed. Occurred on 12-12-17 between 4:00 p.m. and 4:15 p.m. **On-line report made.
- **Serramonte Shopping Center Parking Garage**—a bag containing identification was taken from a 2016 Lexus RX350. The method of entry is unknown. Occurred on 12-14-17 between 11:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. **On-line report made.
- 400 block of **Oak Court**—an attempted burglary only to a 2008 GMC Savana. The rear passenger window was smashed. Occurred on 12-16-17 at midnight.

Stolen Vehicles

There were seven vehicles stolen and three attempted stolen vehicles during the past week. Three were recovered.

- 400 block of **87th Street**—a 2008 Toyota Highlander. Occurred between 10:00 a.m. on 12-14-17 and 8:00 a.m. on 12-16-17.
- 200 block of **Westlake Avenue**—a 1998 Honda Civic. Occurred between 6:00 p.m. on 12-15-17 and 2:00 a.m. on 12-16-17.
- **East Market Street/3rd Avenue**—a 2001 Lincoln Navigator. Occurred between 6:00 p.m. on 12-16-17 and 11:00 a.m. on 12-17-17.
- **Citrus Avenue/San Diego Avenue**—a 1994 Honda Accord. Occurred between 5:00 p.m. on 12-17-17 and 8:40 a.m. on 12-18-17.
- **Enterprise Rent-a-Car** parking lot—an attempted only to a 2017 Hyundai Santa Fe. Occurred on 12-16-17 at 5:51 a.m.
- **Enterprise Rent-a-Car** parking lot—an attempted only to a 2016 Buick Enclave. Occurred on 12-16-17 at 5:51 a.m.
- **Enterprise Rent-a-Car** parking lot—an attempted only to a 2017 Ford Mustang. Occurred on 12-16-17 at 5:51 a.m.
