

2018 LPGA MEDIHEAL Championship Tees Up at Lake Merced Golf Club

144 OF THE WORLD'S BEST FEMALE GOLFERS GATHER IN DALY CITY APRIL 23-29



This month, the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) is partnering with MEDIHEAL, a Korean based cosmetics company, to host the LPGA MEDIHEAL Championship at Lake Merced

Golf Club. From April 23-29, 144 of the world's best female golfers will compete in a four-day, stroke-play event for a \$1.5 million purse.

"We are excited to be hosting our championship, in partnership with the LPGA Tour, in the Bay Area," said Oh-sub Kwon, Chairman and CEO of MEDIHEAL. "In recent years, we have made major investments into women's golf and will look to build upon that here at the beautiful Lake Merced Golf Club."

Built in 1922 on what was once coastal sand dunes, the golf course at Lake Merced Golf Club has undergone renovations by Dr. Alister MacKenzie, architect of Augusta National, and Rees Jones, the "U.S. Open Doctor". The Club has played host to numerous championship events, including U.S. Open Qualifiers, an NCAA West Regional Championship, U.S. Boys' and Girls' Junior Championships, and, most recently, LPGA Tour events.

"We are delighted that the best women golfers in the world will return to Lake Merced Golf Club and the Bay Area for the 2018 LPGA MEDIHEAL Championship" said Jeff Pero, President of Lake Merced Golf Club. "We are excited by our new partnership with MEDIHEAL and the LPGA and look forward to working with them in the years ahead."

Three Scams to Avoid During Tax Season

Tax season has arrived and, unfortunately, so have new scams that target taxpayers and tax preparers. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) is warning taxpayers and tax professionals about three scams that have gained momentum this year.

The first is a quickly growing scam that involves erroneous tax refunds being deposited into taxpayers' bank accounts. After stealing client data from tax professionals and filing fraudulent tax returns, criminals have been using the taxpayers' real bank accounts in an attempt to claim the refund. The IRS has discovered an increasing number of potential taxpayer victims and urges taxpayers to follow established procedures for returning an erroneous refund to the agency, including contacting their tax preparers immediately.



Another common scam in 2018 has emerged by phone: callers claim to be IRS employees, using fake names and IRS identification badge numbers, and tell victims that the money they "owe" to the IRS must be paid immediately through a gift card or wire transfer. Some thieves have used video relay services to scam individuals who are deaf and hard-of-hearing. As the IRS generally mails bills as a first step, taxpayers should be careful when they encounter unexpected requests and should never provide private information over the phone.

The third growing scam targets tax professionals and the taxpayer data they have collected. It is more difficult to identify and halt fraudulent tax returns when they include real client data. As such, recent scams targeting the tax professional community range from filing schemes to phishing scams that mimic tax software providers. The IRS urges tax professionals to step up their security and report any data thefts.

The IRS Criminal Investigation division is in the process of investigating the scope and breadth of each scam. When filing your taxes this year or paying unexpected tax bills, be sure to not only safeguard your data but also double-check any deposits or refunds you may receive.

Development of Daly City Parks and Open Space Master Plan Underway



This February, the Daly City City Council approved a contract with Gates + Associates, a landscape architecture and land planning firm, to develop the City's Parks and Open Space Master Plan. The purpose of the Master Plan is to optimize the City's existing parks and recreation resources and strategically plan for future expenditures on these assets.

The City owns and maintains 31 City Parks, including tot lots and open space. Many of the structures at these parks are in poor condition and in need of either replacement or updating. The master planning process is designed to ensure the legacy of parks and open spaces will continue to provide the community with attractive and enjoyable parks, open spaces and recreation facilities for decades to come.

During the master planning process, Gates + Associates will assess the community's current assets and needs by auditing each site, hosting in-person meetings and publishing an online survey for residents to share their thoughts and desires for the future of our parks and open spaces.
